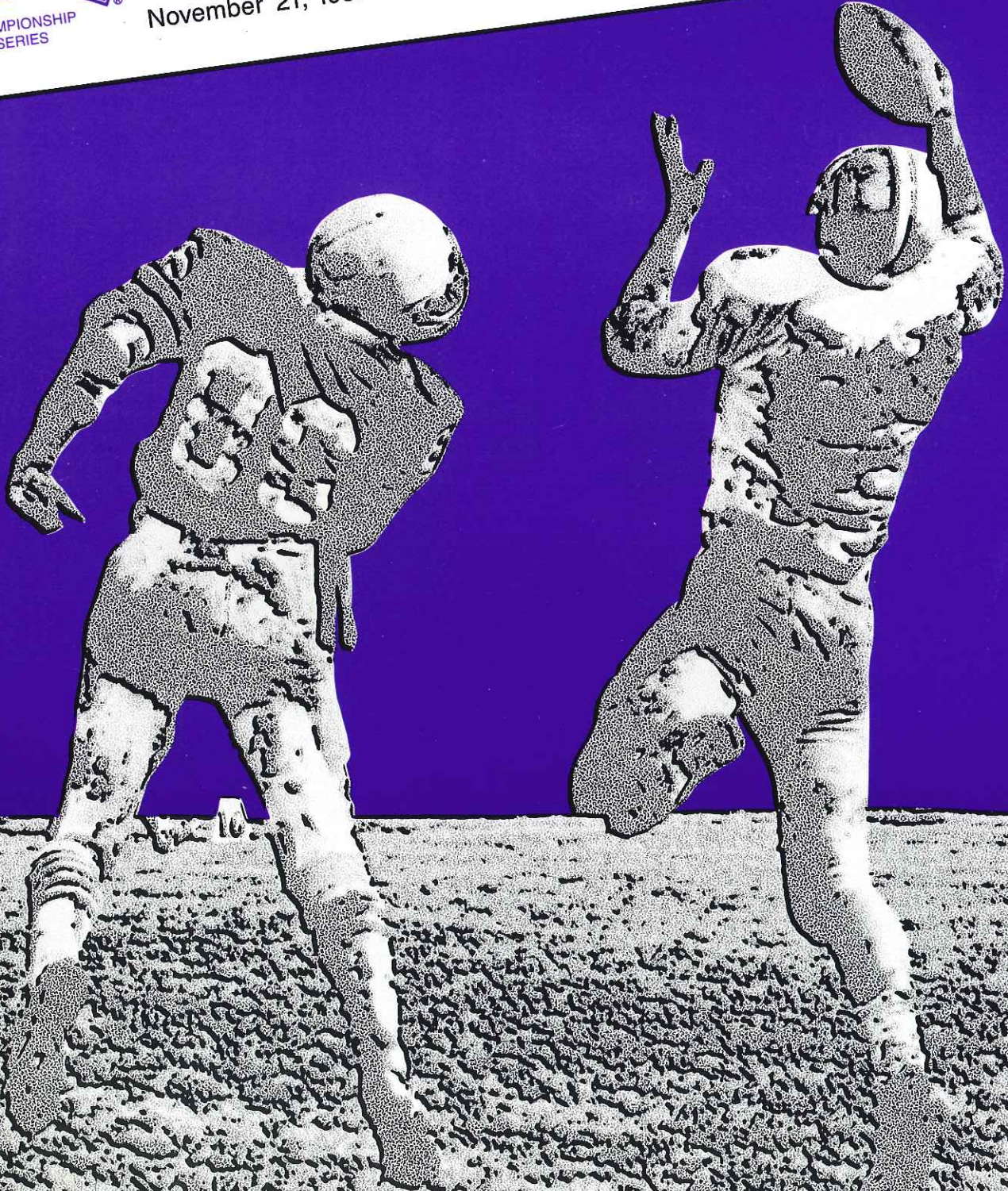

The National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA) is a completely autonomous association, currently administering programs of intercollegiate athletics to 481 fully-accredited colleges and universities of moderate enrollment. The fundamental tenet of the NAIA is that intercollegiate athletics is an integral part of the total educational program of the institution, subject to the same aims and policies, and controlled by those responsible for the administration of all programs of the institution.

The NAIA roots grew out of a basketball organization into an important multi-sport association which now conducts 22 national championship events for men and women. Football was added as a championship event in 1956 with a single bowl game to crown a national champion. In 1958 the program was expanded to a four-team playoff format which remained through the 1977 season, and during that period the association split into two divisions beginning in 1970. An eight-team format was approved and implemented from 1978-86.

Over the years, the NAIA has produced some of the great names in professional football. Prominent players of the past have included Buck Buchanan (Grambling LA), Jack Kemp (Occidental CA) and Lyle Alzado (Yankton SD). Current standouts in the National Football League with NAIA roots include Walter Payton (Jackson State MS), Roy Green (Henderson State AR) and Mark Gastineau (East Central OK).

ASSOCIATION EXPANDS TO 16-TEAM FOOTBALL SERIES

Upon a recommendation of the NAIA-Football Coaches Association last January, the NAIA National Executive Committee approved the expansion of the national championship playoffs to 16 teams in each division beginning with the 1987 season. This new format also includes provisions for automatic berths to champions of certified conferences.

Selection of teams for postseason play is determined by national ratings in each division, compiled by a weekly balloting of the national rating committees. Members of these committees are appointed from the NAIA-Football Coaches Association. Teams must be in the top 25 of the final regular season poll to be eligible for selection to the playoffs. Teams are not seeded or bracketed in the playoffs. Site selections and pairings are determined by many factors including geographical location of the teams, final regular season rankings and important financial considerations. All institutions have an opportunity to submit a bid to host one or more games in the championship series.

SPECIAL TIE-BREAK PLAN USED TO DECIDE GAMES

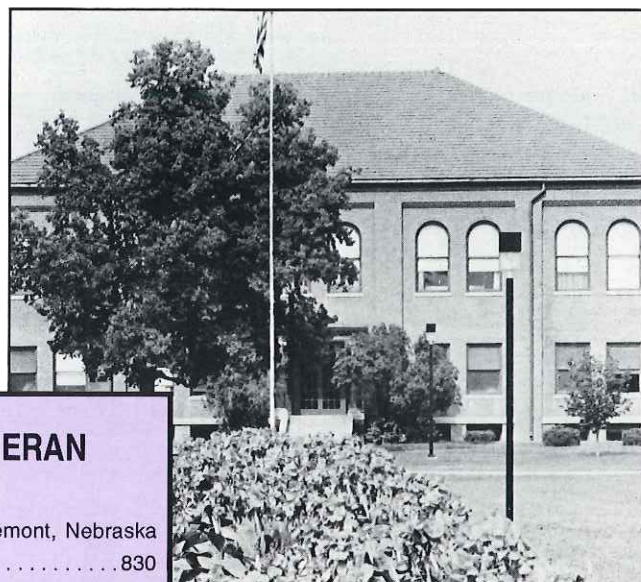
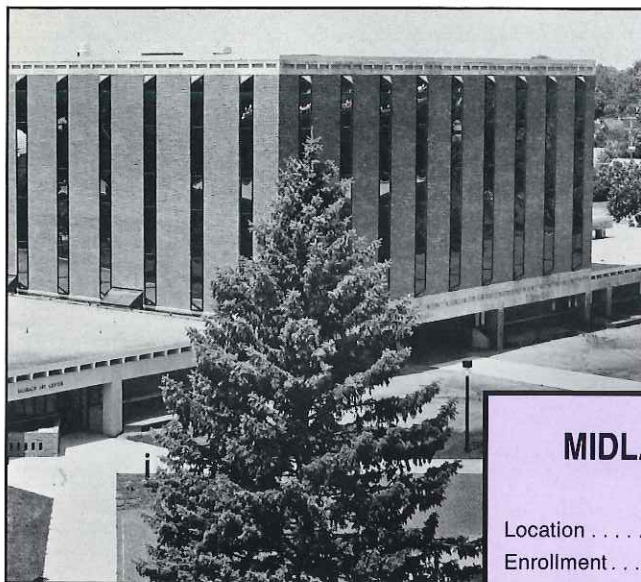
If a game is tied after the end of regulation play in first round, quarterfinal or semifinal contests, the NAIA will utilize a special tie-break plan as approved by the Football Coaches Association.

Immediately following the conclusion of the fourth quarter, the referee will select one goal toward which the overtime periods will be played and stage a coin toss at midfield with the captains. The winner of the toss will have the option of selecting offense or defense for the first possession of the overtime. The ball will be placed at the 25-yard line for the beginning of each series, and the offensive team shall have possession of the ball until it has scored or failed to gain a first and 10 by either running out of downs or losing possession. The team scoring the greater number of points after an equal number of possessions shall be declared the winner.

Ties in the championship game are not broken and both teams are declared co-champions.

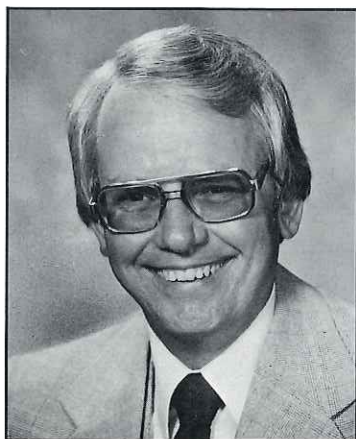
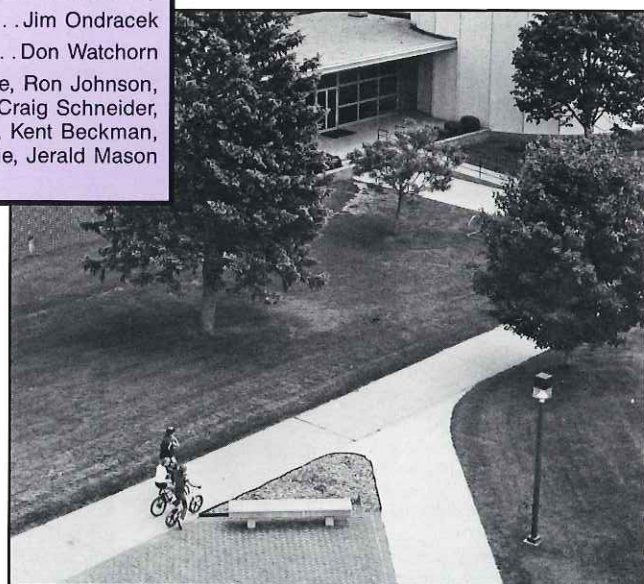
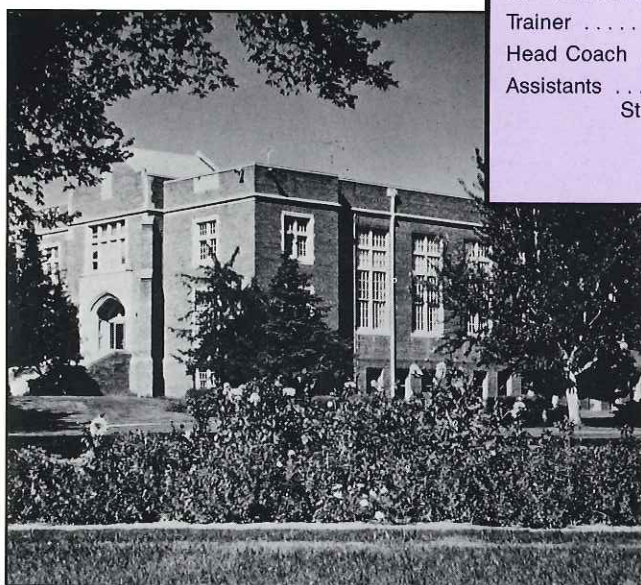
