RE: Spring Report

This quarter we have been very busy. We as a group did not meet officially but we have been busy with stuff. We completed the task with USA Hockey and playing rules for Mite U8 and Mini Mite U6 as to playing surface and number of games that can be played within the season. I submitted to USA Hockey our recommendation as was presented at the winter meeting to USA Hockey as our plan. I did receive notice that it was accepted as submitted. I was notified by President Margenau that Ben Johnson Duluth MN is looking to start a U19 Tier 1 Post High School Program. I did have a meeting with President Margenau, and Dennis Green at the Boys State High School Tournament on this request. To date I have not heard anything from Mr. Johnson as to his request.

I was also notified by President Margenau of a request for a Tier 1 Major Midgets team brought to him from Christopher Borer. Scott Dornfeld and I will work together to see what we can do offer this program in Minnesota. This program would play out of D3. To date, I have not met with Scott or heard from Mr. Borer as to his request.

Hockey Ops Team will be going through some restructuring this month. I was contacted by ACE/ADM Coordinator Bob Driver that he will be stepping down after the Spring Training. Bob will be pursuing his PHD in Education and will not have the time to the job required. I would like to personally thank Bob for the work this season and I wish him all the best.

This leads me to the Team. I have met with Christian, Guy, and Mac to discuss my original plan of splitting the responsibilities of ACE and ADM in to 2 separate teams. I would like to recreate the ACE (Association Coaching Education) or as I refer to it as the Hockey network. This group will be charged with the delivery of Coaching, Parent, and Player Development education information that comes from HEP, USA Hockey CIC, and others as needed. This is a vital team that has a passion to educate.

I next recommend to Christian, Guy and Mac that we develop a very robust ADM Skills Team made up of a Coordinator and to have both a boys and girls team to deliver skills clinics to associations based off a fact finder as to the needs of that Association. This team will be charged with the development of a skills menu that will allow Districts and Associations to customize their learning needs. We will offer ADM Training this spring to the team of leaders for both boys and girls in St. Cloud during the level 4. This training will be led by Guy Gosselin, to include both on ice training, and class room learning. I look for a lot of traction in skill development this next season.
