

Trinity's Children's Ministries is partnering with Bethlehem Lutheran Church in St. Paul to help support and care for refugee families from Burma. Bethlehem's Pastor Joy Johnson has provided the names of Burmese families who have arrived in America during the past three-four months with only the clothes on their back. Prior to their arrival, they have lived in refugee camps for up to 20 years, due to religious persecution for their Christian faith. 
Junior High Ski Trip

I loved the bonding that happened on those bus rides - quiet conversations about boyfriends with best friends, getting to know someone that I didn't yet know very well, processing a bad game, laughing and celebrating a good game or performance, listening to a friend's grief her first day back after her father passed away.....

Two experiences this fall have again reminded me how travel to and from places can become wonderful

so, os sud adino environments for people to get to

know one another better and grow in community. The first occasion found me in a large pick-up truck with four Congregational Council members. We were headed to Eagan for a service project at Feed My Starving Children. The second occasion was in the church van with seven co-workers all headed to work at Global Health Ministries.

Both times I was blessed - the kind of blessing that made me feel warm all over and reminded me that I belonged. The kind of blessing that opens my



mind and heart to listen and learn about others and realize what a gift they have given me by sharing a piece of themselves. The kind of blessing that is contagious and begs for more opportunities to get to know these special people more and more. The kind of blessing that causes me to praise and thank God for life, rich community, and synergy in purpose and call!

What's my point you ask? Well, are you already super busy and can't figure out how to fit it all in? Try multi-tasking! Challenge your small group to hop in a vehicle and do your check-in and sharing while you drive to a group service project. Or perhaps you are having trouble finding time to shop for Christmas? How about suggesting your small group save gas and all hop in one vehicle for your December meeting - head to the MOA, have check-in and sharing on the way, and pray you have room for all the gifts on the return trip.

I have an 8:30 a.m. appointment to donate blood at the Red Cross in Shoreview on January 2 and room in my vehicle for five to six more people. Anyone want to ride along? We could become a new small group that meets this way every 56 days!


