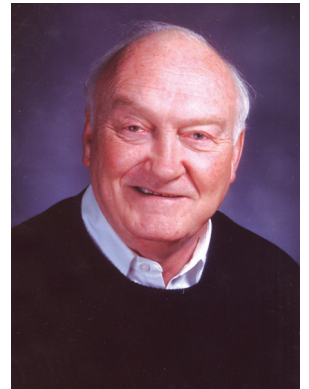

This allows your school to sign up 15 coaches, men and women coaches together and you can sign up your athletic director for free for a total of \$160. I can't imagine any school or college passing up this offer. Also, lifetime membership remains \$100, but remember, if you're retired and go back into coaching you need an individual membership for the years you remain out of retirement.

THE MISSING C IN OFFICIATING

Perhaps more than any other sport, basketball gives its officials the power to shape the tone and the tenor of a game. This seems especially true in key matchups during the regular season and into the post season, where a powder keg of emotions can explode on any possession.

Coaches and players often complain about a lack of consistency, an unevenness in the application of the rules, and a lack of coordination and communication among officials. Quite often, teams are required to adjust their style of play numerous times during the season with crews of officials calling the game with an inconsistent application of the rules and a lack of common sense. That leads to a high level of frustration from coaches, players and fans.

Consistency is undoubtedly the favorite catchphrase of coaches at all levels. It is also the most common complaint leveled at referees by players, fans, observers, and by other officials. In order for officiating to be a rewarding experience, we have the duty to ourselves and to others to strive for total consistency in the application of the rules, interpretations and points of emphasis.

Young officials seem to have more difficulty with consistency than any other quality, mainly because they lack the experience to realize when their decisions are consistent. Everyone has some difficulty in this area, but the great officials are unrelenting in their judgment. They see and call a game better than their colleagues by making the same call on the same kind of play in the first minute of the game, or when the score is tied with 1 minute remaining in the game.

Players, coaches, and spectators know exactly what to expect because of reliability and consistency throughout the game. Good officials make sure that their interpretations and decisions make absolute sense in each situation understanding both the spirit and the intent of the rules. That stability comes from a clear state of mind in a game often filled with heightened situational awareness.

As you prepare for the 2017-18 season, make crew consistency a point of emphasis in your Basketball Association meetings and in your pre-game discussions. Then, as you de-brief after the game, be completely honest with your partners as you grade your performance in an effort to look for areas of improvement in your level of consistency.

2017 WRAP UP

I want to thank everyone for their efforts in 2017 in making these All Star Games that very best in the 35 years of their existence. Over the years, I write this article about the scores of the girl's games. This year I want to talk more about the good that this year's players did for the MACC fund. The players both boys and girls went out and raised the most money we have ever raised in All Star history. We are over \$430, 000 raised. The WBCA donation to the MACC fund will be substantial and will go toward helping hundreds of children in the state, throughout the country, and possibly the world. Cancer research does not just stay within the state of Wisconsin. There are so many networks within the cancer research organization that help children everywhere. Money spent in Madison and Milwaukee is used to develop new medicine and treatment, which is used worldwide.

The players heard from cancer patients while at the Dells. Hearing from a peer is much more meaningful for the players. They have to relate to one of their own regarding what their life has been during their battles with this dreaded disease. While the players have been honing their basketball skills, these kids have been fighting for their lives. We are very fortunate to have them here to speak to our All Stars. They are here because of the players in the past that went out to raise money for the MACC fund. The impact of this year's players will benefit cancer patients for many years into the future.

In my 32 years of involvement with the All Star Games I have really seen the focus of the games change. The players are all great and will continue to be great people. The real focus of the games, however, is on the kids with cancer. Many players come up to us after their games on Friday and Saturday and wish they would have done more to help in the fund raising. We remind them that the fund raising does not stop with the end of the games. The MACC fund is hosting events all year and that they can continue to support the MACC fund in many more ways than the WBCA all star games. Players, do not lose sight of the big picture. In 1976 the cure rate was about 20% and currently we are up to about an 80% cure rate. We have come a long way, but have a ways to go in our efforts to get that cure rate at 100%.

Thank you from everyone at the WBCA and the MACC fund for your efforts and your continue support of this worthwhile cause.
