Lexi Romanchuk Named Providence College Women's Ice Hockey Team's Most Valuable Player

Romanchuk played 142 games for Providence.

PROVIDENCE, R.I. – Senior captain, Lexi Romanchuk, of the Providence College women's ice hockey team was named the team's most valuable player on April 17, 2016. Romanchuk played in 142 career games, placing her second on the Friars' all-time list. She finished her career with 55 points on 16 goals and 39 assists.

Romanchuk capped off an impressive career with her best season as a senior, enjoying a season-high 20 points. The senior defender captained the team and tallied seven goals, four coming on the power play. She also notched two game winning goals, against Merrimack on Dec. 11, 2015 and RIT on Jan. 9, 2016. Romanchuk was named a Hockey East Top Performer two times throughout the 2015-16 season (Nov. 16 and Nov. 30). In accordance with earning the team's MVP, she also earned the Captains Award.

In the 2014-15 season, Romanchuk served as an assistant captain and led the team in blocked shots and was named the team's Unsung Hero. In the 2013-14 season, she led the defensive core with 17 points on four goals and 13 assists, and led the team in game-winning goals (3). Romanchuk was named Hockey East Player of the Week (Jan. 6) after posting a three point game and scoring the overtime game-winner against RPI. She was awarded the team's Seventh Player Award.

Romanchuk earned four team awards in her time at Providence, recognized as a Hockey East Top Performer three times, Hockey East Player of the Week in 2014, and made the Hockey East All-Academic Team in 2013.
