## TALKING POINTS

### 5 NATIONS CHAMPIONS

The U.S. National Under-18 Team won the 2016 Under-18 Five Nations Tournament at USA Hockey Arena last week (Nov. 1-5) following victories over Switzerland, the Czech Republic and Sweden.

Team USA finished with a record of 3-1 and earned nine points in the standings, two more than any other team in the tournament. The U.S. National Under-18 Team has now won nine of the last ten international events held each November.

The U18s capped the week with a 3-2 victory over Finland on Saturday evening.

Sweden placed second in the tournament with seven points, the Czech Republic finished third (7), Finland finished fourth (6) and Switzerland finished fifth (2).

**Scott Reedy** (Prior Lake, Minn.) (2-3-5) and **Jacob Tortora** (Victor, N.Y.) (3-2-5) led the U.S. in scoring over the four-game tournament.

### CAPSIZING THE CAPITOLS

The U.S. National Under-18 Team is scheduled to play the first two of its four-game slate with Madison this weekend.

Team USA's last game against an USHL opponent came on Friday, Oct. 28 when

they traveled to Youngstown, Ohio, to take on the Phantoms. The U18s came up short in a comeback attempt, falling 3-2.

Madison currently sits five points ahead of the combined Team USA (U17s and U18s) in the USHL's Eastern Conference standings.

The Capitols have been outscored 30-21 by its opponents on the season but are coming off a 2-1 overtime victory against the USHL-leading Chicago Steel on Saturday (Nov. 5) night.

Madison is led offensively by Eugene Fadyeyev (2-6-8) and Mick Messner (3-3-6). Robby Fosdick has led the defense, appearing in all 11 games for the Capitols this season and recording a +2 plus/minus rating.

Goaltenders Dryden McKay and Daniel Lebedeff have split duties in goal. McKay leads the duo in wins (3), goals-against average (2.21) and save-percentage (.933 in five appearances). Lebedeff most recently appeared for Team Finland at the 2016 Under-18 Five Nations Tournament last week (Nov. 1-5) at USA Hockey Arena where he recorded a 1-1 record with a .857 save-percentage.

### USHL COMPETITION

The NTDP plays a full United States Hockey League season, split between the U.S. National Under-17 and Under-18 Teams. The records for both teams are combined into one in USHL standings. At this point, the U18s are 1-1-1 in the USHL regular season, while the U17s are 1-5-0, putting Team USA eighth in the Eastern Conference.

### SIGNING DAY

On Wednesday (Nov. 9) and Thursday (Nov. 10) 12 members of the U18s signed their National Letter of Intent (NLI) to play collegiate hockey during the 2017-18 season. Wednesday marked the first day that an NLI could be signed and submitted for next season.

**Sean Dhooghe** (Aurora, Ill.) and **Tyler Inamoto** (Barrington, Ill.) signed their NLIs to play for the University of Wisconsin.

**Logan Hutsko** (North Caldwell, N.J.) and **Jacob Tortora** signed their NLIs to play for Boston College.

**Nate Knoepke** (Farmington, Minn.) and **Scott Reedy** inked their NLIs to play for the University of Minnesota.

**Logan Cockerill** (Brighton, Mich.), **David Farrance** (Victor, N.Y.) and **Brady Tkachuk** (St. Louis, Mo.) signed their NLIs to play for Boston University.

**Evan Barratt** (Bristol, Pa.) signed his NLI to play for Penn State University, **Grant Mismash** (Edina, Minn.) signed his NLI to play for the University of North Dakota and **Graham Slaggert** inked his NLI to return home to South Bend, Indiana, to play for the University of Notre Dame.

### REEDY HEATING UP

**Scott Reedy** currently sits tied for second on the team in points with 12 (5-7-12) and has recorded eight points (4-4-8) over his last five games. In his last outing, he recorded the game-winning-goal and an assist against Finland to secure Team USA's championship at the 2016 Under-18 Five Nations Tournament.

### WORLD UNDER-17 CHALLENGE UPDATE

The U.S. National Under-17 team concluded its participation in the in the 2016 World

Under-17 Hockey Challenge yesterday afternoon with a victory over Canada Red.

With the win, Team USA finished the tournament with a 2-1-0-2 (W-OTW-OTL-L) record for fifth place in the overall standings.

### USA HOCKEY INTERNATIONAL NEWS

**Brianna Decker** tallied three points (one goal, two assists) and **Hilary Knight** added two goals to help the U.S. Women's National Team defeat Canada, 5-3, and claim its seventh Four Nations Cup Championship. Nine players had at least one point in the victory.

The United States has now captured the title seven times (1997, 2003, 2008, 2011-12, 2015-16). The Americans hold an overall record of 46-6-5-24-2 (W-OTW-OTL-L-T) in 83 Three/Four Nations Cup games.

### NCAA OPPONENTS

The U.S. National Under-18 Team will skate in 17 NCAA games this season, including 12 tilts with Division I squads. Team USA recently concluded a seven-game schedule in October alone, which included five teams ranked in the most recent USA Today / USA Hockey Magazine Men's College Hockey Poll.

Most recently, Team USA welcomed its first NCAA opponent to USA Hockey Arena on Saturday, Oct. 29. The U.S. National Under-18 Team fell to Princeton University in overtime, 5-4. **Scott Reedy** recorded two goals and an assist in the loss.

Team USA picked up its first victory against an NCAA opponent on Saturday, Oct. 22 when **Michael Pastujov** (Bradenton, Fla.) scored with 32 seconds remaining in regulation to break a 1-1 tie with second-ranked University of Minnesota Duluth at AMSOIL Arena in Duluth, Minnesota. **Brady Tkachuk** scored a short-handed goal in the second period to tie the game. **Dylan St. Cyr** (Northville, Mich.) made 32 saves en route to picking up his third win of the season.

Prior to its win over the Bulldogs, Team USA traveled to Madison to take on the University of Wisconsin at the Kohl Center on Friday (Oct. 21) night. Despite a late comeback attempt, the U18s lost 4-3. **Jacob Tortora** tallied two goals in the game while **Tommy Miller** added two assists. **Dylan St. Cyr** made 24 saves on 28 shots.

Prior to its matchup with the Badgers, the U18s traveled to Maricucci Arena to take on the University of Minnesota on Friday, Oct. 14. They fell to the eighth-ranked Golden Gophers, 9-0. Other games this month included a 5-2 loss to Harvard University (Oct. 8), a 8-2 loss to second-ranked Boston University (Oct. 6) and a 5-1 loss to the University of Notre Dame.

Princeton is one of two teams that will skate against the Under-18 Team at USA Hockey Arena. Arizona State University will visit for a pair of matchups on Feb. 24 and 25.

**NTDP GOALIES START HOT IN NCAA**  
**Hunter Miska** (2011-13), **Jake Oettinger** (2014-16) and **Joe Woll** (2014-16) have started their collegiate careers among the best in college hockey.

Miska, who spent last season with the Dubuque Fighting Saints (USHL), is a perfect 6-0-0 to start the season with the University of Minnesota Duluth, tying him with Union College's Alex Sakellaropoulos with the nation's top winning percentage.

Oettinger is second among rookies with a .941 save-percentage as he's collected four wins for Boston University.

Woll has started his collegiate career with Boston College by amassing a 7-2-1 record in ten starts while recording a 2.09 goals-against-average and .930 save percentage. He currently ranks 15th overall (8th in rookies) in goals-against average and 14th overall (8th in rookies) in save percentage.

**LABANC MAKES NHL DEBUT**  
**Kevin Labanc**, who played for the NTDP from 2011-13, played in his first NHL game with the San Jose Sharks on Tuesday (Nov. 8) in a 3-0 victory against the Washington Capitals. Labanc received the call up from the Sharks AHL affiliate, the San Jose Barracuda, after amassing a team-leading 10 points (4-6-10) over 10 games to start the season.

**59 ALUMS ON OPENING NIGHT ROSTERS**  
A total of 59 NTDP alumni were named to NHL opening night rosters across the league. These alums are spread across 21 different NHL rosters.

**NTDP COACHES' COLLEGE PATHS**  
All four coaches on the U.S. National Under-18 Team staff have ties to Division I college hockey programs. Head coach

**John Wroblewski**, a "pioneer" on the inaugural roster of the NTDP started in 1997, skated for Team USA for two seasons (1997-99) before suiting up for the University of Notre Dame.

A four-year letterwinner with the Irish (1999-2003), Wroblewski captained two squads over his tenure, served as alternate captain during his senior year and was the winner of the Notre Dame Monogram Club's Most Valuable Player Award. He was also recognized as the Irish nominee for the college hockey Humanitarian Award and the CCHA's Mike and Marian Ilitch Community Service Award. Wroblewski graduated with a degree in finance from Notre Dame.

Assistant coach **Nick Fohr**, in his sixth season with the NTDP, has seen his career transition from undergraduate assistant coach at Miami University (2002-03) to assistant coach at the University of Nebraska Omaha (2007-10), where he also served as director of hockey operations from 2004-07 and 2010-11. Prior to his coaching days, Fohr played four seasons with the University of Nebraska Omaha Mavericks (1998-2002), where he majored in exercise science.

Intern assistant coach **Greg Moore** is another returning NTDP player who skated with the U.S. National Under-17 and Under-18 Teams (2000-02). Following his NTDP career, Moore laced his skates up for the University of Maine men's hockey program (2002-06). Moore was selected as team captain during his senior season, was a top-10 finalist for the Hobey Baker Memorial Award and earned the Hockey East First Team and All-American First Team honors.

**Kevin Reiter**, now in his fourth season as goaltending coach at the NTDP, was a four-year letterwinner with the University of Alaska Anchorage. He earned a degree in management and economics before obtaining his masters of business administration at the University of Winchester in England.

**NHL CENTRAL SCOUTING**  
Eighteen players on the U.S. National Under-18 Team were named to the NHL Central Scouting's preliminary players to watch list. Seven of those players were listed as "B" prospects, indicating potential second or third round picks in the upcoming 2017 NHL Entry Draft. The other 11 NTDP players received "C" ratings, indicating fourth, fifth and sixth round candidates.

**ABOUT USA HOCKEY ARENA**  
Built in 1996 by Carolina Hurricanes owner Peter Karmanos, Jr. and purchased in March of 2015 by The USA Hockey Foundation, USA Hockey Arena is the home for the USA Hockey National Team Development Program.

Located in Plymouth, Michigan (20 miles west of Detroit and 15 miles east of Ann Arbor, Michigan), USA Hockey Arena encompasses close to 190,000 square feet with two ice surfaces. The main arena seats 3,400 (4,000 for standing room) and is a regulation National Hockey League ice surface (85 X 200). Four private suites are available with media facilities to accommodate live television broadcasts.

The second rink seats 900 with an Olympic-sized ice surface (100 X 200).
