Dave Flint has been the Head Coach at Division 1 Northeastern University for 10 years. Prior to NU Dave lead the St. Anselm College D III program for 5 years. Flint has coached NU to two Women's Beanpot titles (2012, 2013), the Hockey East regular season championship (2012), NCAA tournament appearances (2016, 2018), and garnered Hockey East

Co-Coach of the Year and All-New England Coach of the Year accolades in 2012. Since 2008, Flint has developed two Patty Kazmaier top-three finalists (Coyne and Schelling), two AHCA All-Americans (Coyne and Schelling), and three Olympians (Coyne, Schelling and Julia Marty).

Since 2005, Flint has also been a member of the USA Hockey staff. In 2008, he was appointed the goaltending coach and advisor for the women's national program, where he evaluated and instructed goaltenders at all levels. He was on staff for the U.S. National Team that won the silver medal at the 2010 Olympic Games in Vancouver, Canada, as well as the gold-medal winning team at the 2008 World Championship in Harbin, China.
