



## NYBA Evaluator Scoring

Grading scale: 1-5

1—well below peers

2—below peers

3—average

4—above peers

5—well above peers

Player's identification will be on their throwing hand

Do not give half points

Evaluate each process of the skill and fill out a score

Do not compare/change scores with other evaluators

Mark comments to indicate attitude/work ethic/athletic ability

(\* ) by the players number if they are for sure in the top 12 of their age group at the skill you are evaluating

Hitting (Balcony)

3 components to watch and score: Mechanics, Contact, Power

Evaluate not only at the pitching machine station but at other stations too

Rotate based on pitching machine station

Fielding (Gym)

3 components to watch and score: Mechanics, Fielding ability, Strength

Accuracy can be lumped into strength

Range can be lumped into fielding ability

Players will play catch and extend as far as possible

Field ground balls and throw to bases

Pitching (TBD)

3 components to watch and score: Mechanics, Accuracy, Velocity

Radar Gun may be present to indicate velocity

Warm up mound and official mound—all fastballs
