Roy Simmons receives the Keys to the City

LAKE PLACID — Former Syracuse University lacrosse coach Roy Simmons Jr. received a surprise present for his 80th birthday. On August 8, 2015 at last year's Lake Placid Summit Lacrosse Tournament, Simmons was honored with a special plaque detailing his accomplishments in the sport.

North Elba Town Supervisor Roby Politi also handed Simmons the keys to the city as family, friends and former players joined about 200 people during a brief ceremony.


He was head coach at Syracuse from 1971-88 and his teams won six NCAA Division I titles. The Orange made 16 straight final four appearances under Simmons, who's a longtime supporter of the Lake Placid tournament.

Simmons first started coming to Lake Placid in the 1950s when a North/South All-Star Lacrosse Game was staged on the Oval. He has also made numerous trips to attend the annual Summit Lacrosse Tournament and watch his former athletes.

Simmons also was honored as an Honorary Citizen of the Olympic village.

Take advantage of Lake Placid's proximity to the outdoor adventures that the lakes and mountains provide. The outstanding beauty of the Adirondacks owes much to its spectacular terrain; a winning combination of high rocky summits, ancient timberlands and endless waterways.

Hiking

From Lake Placid, it's just a short drive to High Peak trailheads including Mt. Marcy, Algonquin Peak, Mt. Colden, Marcy Dam and Phelps. Shorter day hikes abound as well, such as the Peninsula Trails in Lake Placid and Mt. Jo, a family-friendly 2.3 mile loop with open summit ledges that provide one of the best views of the High Peaks -attained with a fairly easy hike. Nearby Keene Valley is a popular access point for hiking in

the High Peaks as well, with trailheads for the Dix and Giant Mountain wilderness areas.

For those so inclined, the gneiss cliffs of the Adirondacks have been a rock climbing destination for decades. There are literally thousands of traditional rock climbs accessible to climbers, and professional guides available to provide private instruction and to showcase the region's classic routes.

Paddling

The Adirondacks contain over 3,000 lakes and ponds, and more than 30,000 miles of streams feeding 6,000 miles of river. These waterways provide miles of navigable flatwater and whitewater for the outdoor enthusiast to explore. The sparkling lakes, rivers and ponds are perfect for canoeing and kayaking, including Lake Placid itself, and the



nearby accessible and rambling Saranac chain of lakes.

Rentals and guided boating opportunities abound; try Stand Up Paddling (SUP) on Mirror Lake or wake boarding on Lake Placid!

Biking

Cyclists! Whether you're looking for extreme downhill trails, quiet country roads, or Ironman training runs, this region is a mustride destination for both the knobby and road tire sets. From Lake Placid, road cyclists can try out the Ironman loop, or explore the nearby Lake Champlain region - long known for its rolling hills perfect for road

Fishing
Anglers are lured to cast a line into the famed West Branch of the Ausable River, the longtime fly-fisherman's paradise that is nationally recognized for its six miles of designated

catch-and-release fishing. And, Lake Placid itself is known for its abundant rainbow and lake trout.

Golf

Golfers find it difficult to keep their heads down as some of the most breathtaking views of the mountains and lakes can be enjoyed from the cedar-lined fairways and rolling greens of the area's signature and historic golf courses. 





LEGENDS OF PLACID LAX Andi LeMire O'Connor

Bill Bergan, AKA "Troll" is an original member of the Sailin' Shoe LC who has played on multiple championship teams. He epitomizes the tough upstate attitude of the Shoe and is still a top two way midfielder who brings intensity to the game. Legends are defined in many ways, but Bill Bergan's legacy as a player will be remembered as one of the game's most complete players. A ground ball machine that could "stand up" players twice his size, Troll was always two steps ahead of everyone, mentally and physically. An "in the box" stick handler who looked text book, he was far from it, incorporating creativity that defied the stick technology of the time. Now in his 50's and an annual participant at Placid since his college days, he's still a joy to watch, and to this day, players point debut at the 1998 Summit. to his style and approach to the game as a model for all to a follow.



Andi has taken part in 18 Lake Placid lacrosse tournaments. She has been a part of 10 championship teams. These numbers alone are very impressive, but the most noteworthy part of Andi's Lake Placid lacrosse career is the fact that she has been keeping up with college-age students who are at the peak of their careers. Last year, at age 53, she was running midfield on a team studded with some of the top college students playing against athletes of the same caliber. She was also consistently beating most of them up and down the field on every possession. Andi has never let age hinder her athletic prowess. At age 48, she tore her anterior cruciate ligament. She had her surgery in May and was back playing tennis by the following Thanksgiving. Andi stands out as one of the most successful and longesttenured women's players since women's lacrosse made its

MLL Announces First Ever Legends Alumni Game

Lake Placid Summit Classic set to host first ever MLL Legends Alumni Game

Lake Placid (June 9, 2016) - Major League Lacrosse, the premier professional outdoor lacrosse league, announced today plans to deliver the League's first ever Legends Alumni Game event at the 2016 Lake Placid Summit Classic.

The inaugural event will take place at North Elba Athletic Field #1 Friday, August 5, at 5 p.m. EST, as part of the Lake Placid Summit Classic tournament festivities. The event is free to the public. The game broadcast will also be made available on LAX Sports Network.

"It's great there is an event that brings together some of our former MLL stars," said David Gross, Commissioner of Major League Lacrosse. "These former players have been tremendous ambassadors for

our league and the sport. We are excited to have them be a part of this inaugural alumni game."

"Having been involved in the Lake Placid

Summit Classic for 26 years and the MLL for 11, and caring for each dearly, it's been a dream of mine to find a way to combine the two," said LPSC Director, Kevin Leveille. "The MLL Legends Alumni Game will be a great showcase of Major League Lacrosse through 40 true professional pioneers, lacrosse legends and long-time Lake Placid Summit Classic participants. On a weekend where a lot of the lacrosse community is tuned into Lake Placid and tuned out of everywhere else, it will be great to pull Major League Lacrosse into the focus."

The Lake Placid Summit Classic was established in 1990 with the idea of playing lacrosse in a beautiful place. In year one the event comprised of 7 teams with play over two days. 2016 marks the 27th year of the event and over 7 days, over 250 teams broken out by 18 different divisions, will come to Lake Placid to compete. Boys, girls, men and women all participate and ages range from 15 to 60+. The LPSC is a celebration of lacrosse and camaraderie.

In the tradition of both LPSC and MLL heritage both alumni players will take the field for a couple of charitable causes that are near and dear to the lacrosse community's heart. Both HEADstrong Foundation and Army Ranger Lead the Way Fund will be the charity recipients for the game's efforts. HEADstrong Foundation has long been a partner of MLL in their efforts to improve quality of life for cancer patients and their families. By fulfilling a promise made to HEADstrong founder, Nicholas Colleluori, that others would benefit the life that he lived. Army Ranger Lead the Way Fund is an active duty, casualty assistance, recovery and Military transition organization whose mission is to provide ongoing support and financial

assistance to the men and families of the elite Special Operations 75th Ranger Regiment, beyond what the government and Veteran's Af-

fairs can offer. The fund honors the life and legacy of SGT James J. Regan of the 75th Ranger Regiment, who played collegiate lacrosse at Duke University. In lieu of purchased tickets, both recipients will be on hand at the tournament all week long and donations are encouraged, especially for those attending the game.

Alumni teams will be comprised of approximately 40 former Major League Lacrosse players and coaches. Former MLL players set to take the field include Gary Gait, Matt Streibel, Tim Goettleman, Gerry Byrne, Pat McCabe, Kevin and Mike Leveille, Josh Sims, Mike Regan, Tim Soudan and many more to be announced closer to the game.

MLL's newest official licensee Territory Sports, will come on as the game's uniform designer and provider. "It's exciting for us as a brand to be a part of the history and player talent that this League has produced," said Michael Bechler, owner of Territory Sports. "Being able to create the jersey which represents 16 seasons of MLL play is an honor for us."

Playing Fields: There are three sites where tournament games are played as follows:

The North Elba fields act as the tournament headquarters where there are food and other vendors, tournament information, security, and other services. There are athletic trainers and tournament staff at all playing sites and the Lake Placid Central Schools will run a vending operation at the Horse Show Grounds site. As teams move through the tournament, the teams advancing towards a championship are more likely to be playing at the North Elba fields. Please respect all posted facility and safety rules and please use caution when spectating or otherwise participating at tournament playing fields.

Participating Teams and Divisions:

There are 252 teams participating in 19 divisions of play. Each division has specific age requirements that must be adhered to by all participants. The full list of teams by division can be downloaded at www.lakeplacidlax.com.

Competition Format and Tournament Tie-Break Formula:

The competition format varies from division to division but generally, there are two or three rounds of pool play (sometimes called qualifying rounds) after which the teams are re-seeded for the playoff rounds. In reseeding teams or in any other tie-break situation, the following tournament tie-breaker will be utilized:

- Head to head competition; all tied teams must have played each other for this to apply;
- 2. Fewest goals allowed;

- 3. Highest goal differential, total goals scored (12 goals per game max) less total goals given up;
- 4. Most goals scored;
- 5. Coin toss

NOTE: After each level of criteria is utilized, the tie-break resets. Example: If there is a 3-way tie, and one team secures a seed/slot based on goals against, the tie-break resets to head-to-head for the next seed/slot if relevant.

In reseeding teams for the playoff rounds, the tournament will try to avoid duplicate games between teams unless the game is still in the divisional championship stream. For consolation games, staff will look to schedule opponents based on whether or not they have already played.

Staying on Schedule:

The tournament prides itself in staying on schedule. Teams are asked to quickly clean-up and vacate the bench area upon completion of a game to allow the next teams to take the field. The tournament may use an audible signal such as an air horn to denote that it is five minutes from the start of the next game. The cooperation of the teams in this regard is greatly appreciated.







😭 Hazardous Weather/Evacuation Policy & Procedures 🔯



In the interest of ensuring participant safety and the appropriate use of the North Elba Athletic, Lake Placid Central School District, and Northwood School fields and facilities, the Lake Placid Summit Classic reserves the right to postpone, cancel, or shorten games due to inclement weather, especially lightning. If lighting or other hazardous weather is detected, the following mandatory procedures will be implemented:

 A horn will sound three short blasts to indicate the need for all participants to evacuate the playing fields and return to their vehicles for approximately 30 minutes from when the last lightning or other hazardous condition is detected;

- Tents and equipment can be left at the fields until the storm delay is completed:
- Once the storm clears, five short horn blasts will denote 15 minutes until resumption of play;
- If the evacuation occurs during the first half of a game, the teams will return to play the second half of the game and the entire schedule will be delayed by the duration of the delay:
- If the evacuation occurs during the second half of a game, that game may be terminated and the score at the time that play was suspended will be the final score;

the next round of games will be played when play resumes and the remaining schedule will be played on a delayed basis in its entirety.

Please be advised that for all issues affecting game play (e.g.- field/goal conditions, schedules, seeding/reseeding, playoffs, weather-related play halts/restarts, etc.), official information and decisions can only be obtained from the tournament Directors, who are located at the tournament headquarters. Please do not request or expect formal information from score keepers, referees, grounds keepers, or security personnel. In addition to being available at the tournament headquarters, tournament Directors will first and foremost utilize the tournament website, using email/mobile phones in an emergency, to communicate information pertinent to game play. However, it is ultimately the team's on-site representative's responsibility to seek out and obtain correct and timely information that affects their team's play from the tournament Directors. This above signifies the need for teams to COMPLETELY fill out the registration forms, including contact information for on-site team representatives.





BOY'S SCHOLASTIC (HIGH SCHOOL) U16. U17, AND U18 DIVISION RULES

Boys High School divisions will use Federation High School Rules (NFHS) with the following

1. Eligibility: All teams are required to certify that all players meet age eligibility requirements for the event as published on the event's official website.

2. Timing: All games will consist of two (2) 20, 23, or 25 minute running time halves with a five minute half-time. *Note - game duration and halftime may be shortened by mutual agreement of participating teams. Also, at the discretion of the tournament organizers, game times may be shortened due to inclement weather, or to keep the tournament on sched-

3. Overtime: Sudden victory overtime will follow the completion of a tied game after a 3 minute break; sudden victory periods will be 4 minutes of running time; goals defended will remain the same for the first sudden death period and a face-off will commence the first sudden death period; goals will be exchanged after each sudden death period and the ball will be put in play at the relative area of the field by the team which had possession of the ball at the end of period; if no possession, a face-off will take place.

4. Timeouts: Each team will be given one (1) one-minute timeout per half, which cannot be taken in the last two minutes of the game. Game clock will stop during timeouts. There will be no timeouts allowed in overtime.

5. Substitutions: All substitutions will be on the fly.

6. Advancing the Ball, Counts & Stalling: No counts will be used unless a stall warning is issued. If the officials feel a stall warning is needed & it is initiated, the ball must be moved to the box within 10 seconds and kept in the box, as per the NFHS Stalling rule.

7. Restarts: As per the NFHS Rules. The Goaltender shall be given a maximum of 5 seconds to return to the crease area.

8. Slow Whistle Rule: All flag down situations are handled in the same manner as NFHS rules.

GIRLS U15 DIVISION RULES

The Girl's U9, U11, U13 and U15 divisions will utilize the Modified Sports Standards of the US Lacrosse rules with the following exceptions;

1. Eligibility: All teams are required to certify that all players meet age eligibility requirements for the event as published on the event's official website.

2. Timing: Girl's U9, U11, U13 and U15 games will consist of two (2) 20, 23, or 25 minute running time halves with a five (5) minute intermission. The clock will stop in the last minute of each half. *Note - game duration and halftime may be shortened by mutual agreement of participating teams. Also, at the discretion of the tournament organizers, game times may be shortened due to inclement weather, or to keep the tournament on sched-

3. Overtime: Sudden victory overtime will follow the completion of a tied game after a 3minute break; sudden victory periods will be 3 minutes of running time.

4. Delay of Game: Teams will be assessed a delay of game penalty if not ready to begin play at the scheduled time; teams are responsible for being ready to play at the scheduled time for each game; games may be shortened at the discretion of the organizers to keep game times on schedule:

5. Stick-checking: Stick-checking will be

6. Timeouts: Each team will get 1 stoppedclock 1 minute timeout each half no carry-over.

GIRLS SCHOLASTIC HIGH SCHOOL DIVISION RULES

The High School divisions will utilize US Lacrosse rules with the following exceptions/clarifications:

1. Eligibility: All teams are required to certify that all players meet age eligibility requirements for the event as published on the event's official

2. Timing: Girl's high school games will consist of two (2) 20, 23, or 25 minute running time halves with a five (5) minute intermission. The clock will stop in the last minute of each half. Game duration and halftime may be shortened by mutual agreement of participating teams. Also, at the discretion of the tournament organizers, game times may be shortened due to inclement weather, or to keep the tournament on schedule.

3. Overtime: Sudden victory overtime will follow the completion of a tied game after a 3-minute break; sudden victory periods will be 3 minutes of running time.

4. Delay of Game: Teams will be assessed a delay of game penalty if not ready to begin play at the scheduled time; teams are responsible for being ready to play at the scheduled time for each game; games may be shortened at the discretion of the organizers to keep game times on schedule; 5. Timeouts: Each team will get 1 stoppedclock 1 minute timeout each half no carry-over.

WOMEN'S DIVISION RULES

The Women's division will utilize NCAA Rules to include:

1. Self-Start: Exceptions: All fouls in CSA, boundary violations, off sides violations, alternate possession situations, illegal draws, carding situations, and on any stoppage of the game clock [ie. last min of play].

2. 3 Seconds: Minor foul: offender placed 4M

to side at spot of FP

3. Goal Circle play: Defense allowed to run through when not in possession of ball, and stand in when within 1M of ball carrier. Any number allowed in when in possession of ball.

4. Goal Circle Foul: Attack: Offender moves 4M away, not behind

5. Free Space to Goal: Can be outside of CSA if advancing to goal and looking to shoot. GK ex-

6. Alternate Possession: Alternate possession replaces the throw

7. Body Ball: Allowed, except to blatantly block a shot on goal with body

8. Cards: 2 min [releasable -yellow, non-releasable-red1

9. Delay of Game: NCAA progression

With the following exceptions;

1. Eligibility: All teams are required to certify that all players meet age eligibility requirements for the event as published on the event's official website

2. Timing: Women's games will consist of two (2) 20, 23, or 25 minute running time halves with a five (5) minute intermission. The clock will stop in the last minute of each half, unless there is a 10 goal differential, in which case running time will continue. Game duration and halftime may be shortened by mutual

agreement of participating teams. Also, at the discretion of the tournament organizers, game times may be shortened due to inclement weather, or to keep the tournament on schedule.

3. Overtime: Sudden victory overtime will follow the completion of a tied game after a 3-minute break; sudden victory periods will be 3 minutes of

4. Delay of Game: Teams will be assessed a delay of game penalty if not ready to begin play at the scheduled time; teams are responsible for being ready to play at the scheduled time for each game; games may be shortened at the discretion of the organizers to keep game times on sched-

5. Timeouts: Each team will get 1 stoppedclock 1 minute timeout each half no carry-over;

MEN'S DIVISION RULES

1. Eligibility: All teams are required to certify that all players meet age eligibility requirements for the event as published on the event's official

2. Timing: With the exception of Super & Ultra Grand Masters, all men's games will consist of four 14 or 15 minute running time periods. Halftimes are limited to 5 minutes. Super and Ultra Grand Masters games can be set at 10 to 15 minute running time periods, subject to the mutual consent of participating teams. Game duration and halftime may be shortened by mutual agreement of participating teams. Also, at the discretion of the tournament organizers, game times may be shortened due to inclement weather, or to keep the tournament on schedule. Penalty time will be stopped time.

3. Overtime: In the event of a tie game at the end of regulation, Sudden Victory overtime will begin after a 3 minute break. Overtime periods will be 4 minutes of running time. The 1st overtime period will begin with a face-off (unless an uneven penalty situation exists). There is NO coin toss & the goals defended will remain the same as at the end of regulation. Alternate possession will also remain the same. If the score remains tied at the end of an overtime period, subsequent overtimes will be as follows: The team in possession of the ball will retain the ball to begin the next overtime. Goals to be defended switch & the restart will be in the same relative position at the opposite end & no closer than 20 yards laterally from the goal. If neither team has possession at the end of an overtime period, a face-off will start the next overtime.

4. Timeouts: Each team will be permitted two 1 minute time-outs per half, and may be called by the team in possession any place on the field. Timeouts may also be called by either team during a dead ball situation. The game clock will be stopped during timeouts. There are NO timeouts allowed in overtime periods.

5. Face-offs: Face-offs will be conducted with the 2015 NCAA rules as a guide. Adjustment of sticks prior to the set call will be allowed by officials to ensure proper placement of the crosse & bodies. No player may pick up or carry the ball in the back of the stick. Carrying the ball in the back of the stick is defined as no more than 1 step. Face-off violations will result in a turnover. The player in violation may stay in the game and play defense. Violations are NOT counted by the officials, but continued technical fouls by a player or team may result in a 1 minute unsportsman-

6. Advancing the Ball, Counts & Stalling: No counts will be used unless a stall warning is issued. If a stall warning is issued the ball must be moved to the attack box area within 10 seconds and kept in the attack box area. There will be no automatic 2-minute stalling rule in the

7. Substitutions: All substitution will be on the fly, other than, when a goal is scored or a served time penalty is assessed. All substitutions must go through the designated substitution box.

8. Restarts: Restarts will be as per NFHS Rules. Quick restarts are encouraged, but no player may be within 5 yards of the player in possession. Goaltenders will be allowed a maximum of 5 seconds to return to the crease area.

9. Slow Whistle Rule: When a flag is thrown, the slow whistle will end as per NFHS Rules. (Whistle will sound if the ball hits the ground or comes out of the attack goal area).

10. Equipment & Crosses: Head coaches must certify their teams as properly equipped, as per rule, prior to the beginning of each contest. In the absence of a head coach, the team's captain shall certify the team is properly equipped. Failure to certify a team as to proper equipment will result in a forfeited game. All players will be expected to have appropriate equipment including sticks, helmets, chin straps, mouthpieces, and satisfactory gloves in accordance with NCAA standards. Each player is required to wear the issued uniform of its team. Crosses may conform to either NCAA or NFHS rules with regard to width & length. Crosses narrower than 6" at the top of the head or that do not meet length reguirements are to be assessed as 3 minute fouls& the stick is removed from play. Pocket depth infractions will be 1 minute fouls and may be corrected before entering the field of play. No more than 4 long sticks on the field at any time, per team.

11. Body checking: Ultra & Super Grand Masters Divisions: No body checking is allowed. Grand Masters Division: Limited contact only on the player in possession. Open Division & Masters Divisions will play NCAA Rules for body

12. Miscellaneous: Teams will be assessed a delay of game penalty if not ready to begin play at the scheduled time; teams are responsible for being ready to play at the scheduled time for each game. Blood/bleeding situations will follow NCAA guidelines. Subject to player eligibility requirements, all teams and players requesting roster exceptions must report to the game officials (including staff running the table) at least five minutes before the scheduled start time of the game; failure to do so may result in forfeiture and disqualification of the infracting team and player(s). The alternate possession rule will be used.

13. Expulsion, Ejection, or Fighting: Any participant (including players, coaches, team of-ficials or spectators) that participates in a fight during tournament play whether on or off the playing field will be subject to automatic disqualification from the tournament. Any player or coach called for verbal abuse will serve a one minute unsportsmanlike conduct penalty. Continued abuse will result in Ejection from the contest & potentially from the tournament.

SLV TOURNAMENT TIE-BREAK FORMULA: ALL DIVISIONS

In reseeding teams or in any other tie-break situation, the following tournament tie-breaker will be utilized:

1. Head to head competition; all tied teams must have played each other for this to apply;

2. Fewest goals allowed:

3. Highest goal differential, total goals scored (12 goals per game max), less total goals given up;

4. Most goals scored;

5. Coin toss

NOTE: After each level of criteria is utilized, the tie-break resets. Example: If there is a 3-way tie, and one team secures a seed/slot based on goals against, the tie-break resets to head-tohead for the next seed/slot if relevant

In reseeding teams for the playoff rounds, the tournament will try to avoid duplicate games between teams unless the game is still in the divisional championship stream. For consolation games, staff will look to schedule opponents based on whether or not they have already played.



Adirondack Health has big plans for Lake Placid location

Adirondack Health, the only full-service health system in the Adirondack Park, is breaking ground this summer for transformational plans to renovate and construct additional space for new and expanded services in Saranac Lake and Lake Placid.

In addition to building a completely modern surgical department with six new operating rooms in Saranac Lake, a second project focuses on Lake Placid and the creation of a Health and Medical Fitness Center on the Uihlein campus. All of the primary care services currently offered at the Church Street location will move into the new facility, including a brand-new emergency department, Lake Placid Sports Medicine, the Dental Clinic and offices for parttime and visiting specialty care providers.

Along with providing a broad range of healthcare services on one campus, the Medical Fitness Center will have space for new programs to support local and elite athletes who are an integral



part of the Lake Placid community. The focus will be on preventive care; rehabilitation, sports medicine, fitness and wellness programs.

Lacrosse into the Olympics? ... Why not?

Is the world's oldest game ready for the world's biggest stage?

The very thought of that seems incongruous, yet here we are: the grand sport of lacrosse, other than two Olympic appearances and three subsequent demonstration events all dating back 112 years, remains outside the Olympic movement.

It's a similar position that golf found itself in, yet that stick and ball game returns to the Games this summer in Rio after an absence of, ironically, 112 years.

Officially, lacrosse was contested in 1904 and 1908, with Canada emerging victorious both times. Our northern neighbors defeated just two other teams in its' first event, and only one other nation four years later.

But that's ancient history. The growth of the game has exploded from regional pockets of interest in Syracuse, Long Island, Maryland and Canada, to a nationwide activity in the United States enjoyed by athletes from youth to masters. Take a trip around Google - or the website of Summit Lacrosse Ventures, Inc. - and you can occupy all your free time with lacrosse games and tournaments from elite to recreational levels.

The NCAA tournament has developed into a premier cable television property, and now Major League Lacrosse has launched its own LAX Network.

"There is no question that the sport of lacrosse has grown substantially and is being played all around the world," remarked George Leveille, the founder of Lake Placid Lacrosse. "US Lacrosse, the sport's national governing body, is working with FIL (Federation of International Lacrosse) and other organizations to help fulfill this vision."

So what about the

Olympic Games?

Admittedly, it's scary when Olympic staples such as softball, baseball and wrestling can lose status and have to fight to regain it. But lacrosse took a big step forward when the World Championships came to Denver two years ago. And a year from now, Poland will host the 2017 World Games (IWGA). Will those signal a sea change that could elevate lacrosse's profile?

Certainly the IOC landscape started to change in 2013 when Thomas Bach replaced Jacques Rogge as the organization's president. Bach's new agenda, which changes some of the tried and true dogmas of the IOC, is open to fresh ideas.

Tom Hayes, director of development for the Federation of International Lacrosse, told Lacrosse Magazine in September 2013, that he hopes to achieve demonstration status at the 2020 Summer Olympics in Tokyo, with full Olympic status by 2024, in which Los Angeles is a candidate.

It is interesting to note that Japan, one of 54 nations currently playing the sport, now has some 20,000 participants.

"One potential challenge is the reality that three nations - the United States, Canada and the Iroquois Nation - dominate interna-

tional competition on both the men's and women's sides," continued Leveille. "With increased efforts to grow the game internationally, the long-term prospects are encouraging."

"I'm already noticing a philosophical shift that could open new doors to non-Olympic sports," Hayes told Lacrosse Magazine. "The philosophy that 'nobody can come in unless

somebody leaves' may be changing.


"Our next step remains unchanged," Hayes continued. "We are filing for provisional recognition by the IOC, which requires 50 affiliated countries across three continents."

That threshold has been crossed. Now it's time to build that stage for lacrosse, with five unique, interlocking rings in the background.
