Tips for Understanding the Rules of Order for the Meeting

The excerpts are rules established by the MAHA By-Laws that are pertinent to the consideration and voting upon any proposed rule changes are listed below.

MAHA Bylaw 7: Meetings

A. Parliamentary Authority

The rules contained in the current edition of Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised shall govern the association in all cases and all meetings to which they are applicable and in which they are not inconsistent with these bylaws and any special rules of order the association may adopt.

B. Meetings of the Board of Directors

2. Special Rules of Order

- b. During a voting session, persons acknowledged by the presiding officer to address the Board of Directors will be allowed 1.5 minutes, per item, to state their case. Allowed time is not transferable or cumulative.
- c. A silent vote or a roll call vote may be called for, but not both on the same issue. Whichever is requested first will be the only method honored, for that particular vote.
- d. A Roll Call of all voting members will be taken at the start of any session that requires the Board of Directors to vote. Any Director not present at the time of Roll Call will not be allowed to vote during that entire session.
- e. Quorum.
At least a majority of the Board of Directors shall be present to constitute a quorum for the purpose of conducting business.
- f. An amendment to strike out one word or a set of words in multiple places and to insert a different word or a set of words in all of those places shall be in order, and shall be deemed to include appropriate modifications in capitalization, number (singular or plural), and case (possessive).

MAHA Bylaw 8: Voting

A. Voting

At all Board meetings, each Board Member, except the President, shall have one vote on any and all matters which come before the Board. In matters which require only a simple majority, the President shall vote only in the event of a tie. In all other matters which require more than a simple majority of those voting, the president shall have a vote. The President shall vote in all elections of Officers.

MAHA Bylaw 11: Amendments

- A. Proposed changes to these Bylaws and/or the Rules and Regulations shall be submitted by members to the Rules Committee Chairperson, and must be postmarked before December 15. All proposals must be submitted on the MAHA rules change proposal form and must include all of the required information to be accepted by the Rules Committee Chairperson. All proposals are to be submitted in electronic format (on disk or via e-mail). All such proposals shall be read at the Winter Meeting with a recommendation offered by the Rules Committee. An advisory vote of the Board shall be taken at this time. All Proposals which do not receive support from a majority of the Board Members voting at the Winter Meeting shall be rejected.
- B. Amendments (not new proposals) may be made to said proposals by Board Members at the Winter meeting by a simple majority vote, or by a three-fourths vote at the Summer Meeting.
- C. Between the Winter and Summer meetings, Board Members shall discuss the merits of the various proposals carried forward in their home Districts.
- D. For Bylaw and Rules and Regulations amendments, adoption shall require a two-thirds majority vote of the Board Members voting at the Summer meeting.
- E. Any Bylaw or Rule change proposal determined by the Executive Committee to be the same, or substantially the same as one rejected at the previous Summer or Winter meeting cannot be placed on the agenda unless it receives a two-thirds majority vote by the Board members voting at the Winter meeting.
- F. All proposals postmarked on or after the December 15 deadline must receive approval of three-fourths of the Board members voting at the Winter or Summer meeting to be placed on the agenda.
- G. Proposals to change these Bylaws and/or the Rules and Regulations may be incorporated in a special committee report. If the committee report includes rule or bylaw changes then the Board shall vote separately from the report on the proposed changes and shall pass the rule or bylaw change by a two-thirds majority at the Summer meeting.

- H. Any amendments to these Bylaws and/or the Rules and Regulations necessitated by amendments to USA Hockey Bylaws and/or Rules and Regulations shall be automatically effected by the rules committee and report to the board members at the Winter or Summer meeting following the adoption of such amendments by USA Hockey.

HOW TO PARTICIPATE IN THE MEETING/WHAT TO SAY & WHEN

IF YOU WANT TO SPEAK: If you wish to obtain the floor during the board of directors meeting, approach the nearest microphone and wait to be recognized by the Chair, then identify yourself by stating your name and affiliation. This procedure assists the secretary in keeping accurate note of the proceedings.

As needed, the Chair will advise the members if a motion is not debatable, not amendable, and if more than a majority vote is required.

Amending Motions

An amendment may be introduced for any motion that contains a variable. The methods of amending are:

- To **insert** a word or consecutive words between two words within an existing sentence or paragraph
- To **add** a word or consecutive words at the end of a sentence or paragraph
- To **strike out** a word or consecutive words from a sentence or paragraph
- To **strike out and insert** a word or consecutive words from within a sentence or paragraph
- To **substitute** an entire sentence or paragraph

2016 SUMMER MEETING

The Michigan Amateur Hockey Association Summer Meeting was held at Shanty Creek Resort, Bellaire, Michigan on July 7-10, 2016.

President George Atkinson called the meeting to order at 8:35 a.m.

Life members of MAHA that were present were: Jerry Ludden and Clem Waldmann. Presidents and several representatives from various Michigan Hockey organizations were also in attendance.

President George Atkinson thanked Michigan Hockey Magazine for sponsoring the hospitality room and a thank you to all of the Exhibitors that participated.

Maurice Henderson, Parliamentarian went over several of the rules of order both for MAHA & Roberts Rules of Order.

CREDENTIALS REPORT:

DISTRICT3: Brian Graves resigned as District Director on February 15, 2016. Bud Kowalski was appointed District Director on March 8, 2016.

District 6: Jeff Jewell resigned as District Director on April 29, 2016. Kevin Sehmeyer was appointed District Director on May 3, 2016.

District 7: Mike Corso resigned as District Director and Chairperson on May 16, 2016. Shelly "Townsend was elected C/P on May 18, 2016. Ivan Sumerix was appointed District Director on May 18, 2016.

District 8: Scott Carter resigned as District Director on June 22, 2016.

DISABLED DIRECTOR: Carol Schwanger resigned as Disabled Director on 4/10/16.

ROLL CALL:

The Secretary Kerin Wear took roll call. Present at the meeting on Saturday during roll call were 52 voting members. Absent members on Saturday: Grant Helms, John Beadle, Ralph Bammert, Laurie Durbin, Joe Newood, Mark Biggings, Art Felon, Mark Biggings, and Nicole McMartin. On Sunday 49 voting members were present at roll call. Absent members on Sunday during roll call: Grant Helms, Bill Peterson, Ralph Bammert, John Beadle, Joe Newood, Brian Bellgraph, Mark Biggings, Brian Csutoras, Art Felon, Nichole McMartin, Al Wakeham.

Joe Barone made a motion that rule proposals coming out of committee only require 3/4 vote to pass. Seconded by Chris Boloven. Motion passed unanimously.

MINUTES:

Bob Howey made a motion to accept winter minutes and Danny Jaroshewich seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously.

FINANCIAL/BUDGET REPORT:

In the absence of the treasurer, Grant Helms, the May Financial statement is in the meeting book.

PRESIDENTS REPORT:

George Atkinson stated his report is in the book. He also presented a Power Point presentation. Highlights of his report and the Power Point were gone over: Michigan has been at the forefront of changes taking place in youth hockey.

Michigan is recognized as a leader and an innovator in programming by the other affiliates in USA Hockey. We will go into this in further detail as the season progresses.

We look forward to hosting the Girl's/Women's World Championship and they will be held at the USA Arena in Plymouth Michigan. During this time we will also be hosting all the Girl's and Women's Nationals.

This coming season we will be launching a program called Flex Hockey that is designated to be a program that can be adapted to community needs to provide recreational opportunities and increased physical activity for children in them using the great sport ice hockey.

Thanks for all you do in your local community to provide the ability for participation in the great sport of hockey.

RULE PROPOSALS:

Kim Durka and Maurice Henderson held discussions on the rule changes forwarded from the winter meeting went over the Rules of Order for the Meeting. Rule changes will be voted on at tomorrow's meeting.

Task Force #1, 2,,3 were presented, amended and passed to be placed on the floor for voting at tomorrow's meeting, # 4 is a work in progress.

AUDIT REPORT:

Jim Cosgrove reported : Complete details are in the summer meeting book.

ONEGOAL:

Lyle Phair stated his report is in the book. The MAHA OneGoal Program has distributed approximately \$50,000 each season for the past eight years to assist hockey associations in creating and conducting programs that encourage new players to get involved in the sport. Associations use the funding for marketing endeavors to reach new families and for purchasing rink divider sets and/or mini nets to enhance the playing experience, or equipment sets, sticks and helmets for the new players to use to help make the first hockey experience as affordable as possible. In the 2015-16 season, Thirty Three MAHA associations received OneGoal grant funding and over 271 equipment sets, 130 sticks and 72 helmets were distributed.

Thirty four grants have been requested and will be formalized and sent to the Executive Board for approval. Lyle thanked the MAHA OneGoal Committee Members for their time and effort they put have put forth.

OFFICIALS:

Judy Niemi and Russ Eidenberger, Michigan RIC stated the Officials report is included in the summer meeting book. He also thanked his entire staff for all they do.

For the 2015-16 Season nationally USA hockey registered 23,735 which is an increase from last season. We in Michigan registered 1,720, which is an increase of 91 officials. It's fantastic that we had an increase last season however our numbers still remain a concern for us as we will continue to work on growing our program as well as retaining our newer officials. Our staff kicked off a poster campaign this spring (We want you) in the hopes of generating some awareness and interest in our program.

We will continue to work on growing the female program by offering female specific seminars. District 4 hosted an all female seminar last season, which was a huge success. Melissa Szkola has taken on the roll of state supervisor for the female program. Melissa is having success on the ice herself and has a strong desire to grow the female program. Nationally we are working on multiple projects that will bring the officiating section ahead of the curve in our sport. The education for our officials continues to get better and better. The opportunities for officials continue to grow. It's truly an exciting time to be a part of the program.

COACHES:

Gordon Bowman state his report is in the book. Highlights from the reported.

Regional Meetings were held by District Coaching Directors in the fall of 2015 to review the importance of coaching technique. The Activity Tracker form seemed to be the topic of popularity. Many thanks for their involvement with associations and their help in clinics.

There were inquiries for Skills Development advise but the interest never materialized into actual on site presentations. It is vitally important that Associations have a solid Skills Development Program to build their foundation of entry level players. Ron Hayes has a wealth of knowledge from his experience from over the years. Please make use his wisdom.

Try Hockey for Free: 22 events were done from the sponsorship of MAHA and the Detroit Red Wing Foundation. Over 600 kids registered on line for our clinics with approximately 300 or more walk ups .

Jack Witt, Michigan Coach In Chief stated his report is in the book. Some of the highlights from his report: This season featured a totally re-done Level 2 clinic, with updated content, more video, and much more interaction- similar to the experience with Level 1 last year. The focus of Level 2 is on effective practice planning. We received good feedback on the value of these clinics by doing random surveys of attendees.

- The Level 3 curriculum has been re-done for 2016. It will be rolled out at Instructor Training in July, 2016.
- Clinic offerings for the season are shown above. We did Level 4 clinics in August, 2015, September, 2015 with Mid-Am, December, 2015, March, 2016, and May 2016. I especially want to thank our U.P. team of Jeff Cornock and Micah Stipech for their assistance in our successful clinic at NMU in May. Our Level 4 fees on average have been under \$175, because of the use of campus facilities.

GIRLS' \WOMEN:

Jean Laxton stated her report is in the book. Jean went over her report: The 2017 USA Hockey National Tournaments will be held March 30-April 30, 2017 for Tier 1 G/W in Rochester, MI and March 30-April 3, 2017 for Tier 2 in Troy, Michigan. The 2017 IIHF Women's Worlds will be in Plymouth Michigan April 1-8th, 2017

As of June 1, 2016 Michigan had 4,983 girls and women registered which is an increase for 2015/16.

S.T.A.R. HOCKEY COMMITTEE:

Cathy Starrett stated her report is in the book. Highlighted in the report:

About sixty-three incident reports were filed during the 2015-2016 season. This is a drop of six reports from the previous season. There were 95 reports filed in the 2013-2014 season. That represents a 34% drop in two seasons. I still believe this is a result of having to register with sport-nginx before filing a report. However the percentage of true STAR reports (filed on parents) rose significantly from 48% in 2014-2015 to 71% in 2015-2016. Hopefully this is a result of our educational endeavors.

YOUTH COMMITTEE:

Roger Mauritho reported the winners of the States were listed in his report. He stated we had two National Winners this year. The Mite Tournament went very well.

ADULT COMMITTEE:

Ray Kraemer stated his report is in the book. Ray iterated from his report: Per the USA Hockey registration report (through June, 2016), MAHA's Adult player registration held its own this season.

We continue to need full support from all Districts in paying attention to the Adult division. If you hear of any registration issues in Adult Leagues within your District, please contact me immediately.

100% of Michigan's Adult players used the USA Hockey online registration process. This process, has served to make registration very easy. It also has dramatically reduced expenses and work effort for league/arena operators who use this process. This has proven to be a strong selling point when discussing USA/MAHA registration with arenas and league. The state playoffs went very well. The Tier 1 & Tier 2 divisions that were conducted at the Arctic Coliseum arena in Chelsea were a big hit. The Tier 3, Tier 4 (pilot), Over 30 Tier 1 and the Over 30 Rec. divisions were conducted at the Fraser Hockeyland Arena and also were a success.

REDISTRICTING:

Ray Kraemer stated The committee received no requests for redistricting this season.

TASK FORCE 2018:

Kim Durka stated her report is in the book.

After months of meetings and passionate discussions, the Task Force 2018 Committee is bringing forth a **package of four rule proposals that work in conjunction with each other** (this is a key point!) to address a myriad of issues that our Associations and Clubs deal with. This package proposal will further help to put the player skill pyramid back in proper alignment and will support our Associations and Clubs. If passed, our leagues have committed to work with MAHA to support these changes accordingly. This package is a culmination of months of discussion based on surveys, questionnaires, feedback and discussions from our District Chairs, Directors, Association/Club Presidents and our members at all levels. We will continue to work together to make and implement changes that will benefit and support our players, coaches and Associations/Clubs and it is our hope to see all of our voting members support this package and the positive changes that can result from it.

Joe Barone stated they are working on Structured Tryouts. Many ideas have been kicked around

SAFESPORT:

Rick Frescura reported with another Hockey Year coming to a close we had a very busy year with the USA SafeSport Program. We also had double the Safesport Reports than the previous year. Remember the 2014/15 Season will be do

for Renew on Back Ground Checks and Safesport Training. There also will be some email blasts sent out to the parents and membership explaining what is and is not proper criteria for a Safesport report.

Our biggest problem again this year with SafeSport has been our Locker Room Policy.

98% of the reports were lack of monitoring the locker rooms. Our Associations and Clubs must take a serious approach to this situation. There were some reports sent in that did not fall under the SafeSport Guidelines. We are working on a FAQ Guide and a Guide of Recommendations for suspensions as reports and fact findings come in. We have set up small groups within the Safesport committee for this reason. We are now tracking the Safesport Reports and putting them into an Excel Spreadsheet tracking them into four types of Categories, and Levels. It is a must that all Associations make sure that Cell Phones are collected when entering the Locker Rooms.

We are in the process of developing a Safesport Coordinator Manual Also, and hope to have this ready for the 2016/17 Season.

This year with the start of the 2016-2017 Season, it will be automatically linked for Coaches, Managers and Referees and Board Members that do the Background Check in Season 2016-17 to the Roster. The Coaches and Managers **MUST COMPLETE the Background Check and Safesport Training** before they can be added on a Roster. If there are some that do not show up on the roster, and know that they have completed the proper year background and Safesport training please email me the Proper Background Receipt or Safesport Certificate and I will get it linked. Also be sure to use your own USA IMR Bar Code, **NOT your Childs**, to do the Background Check and Safesport Training. It will NOT be linked properly.

HIGH SCHOOL:

Don Wright stated the report is in the book. Team Michigan had two teams participate in the CCM Minnesota High School Invitational Tournament, April 21st thru the 24th. There was a Junior Team and a Senior Team. We had 270 players tryout for the two teams from a total of about 100 High Schools. Both teams did very well again this year. We had 23 different high schools represented from 10 different HS leagues, and all three MHSAA divisions. There were players from the UP, Northern Michigan, West Michigan and Southeastern Michigan.

SKILL DEVELOPMENT:

Ron Hayes, Skills Development Coordinator stated a lack of interest in this program. Ron stated he will go anywhere in the State to help with their Learn To Skate Programs. Also patches are available for those completing the program.

ADM/ACE:

ACE Administrator Tom Kehr was unable to be present.

I would like to thank each of the MAHA District Coaching Development Directors for all of their contributions and actively meeting with the Association Coaching Directors to provide guidance and support. Thanks too to Rob Palmer for development of an player activity tracker and multiple surveys monkey to gain the pulse of the program and drive insights going forward. Rob has met with most of the District and coordinated many meetings with the support of Bob Mancini incorporating the ADM into all discussions. Rob has provided mentoring to many of the District Coaching Development Directors and is much appreciated. Below are the various reports received from the following Districts: The Coaching Development Program implemented a Player Activity Tracker initiative in the fall. This was the primary topic of discussion during the annual Coaching Director district meetings.

RISK MANAGEMENT:

Grant Helms was unable to be present: His report in the summer meeting book.

LEGAL:

Steve Stapleton stated his report is in the book. Thus far, the most common issue relating to the Districts involve assisting the various District Chairs and local associations in disciplinary matters and hearings. There were issues this past season related to certain procedural issues in certain Districts, and MAHA will be conducting further educational sessions in the upcoming season on USA Hockey Bylaw 10. There were several amendments to Bylaw 10, and these changes will be incorporated into our training. USA Hockey also amended Bylaw 10 and addressed the applicability of Bylaw 10 to financial disputes and the process required of the Affiliates.

There are no pending legal proceedings as of this date, although several individuals/groups have threatened legal proceedings. We have reported several incidents to the insurance carrier based on the threats to file a lawsuit. We received reimbursement for legal fees related to one proceeding last year from the entity that filed an action, and expect reimbursement of certain legal fees on the lawsuit last year involving Kensington Valley Hockey Association. We continue to monitor interferences with our local associations by outside entities.

DISABLED SPORTS PROGRAM:

Kim Durka thanked Carol Schwanger for her hard work and dedication to the Disabled Hockey Program. Three applicants have applied for the position and will be interviewed at a later date.

REGISTRARS REPORT:

Bob Yohe stated his report is in the book. Highlights of his report included: The Michigan Registrars continue their tradition of working together to improve and enhance the registration process for all our USAH and MAHA members. Your District Associate Registrar can provide registration and informational materials, assist in processing registrations and approve and maintain all USA Hockey Official Rosters. Your District Associate Registrar provides the crucial link in your district and acts as a liaison between USA Hockey and you. District Registrars Rick Frescura, Kathy Jaroshewich, Dan Jaroshewich, Cindy Nicole, Myra Zolynsky, Mike Cruickshank, Donna Piper, Amanda Gobert, Pat Brumbaugh, Tim McIntosh and Michele LaCourt serve their Districts proudly and deserve high praise for the time and effort they volunteer. For the 2016-17 season the USAH/MAHA Registration fee is \$45 and remains the same for all players over the age of 6. The fee for age 6 and younger is waived. The coach registration fee is the same as a player and coach registration fee is waived if the coach is also a player.

VOLUNTEER/TEAM MANAGER REGISTRATION

Volunteer and Team Managers online registration option is required for all who participate within their local programs. Team Managers and Volunteers (locker room monitors, etc) will register online to create a unique confirmation number that allows local programs to easily transmit them into the USA Hockey and their association data base through their USA Hockey Registry. The online confirmation number for Volunteers/Team Managers is required to access SafeSport Training which is available on the USA Hockey website at no charge. Team Managers and Volunteers also need this confirmation number to apply for a Background Check. The fee for background check is \$10 every two years. To apply for your background check you need to go to the MAHA.org website.

REGISTRATION SEASON DATE

Registration for the 2016-17 season opened on April 1. Any new member who registers on or after April 1, is eligible to participate from the date of their registration through August 31, 2017. The official playing season remains September 1 through August 31.

USA HOCKEY REGISTRY

The upcoming 2016-17 season begins the third year of the Portal-based Registry which replaced the desktop Cyber Sport software previously used. The move to a web-based application has been successful and provides our registrars more flexibility and capabilities to complete their tasks. Team Rosters are submitted online and a link is provided for each Roster so it is easily accessible by all team officials. Team history is also maintained in the Program's Registry reducing paper requirements throughout the year.

Enhancements continue to be added with SafeSport training and Background checks being recognized on the rosters this season. Testing on a new team screen is almost complete and will be available for the new season. This was rolled out at the USA Annual Meeting in June. Neural Planet will be demonstrating this new tool at the Registrars meeting on Saturday.

Our main effort this season has been to start work on developing a Strategic Plan for MAHA. Our disabled sports program is also seeing renewed interest this season. We appointed two new co-directors in fall and they have been making contacts and helping to support some new programs we are trying to help get off the ground. It is exciting to see this new interest and experience how the hockey community can come together to support good efforts like these.

Lastly, unfortunately we have been seeing an increasing amount of inappropriate behavior at MAHA games over the past year. This behavior is unacceptable and we need to put an end to it. We will start planning for this year's audit in the near future. We appreciate everyone keeping their records and expenses current.

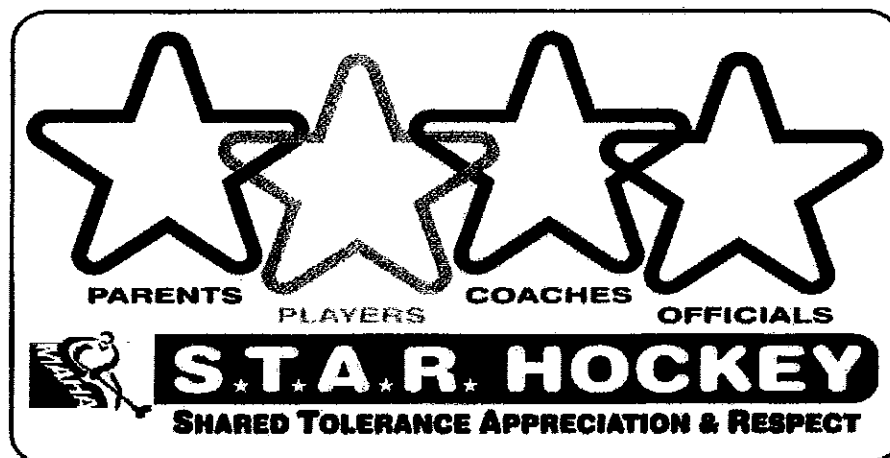

SAFESPORT

There were some reports sent in that did not fall under the SafeSport Guidelines. We are still working on a FAQ Guide and a Guide of Recommendations for suspensions as reports and fact findings come in. We have set up a spreadsheet to track all of the Safesport Complaints to compile a Guide form.

This year so far the number of Safesport Complaints is down from previous years so let's all hope this trend continues forward into the remaining of the regular playing season and beyond.

This Year we completed the transition and integration of the Back Ground Verification to the USA Hockey Registry. This integration has been somewhat of a challenge but is now in the past. Those that are cleared or passed will be indicated on the roster as Completed, and also on the Credential Form as well. The one remaining issue is to get everyone that files for the background check to use their proper given name. Too many use one form of their name to register with USA Hockey, then a different form of their name to register with the background check, and yet another to register with when doing their Safesport Training. All of these differences create a lot of searching and fixing to get the info into one file so it does transfer to the USA Registry.

USA Hockey is still working toward having the National Back Ground Screening done as far as I know, but until then the only thing left to fix would be the integration of the Referee Background with the Coaching Background when someone does both.

Vice President of Coaches 2016-17 Winter meeting Report

Collaborated in a ADM presentation for the Lapeer Hockey Association with Bob Mancini in September.

CEP:

Thanks to our Coaching Education Program Instructors for performing 50 plus Level 1,2 & 3 clinics this past late summer and Fall. I was a part of this, arranging 6 Clinics and presenting at 2 level 1's and 1 Level 3.

Our August Level 4 had the privilege of having speakers from the National Office (Dan Brennan), Finland (Ollie Savviko and Sami Nuutinen)

Coaching Directors:

At the Level 4 held in August, All Coaching Directors (District and Association), were invited to sit in on the presentations. During the Afternoon session a special meeting was held for the Coaching Directors to collaborate on common issues and to discuss the merits of the Coaching Directors program. Each Director was given a loaded flash drive pertinent to coaching. Each flash drive was loaded with: The windows of trainability, USA Hockey Coaching Resources, Coaching Director Power Point resources, Body Checking Videos and The Body Checking Power Point from 2011. District Coaching Directors were given quantities of these flash drives to take back to their home districts coaching clinics to give out to coaches who were attending clinics this year. A total of 1500 flash drives were dispersed.

MAHA District Coaching Directors held District meetings in each of their respective Districts with their Association Coaching Directors. Topics reviewed and cover were Age Appropriate Skill Development,, Safe-Sport, Lockerroom Policy, CEP , Age Appropriate Modules and MAHA rule changes.

Skills Development Director:

Kudos to Ron Hayes who did Skills Development session at the District 7 start up meeting and for the Battle Creek Hockey Association in September.

Try Hockey for Free.:

Currently MAHA has done 12 events. By the time of the Winter Meeting that number increases to 18 and round out the season with an additional 3 for a total of 21 events for the year. At the time of this report over 505 kids have participated in our sponsored events.

Thanks to those Associations that participated and the volunteerism they were able obtain from their ranks.

Coaching clinic Summary, Fall 2016

18 Level 1 Clinics
16 Level 2 Clinics
13 Level 3 Clinics
3 Level 4 Clinics

A good number of clinics were held in each MAHA District. No coaches were turned away due to capacity issues.

The final Level 4 Clinic was held at Michigan State University, Dec. 17 & 18. 60 coaches attended, in difficult weather conditions, from Michigan, Illinois, Wisconsin, and Ohio and South Dakota, while 8 were given refunds and temporary cards. At least one of these was in an auto accident trying to attend. We were happy to welcome President George Atkinson as a guest at this clinic.

We continue to find that late-fall clinics attract many coaches, while early season offerings are less popular. For example, Brian Bellgraph held a Level 1 clinic at Chelsea on December 18. 70 coaches attended in a room better suited for 50, but he got it done. Joe Spedowski scheduled Levels 1 and 2 on December 27 (!) with a turnout of 46 and 25 respectively.

A final note about clinics - this is the last year of the Coaching Clinic curriculum re-launch. Level 3 clinics were re-done this year to make them more participative or interactive, not just lecture. Staff feedback AND evaluations of the clinics have revealed that this new format is both effective, and a motivator for coaches who attend.

Other CEP Activities since the mid-Summer meeting...

Six CEP Staff members and two District Coaching Directors attended the USA Hockey National Coaching Symposium in St. Louis during August. Their participation will further enhance their ability to teach in local coaching clinics, and to relate the information they received to our coaches.

We hosted two Regional Managers from Finland, Sept. 1-10, as part of the two Level 4 clinics in September. They also worked with local associations in Kalamazoo, Lansing, and metro Detroit during the week. They were on-ice with teams and evaluating player development direction with our staff.

We have agreed on the speaker list and schedule for the Level 4 Clinic to be held March 31, and April 1, in Livonia, as part of the Women's World Championships. Speakers from Sweden, Finland, and the U.S. will present various topics Friday evening and Saturday. All speakers will be female leaders in hockey and player development. This will be the largest-scale and scope Level 4 clinic ever held in Michigan. A single-day option (Saturday only) may be made available for non U.S. coaches, with no certification offered, depending on the Level 4 enrollment. Schedule follows this report.

All coaches in Michigan have received at least two mailings from USA Hockey, under Jack's signature, reminding them of coaching opportunities and requirements. One mailing was first week of October, the other was the week before Thanksgiving.

Four Michigan coaches have completed Internships at the NTDP this fall. Three others are scheduled for January and March sessions.

D6 Coaching Director Report by Brian Bellgraph District Coaching Director and Andrew Hall Assoc. Coaching Director

Our District 6 ACD meeting was held in conjunction with our Annual Meeting in D6 in early August. All 19 of our associations were represented through three separate meetings throughout the Lower Peninsula. Most attended our August session at Walker Ice and Fitness, but a few did attend in Livonia at the D2/3 meeting and the remaining few attended in Gaylord.

Discussion centered on making the ACD group friendlier amongst associations. Try to create new ways to communicate and share information. To improve the overall product for our constituents. We plan to institute a group messenger system, but it is slow in happening. I am trying to spend some downtime exploring messenger services. Ideally, we are looking for a free, yet secure, option for our ACD's.

D8 Coaching Director Report by Mike Sands D8 Coaching Director

At the midway point of the 2016-17 season, I feel that District 8 of the Michigan Amateur Hockey Association is doing well. The games have started and from all accounts, the kids are having fun.

As you are well aware, this is a busy time for our Coaches. Between their normal coaching duties, scheduling/playing games and ensuring that they are up to date on their coaching requirements, their plates are full. We are very fortunate to have these good people willing to give their time and energy to the kids of our Junior Hockey Associations.

We held our District CDDP meeting in Marquette on Saturday, October 1st and the attendance was average with about half of our Associations sending representation. Since that meeting, the materials provided have been disbursed to those Associations who were not there. I have gotten positive reviews on that material, especially the thumb drive and the Skill Progression Booklet. In my Association, we have referred to that Skills Progression Booklet several times when meeting with parents and discussing their child's progress.

Michigan had 17 different locations host an event for this weekend October 7-9, 2016 in an effort to promote girls hockey and get more female skaters involved in the game. On November 12th Michigan had 43 sites host an event for the USA Hockey Try Hockey For Free day. There were 1059 new skaters that signed up for this among the 43 host sites.

Michigan will be sending a girl's high school team to the Minnesota Showcase again this year. Head Coach Mike Kaput has once again agreed to take this team in April. Tryout dates, times and location are on the MAHA.org web site.

USA Hockey national player development camp tryouts will be held in Novi this year April 21-23, 2017. All female players born in 2003- 2000 are welcome to attend.

Registration is available online at MAHA.org. Players must register on the MAHA web site and the cost is \$85.00. National camp dates and location are as follows:

Girls 18U Select Camp- Biddeford, MN June 24-30

Girls 18U- St. Cloud, MN July 9-15

Girls 15- St. Cloud, MN July 18-24

MidAM multi district summer camp will once again be held at Kent State Ohio. This will be by invitation only for the players that did not get selected to attend national camp and are the next level of players based on their rankings at the Michigan tryouts. Michigan will be having a regional goalie camp in Farmington Hills, August 25-27, 2017. Invitations will be sent out to those goalies that have been selected to attend.

USA Hockey fall meeting was held in Plymouth, MI September 15-17 at the new USA Hockey Arena. The winter meeting will be held January 12-15, 2017 in Orlando, FL. A continued emphasis of the girls/women's section is growth and retention of female players as well as defining Tier I hockey.. Encouraging grow the game events like Try Hockey For Free and the IIHF Women's World's events are great ways to expose new females to the game.

USA Hockey hosted a free girl's clinic at the USA Hockey Arena in Plymouth, December 13th during the USA Women's winter training camp. There were 80 girls that participated in this free clinic run by Kristen Wright. Members of the US women's national team and local association coaches helped on the ice for this event. Michigan players ShiannDarkangelo and Megan Keller joined the girls during this clinic. The USA Hockey Arena also hosted Team USA vs Team Canada December 17th. Michigan players and associations were represented during the pre-game ceremonies as well as during the intermission. The first intermission featured 8u players in a cross ice game and the second intermission was a 10U intra-squad game Little Caesars vs Ann Arbor. This was a fun night with many MAHA associations being represented at the game.

OneGoal Committee Report MAHA Winter Meeting - January 2017

The MAHA OneGoal Committee received thirty-six grant applications in 2016 with thirty-three approved for funding and approximately \$50,000 allocated for distribution to associations to help fund initiatives geared toward getting more players participating in hockey. The applications that were not approved for funding were received after the deadline or did not meet the criteria.

The funding has been used for marketing and advertising efforts to attract new players to hockey as well as for equipment sets, sticks and replacement helmets for OneGoal sets for players to use to help lessen the initial costs of getting started in the game. Additionally this season, funding has been approved for use for Quick Change goalie equipment, which has not yet been received at the time of this report.

The MAHA OneGoal Committee would like to acknowledge and thank Perani's Hockey World for organizing and shipping the equipment sets, helmets and sticks resulting in significant savings on shipping costs so more of the grant funding could be used for equipment.

To date over 215 equipment sets, 195 sticks and 45 helmets have been distributed to associations this season.

DISABLED HOCKEY REPORT

Blind Hockey

We attended the Blind Hockey Summit in Chicago in October and subsequently held meetings upon return. The Michigan Blind Sports Commission is working with us to host 1-2 Try Hockey For Free events (one in the Detroit area and one in either Grand Rapids or Kalamazoo areas.) So far we have 48 people signed up indicating interest. Our goal is to take three individuals to San Jose (one of our Michigan athletes who competed at the Summit is a United States Silver Medal ParaOlympian in Goal Ball). There will be an event held during the Western Michigan University Blind Sports Camp in May.

Sled Hockey

All of our current Sled Hockey teams are going strong – the Grand Rapids Sled Wings program is a solid part of the Grand Rapids Griffins Youth Foundation and have a very close working relationship with Mary Free Bed Hospital, hosting several fundraising events as well as outreach events throughout the state. The Try Hockey For Free event in Marquette in December saw over 50 skaters on the ice at various points during the day, 22 of which were potential athletes. The community is extremely excited and steps are being taken to get a program started, with support from a local disability support organization. There was extensive media coverage before and during the event. We are waiting confirmation on the Sled Lending Program availability to host events in D2, D3 and D4 this spring, which appear to be the last weekend in April. Flint continues to host THFF events monthly and will be moving to apply for grants and funding to start a team in the Fall.

Special Hockey

The West Michigan Special Hockey Association continues to grow, with nearly 50 skaters in this, their third year. They will be hosting their annual Jersey Day in January to welcome new players to the team, as well as work with the local media to continue to get the word out about their program. They are currently operating at no cost to their families, however they do ask the families pay the USA Hockey registration fees if possible. There is a physician in D2 who is interested in a possible special hockey program. No details available yet, however.

Warrior Hockey

The Michigan Warrior program continues to grow in the metro Detroit/Ann Arbor areas, with plans to expand to possibly Grand Rapids, Saginaw and/or Traverse City. At the 2016 Disabled Hockey Festival, they were the National Runners-Up and are very much in contention to win this year. They participate in 3-4 games per month with local teams, various organizations for fundraising opportunities. Their goal is to add at least one team by the beginning of the 2017-2018 season.

Disabled Festival

The Michigan Warriors were the runners-up for the National Championship last year and are taking at least one, if not two teams to San Jose for Disabled Hockey Festival in April. They are actively fundraising in order to make this happen, as they are easily one of the top teams again this year. West Michigan Special Hockey is sending 3-4 players out and will roster on different teams. They are unable to send a full team due to the cost of travel to the west coast. We are in the process of identifying three blind hockey players from Michigan that we want to send. The Grand Rapids Sled Wings are sending both a junior and a senior team, hoping to bring home another national title. As of now, there is not a confirmed location for the 2018 Disabled Hockey Festival and have let it be known that we would love to be considered again.

2016-2017 Mid-Season Risk Manager Report

January 1, 2017

Reminders for all Associations, Leagues, and Teams:

Be sure all of your teams and the teams you are playing are properly registered and sanctioned by USA Hockey. For the USA Hockey insurance packages to be in effect, your team, as well as teams you are playing must be properly registered and sanctioned by a USA Hockey Associate Registrar. Also, Tournaments you are playing in must be sanctioned by USA Hockey and MAHA. If you have any questions about a team or tournament, please contact your area Associate USA Hockey Registrar. **This is extremely important to assure your team is covered.**

Ice Contracts and Contracts in general: Please have all contracts reviewed **before** you sign them for your team, league, or association. You need to make sure that the indemnification agreement and other liability related portions of the contract are reciprocal in nature. This basically means if there is negligence on the hockey side, we are responsible and if there is negligence on the other side, they are responsible. You should have your legal advisor review all contracts **before** signatures are affixed. If you need further information or assistance, please contact me.

Certificates of Insurance Requests: Ice arenas or other venues you deal with may for Additional Insurance status as part of their contract obligations. Request forms can be located on the MAHA or USA Hockey web sites. You can also contact me and I will email you a form. Completion of the form and a copy of your contract will be required before I can issue a certificate of insurance.

Accident Claim Forms: Claim forms for our excess medical provider are available from your local association, league, or team registrar. The form is in their USA Hockey Registration Program; **USAH Registration Portal web site** provided by USA Hockey and can be printed for you (complete with instructions). If you are unable to contact your local registrar, please contact me and I will assist you.

Legal Papers: If you or your team is served with any legal papers, please contact me immediately. I will notify our insurance carrier and get a claim open immediately. **DO NOT WAIT. CALL NOW.** This includes Liability Claims, D & O Claims, and Crime Claims. For more information, please contact me.

Embezzlement of Funds: Along with the economic downturn, USA Hockey has experienced an upturn in embezzlement of funds from Local associations, teams, and leagues. Your board should review your financial procedures and the safeguards you have in place to spot potential problems. Your local accountant is a good resource for information on upgrading your financial procedures.



Youth & Girls Locker Rooms: USA Hockey has experienced incidents involving locker rooms and youth & girls hockey teams. Your Association, Team, or League needs to make sure locker rooms are monitored from the time they are occupied until the last player leaves. **Two** responsible adults should be present in the locker room at all times for the safety of your players and your staff. See USA Hockey's Locker Room Policy which needs to be followed by all of us.

Special Sanction for an ON-ICE Event: For a **Special Sanction for an on-ice event** you will need to contact the USA Hockey Michigan Registrar.

Special Sanction for an OFF-ICE Event: For a **Special Sanction for an off-ice event** you will need to contact me. For more information, please contact me regarding a special sanction and I will assist you.

I would like to take this time to thank the Associate Risk Managers and the MAHA Board of Directors for their continued support and assistance during the hockey season.

MAHA LEGAL REPORT – WINTER MEETING 2017

Thus far, the most common issue relating to the Districts involve assisting the various District Chairs and local associations in disciplinary matters and hearings. At the USA Hockey Annual Meeting in June, 2016, USA Hockey amended Bylaw 10 and addressed the applicability of Bylaw 10 to financial disputes and the process required of the Affiliates. We are in the final stages of review for a MAHA policy to address financial disputes to assist local associations in their collection efforts. We also expect to finalize the Affiliate Agreement for local associations and adult leagues early in 2017 for use in the 2017-2018 season.

There are no pending legal proceedings as of this date.

2015-16 FINAL SEASON REPORT

The final registration report for the 2015-16 season showed a total Players, Coaches, and Officials of 57,029 in Michigan. Again this year 99% of all members registered online. Online registration opened for the 2016-17 on April 1, 2016. Membership for all participants is through August 31st of the current playing season for which they are registering. The playing season dates are Sept 1 through Aug 31. Membership for new members is effective from the date of registration with full benefits, including insurance, when participating with a member program. The benefit of this expanded registration period is that all new participants can complete registration for a member program as early as April 1 without having to register again on September 1 of the same year. Renewing members are able to register as early as April 1 for the following September 1 season, easing administration for our local programs. Local programs instruct their members when to register for the upcoming season.

2016-17 REGISTRATION UPDATE

Registration for the current season is still ongoing and a report of Players by Age for Association will be available at the meeting.

We have completed the third season using the USAH Registry for all member programs to manage their registration data and create their Official USA Hockey forms. The Registry is a web-based application available through the USA Hockey Portal. It can be accessed by our member program through any computer, tablet, or mobile device or phone that has an internet connection. Rosters are transmitted and approved online. Approved Rosters are sent to programs to view on screen, print out and with a link to the Roster so that a coach or team manager can easily access them electronically.

We are always working on and making changes to the Admin tool and the Registry portal, and if anyone has suggestions or issues they can be made through either program by submitting a ticket or to me.
