



Frequently Asked Questions

What is the Peachtree Ridge Soccer Booster Club?

The Peachtree Ridge Soccer Booster Club is a volunteer not-for-profit organization of parents, alumni, staff, corporate sponsors and other community supporters. We have a proud tradition of providing the financial assistance necessary for the establishment of a first class soccer program for our student/athletes. This support is provided through membership dues as well as fund-raising events throughout the year.

What is the purpose of a Booster Club?

The purpose of the Peachtree Ridge Soccer Booster Club is to aid and support the Peachtree Ridge Soccer Program as follows:

- Providing those services, facilities and equipment which are not provided by the school system. GCPS provides the basic facility, team transportation and one coach's supplement for each of our four teams. All other items and enhancements are the responsibility of the booster club;
- Providing a "1st Class" environment for our players to feel supported and appreciated;
- Supporting the coaches and the players with a positive and encouraging attitude;
- Promoting parent, student, and community involvement;
- Coordinating all supporting activities, i.e. concession stand, tournaments, fundraising and social outings;
- Encouraging attendance at soccer related functions;
- Ensuring recognition for the soccer program and its athletes; and
- Increasing fan attendance and promoting PRHS soccer.

Why should you join?

The booster club is a way to be involved in your student's athletic career and share that experience with others of similar interest. We understand that as parents of teenagers it becomes harder and harder to stay abreast of what's going on in their school life. Your membership provides a conduit for communication to the soccer program.

What is a Team Parent?

The coaches for JV and Varsity teams will be seeking parents to be team representatives to the Boosters. The team parents assist with organization, communication and team building activities. They will provide input about the needs of their team and foster cooperation between the Boosters' board, parents, coaches, and team players.

Why do we have fundraising?

Fundraising goes toward many costs such as player equipment, uniforms, special events, banquet expenses, awards, special clinics, transportation, communication, senior gifts, field maintenance, facility improvements and much more.

What is the role of a Parent?

The role of a *Lion Parent* is to:

- Always keep things in Perspective... your child is not just playing soccer, they are learning about commitment, sacrifice, team play, sportsmanship and making memories that will last a lifetime.
- Be a Role Model for your child by keeping a positive attitude and exhibiting good sportsmanship. Encourage open communication with their coach.

When does Soccer begin?

Voluntary Conditioning begins in November and it is strongly encouraged that your son/daughter attends. Athletic Physicals and eligibility are due prior to conditioning.

When is the first day of practice?

Official tryout dates are at the end of January and team practice begins immediately following the announcement of the teams.
