TODAY'S GAME

The United States and the Czech Republic enter today's quarterfinal matchup at Ufa Arena coming off wins on Dec. 31. The U.S. beat Slovakia, 9-3, while the Czech Republic defeated Switzerland, 4-3 in overtime. Today's winner will face Canada in the semifinals Thursday (Jan. 3).

The Czech Republic finished second in Group A. After a tournament-opening loss to Sweden (4-1), the Czechs won three in a row against Finland (3-1), Latvia (4-2) and Switzerland (4-3 OT).

TEAM USA IN THE PLAYOFFS

- The U.S. National Junior Team has qualified for the playoff round of the International Ice Hockey Federation World Junior Championship in 13 out of the last 14 tournaments.
- The U.S. has won five of its last six quarterfinal games and is 6-5 all-time in the round.
- Team USA is 3-7 in semifinals, 2-5 in bronze medal games and 2-1 in gold medal games.

THE SERIES VS. CZECH REPUBLIC

- The U.S. leads the all-time series vs. the Czech Republic, 8-1-1-7-1 (W-OTW-OTL-L-T).
- The U.S. is 2-1 vs. the Czechs in quarterfinals. In all quarterfinal, semifinal and medal games, Team USA is 3-3.

WINTER TOURNAMENT UPDATE

• At the 2013 IIHF U18 Women's World Championship in Heinola & Vierumäki, Finland, the U.S. Women's National Under-18 Team is through to the semifinals. Collectively, Team USA out-scored Russia, the Czech Republic and Sweden 25-0 in the preliminary round.

• At the 2013 World Under-17 Challenge in Drummondville and Victoriaville, Quebec, the U.S. National Under-17 Team is 2-1-0-0 and leads its group. Team USA beat Canada Quebec 5-1 on Dec. 31 and wraps up preliminary round play vs. Slovakia on Jan. 2.

LAST GAME: Dec. 31 • USA 9, SVK 3

Tied 1-1 five minutes into the game, Team USA scored four straight goals to seize control of the game. **John Gaudreau** and **Vince Trocheck** each had two goals and an assist to lead all scorers. Seventeen players recorded a point. The U.S. went four-for-nine on the power play and denied seven-of-eight Slovakian man-advantages. **John Gibson** had 26 saves.

TOURNAMENT LEADERS

Alex Galchenyuk's seven points (2-5) are tied for second-best on the 2013 IIHF World Junior Championship points list. His five assists are tied for second-best in the tournament. He has a point in all four games.

Jacob Trouba is tied for first in tournament scoring with four goals. His four points (4-0) are tied for first among all defensemen.

John Gibson ranks third among his peers with a .936 save percentage. His 1.93 goals against average stands second in the tournament.

As a team, the U.S. leads the tournament in penalty killing success at .882 (15-for-17).

LEANING LEFT LOOKS RIGHT

Team USA's all-lefty line of **John Gaudreau**, **J.T. Miller** and **Jim Vesey** made its debut vs. Slovakia. The trio produced two goals, both by Gaudreau, and six assists. Vesey had an assist on three consecutive goals in the first period. Miller had a pair of helpers on the day and Gaudreau tacked on an assist as well. Their collective plus/minus rating on the day was +9.

PRODUCTIVE BLUE LINE

Team USA's defense corps has contributed eight of the team's 19 goals, including four on the power play. **Jacob Trouba** has a goal in every game, while **Shayne Gostisbehere**, **Seth Jones**, **Jake McCabe** and **Mike Reilly** have a goal apiece. The seven-man group also has six assists.

FACE-OFF FORTUNES

Each of Team USA's four primary centers is succeeding at above 50% in the face-off circle. **Cole Bardreau** leads the way at 65% (36-19), followed by **Vince Trocheck** (64% (53-30)), **J.T. Miller** (64%, 38-21) and **Sean Kuraly** (54%, 35-30).

MULTI-POINT PERFORMERS

Six U.S. players posted multiple points in a 9-3 win vs. Slovakia. **John Gaudreau** (2-1--3) and **Vince Trocheck** (2-1--3) each scored their first points of the tournament, as did **Jim Vesey** (0-3--3) and **Jake McCabe** (1-1--2). **J.T. Miller** tallied his first two assists, a pair of assists vs. Slovakia. **Alex Galchenyuk** posted a goal and an assist for his second multi-point effort of the tournament. He had a goal and two assists vs. Germany.

On the "grind line" nickname:

"It was a group decision. Two years ago Cole Bardreau and I played with Zac Laraza on the U.S. NTDP Under-18 Team and we had the "grind line." It's now carried over here, except we've added Ryan Hartman. I was a Red Wings fan growing up so it's from there too."

On Bardreau's U.S. Player of the Game:

"It was a great effort from all three of us to get that plate. Hartman and I haven't decided what we're going to do with it yet, if we're going to cut it up or destroy the evidence. It's an honor to win a plate like that. All three of us went into getting that. It's not often that happens, but when it does it's nice and it compliments all three of us."

On his hunting past time:

"The most interesting place I've been is probably South Dakota. I went pheasant hunting and had some success. I went with about 10 of my family members during a Thanksgiving weekend."

On his dad attending this tournament:

"It means a lot to me. It's about an eight and a half hour drive from home to Michigan Tech to see me and my brother, Chad, and he's probably only missed one home weekend this year. When I was with the U.S. NTDP he probably made all the trips overseas to Slovakia, Sweden, Germany and the Czech Republic."

On the number of people in his family:

"To be honest I don't know how many first cousins I have. My dad has nine brothers and one sister. And my mom has one brother and four sisters. I must have 100 cousins between the two families and I do know them all. Hockey-wise, my cousin, Aaron, my brother and I have made it the farthest, but a lot have played hockey. We've had some good family hockey games."

On playing on a line with his brother at MTU:

"My mom likes it, but it didn't go well."

On his last name pronunciation:

"It's Finnish. Lower Peninsula, we say puh-TILL-uh. Upper Peninsula, they call it PEE-till-uh. And pee-ET-uh-luh gets in there too."

CAPTAIN AMERICA

Defenseman **Jake McCabe** is wearing the captain's 'C' for Team USA. Joining McCabe as alternate captains are **Cole Bardreau**, **Seth Jones**, **J.T. Miller** and **Jacob Trouba**. The alternate captains are split into two pairs, with Jones and Miller wearing an 'A' when the U.S. wears its white jerseys and Bardreau and Trouba doing so in the blue jerseys.

McCabe is in his second season at the University of Wisconsin. He is the third Wisconsin Badger in the last four years to lead the U.S. National Junior Team. **Derek Stepan** captained the U.S. to a gold medal in 2010, while **John Ramage** helped the U.S. to a bronze medal in 2011 in Buffalo, N.Y.

WELCOME BACK

Team USA returns three players from the 2012 IIHF World Junior Championship. Forward **J.T. Miller** played in all six games last year, registering two goals and two assists. Defenseman **Jacob Trouba** was the youngest player on Team USA in 2012. He collected two assists and was Team USA's Player of the Game vs. Canada on Dec. 31, 2011. Goaltender **John Gibson** made one start last year, making 23 saves on 27 shots in a loss to Finland.

GOLD MEDAL PEDIGREE

The United States has won the last four IIHF Men's Under-18 World Championships. Thirteen players on the 2013 U.S. National Junior Team roster have won gold medals at those events, including four players who have won twice; **Tyler Biggs** and **Rocco Grimaldi** did so in 2010 and 2011, while **Seth Jones** and **Jacob Trouba** equaled the feat in 2011 and 2012. The other gold medalists in 2011 were **Cole Bardreau**, **John Gibson**, **Jake McCabe**, **J.T. Miller**, **Connor Murphy** and **Blake Pietila**. In 2012, **Riley Barber**, **Patrick Sieloff** and **Ryan Hartman** also stood atop the medal stand.

In 2011, Gibson was named best goalie of the tournament by the Directorate.

LEAGUE LEADERS

A number of U.S. players are prominent scorers in their respective leagues.

John Gaudreau (Boston College) is tied for seventh in NCAA hockey with 23 points. His 11 goals are tied for third in the college ranks. **Blake Pietila** (Michigan Tech University) has 10 goals in 17 games, which is tied for seventh in the NCAA. **Riley Barber** (Miami University) is the top point-getter among rookies in the NCAA with eight goals and 22 points in 18 games.

Alex Galchenyuk's (Sarnia Sting), whose 27 goals in 33 games are tied for first in the Ontario Hockey League. **Vince Trocheck** (Saginaw Spirit) is fifth on the OHL points list with 50 (24-26) in 35 games. **Seth Jones** (Portland Winterhawks) has 28 points (8-20) to rank fifth among Western Hockey League defensemen and second for WHL rookies.

Goalie **John Gibson** (Kitchener Rangers) is tied for fifth in the OHL in both goals against average (2.33) and save percentage (.929). Also in the OHL, **Garret Sparks** (Guelph Storm) has a league-best 950 saves and four shutouts.

TEAM BUILDING

Thirteen of the 23 players on the U.S. National Junior Team preliminary roster were members of the U.S. National Team Development Program. Additionally, **Sean Kuraly** and **Mario Lucia** played brief stints with the NTDP during their junior careers.

The list of past NTDP members includes forwards **Riley Barber** (2011-12), **Cole Bardreau** (2009-11), **Tyler Biggs** (2009-11), **Rocco Grimaldi** (2009-11), **Ryan Hartman** (2010-12), **Blake Pietila** (2009-11), **J.T. Miller** (2009-11); defensemen **Seth Jones**, **Jake McCabe** (2009-11), **Connor Murphy** (2009-11), **Patrick Sieloff** (2009-11), **Jacob Trouba** (2010-12); and goaltender **John Gibson** (2009-11).

YOUTHFUL EXUBERANCE

Typically a tournament for 19-year olds, the U.S. roster includes seven players born in 1994: **Riley Barber**, **Alex Galchenyuk**, **Ryan Hartman**, **Jon Gillies**, **Seth Jones**, **Patrick Sieloff** and **Jacob Trouba**.

FAMILY TIES

A number of U.S. players have family roots in college and/or professional hockey.

- **Riley Barber's** dad, Don, played at Bowling Green State University and in the NHL.

- **Tyler Biggs'** dad, Don, played in the NHL.

- **Alex Galchenyuk's** father, Alexander, played in the International Hockey League, including Milwaukee, where Alex was born, and throughout Europe.

- **John Gaudreau's** dad, Guy, skated at Norwich University.

- **Jon Gillies'** dad, Bruce, played in the IHL.

- **Seth Jones'** father, Ron "Popeye", did not play hockey, however, he had an 11-year career in the National Basketball Association and is currently a coach for the NBA's Brooklyn Nets.

- **Sean Kuraly's** father, Rick, starred at Miami University and is the program's career scoring leader.

- **Mario Lucia's** dad, Don, also played at Notre Dame and is the head coach of the University of Minnesota men's ice hockey team.

- **Connor Murphy's** dad, Gord, played 14 seasons in the NHL and is on the coaching staff of the Florida Panthers

- **Blake Pietila** has a brother, Chad, and cousin, Aaron, playing alongside him at Michigan Tech. His uncle, Jim Storm, also played for Michigan Tech, and eventually the Dallas Stars.

- **Jim Vesey's** father, Jim, played at Merrimack College and also in the NHL.

PRE-TOURNAMENT RECAP

Team USA began its training camp on Dec. 16 at the New York Rangers' Madison Square Garden Training Facility in Tarrytown, N.Y. Three days later, the team arrived in Helsinki, Finland, where it played a pair of pre-tournament games. Against Sweden on Dec. 20, the U.S. notched a 3-2 victory in overtime on **Shayne Gostisbehere's** blast from the point. **Connor Murphy** (power play) and **Ryan Hartman** also had a goal apiece in the win. In a 5-1 loss to Finland on Dec. 22, **Blake Pietila** was Team USA's goal scorer.

Head Coach

Phil Housley

Phil Housley is serving as the head coach of the U.S. National Junior Team for the first time. Previously, he held assistant coaching positions for the 2007 and 2011 U.S. National Junior Teams that received bronze medals. Additionally, Housley was an assistant coach for the 2011 U.S. Men's National Team.

A seven-time member of the U.S. Men's National Team (1982, 1986, 1989, 1996, 2000, 2001, 2003), Housley earned a silver medal with the U.S. Olympic Men's Ice Hockey Team at the 2002 Olympic Winter Games. In 1996 helped Team USA to a first-place finish at the World Cup of Hockey. He made his Team USA debut at the 1982 IIHF World Junior Championship.

Housley spent 21 seasons in the NHL (1982-2003) and has the highest career point total (1,232) by an American defenseman. He is a member of the IIHF and U.S. Hockey Halls of Fame.

A native of South St. Paul, Minn., Housley is in his ninth season as the head coach of the Stillwater (Minn.) High School boys' ice hockey team.
