I certainly don't know, but I think it has something to do with a relaxed environment, a more full sense of community, and the opportunity to simply stay and visit with so many friends and new acquaintances. It makes me wonder what we can do at our main facility to create an environment which has the same effect inside – we are hard at work trying to figure this out. ## PROJECTS UPDATE

Just a couple of notes. First, we have closed on the Drive-In property – yea! We have also completed the re-financing that was outlined at the Annual Meeting – a huge thank you to our Treasurer, KC Kidder, and our administrator, Bob Eiselt, for their hard work. We continue to work with the US Postal Service, the City of Stillwater and our partner HAF Architects, to finalize the design and the lease for the Third Street building that would eventually house the new USPS facility. The city of Stillwater hosted a representative from the USPS as he made public announcement of their desire to move, and a 30-day public discussion period is almost over. We are working with the Stillwater Heritage Preservation Commission to get final approval of the design of the building. Still much to do, but we are moving forward.

Public discussion of a possible Capital Appeal timeline and more updates on the work of HGA architects and Trinity's design team are coming soon.

Many balls are in the air – this fall will be full of information and discussion.

## GIVING

I keep in touch with leaders of other St. Paul area churches of our size, and our peer group of churches is experiencing the economy the same way Trinity is. Giving is slightly ahead of last year, but not quite up to what we had planned for. We are trimming our expenses and carefully managing this year's budget so that we end the year in a strong position. Thank you to all who are giving generously, regularly and according to your pledge. We also know that a few of our families cannot do what they normally do in support of our ministries – we absolutely understand. In fact, we have been trying to provide as many ministry resources as we can to those who have suffered job loss.

The real message is that those of us who can give, keep on doing so, perhaps even increasing our giving when possible. Those who are able to do less than they wish to do take this season to step back a little out of necessity. Those of us who manage our ministry will trim around the edges to manage our resources.
