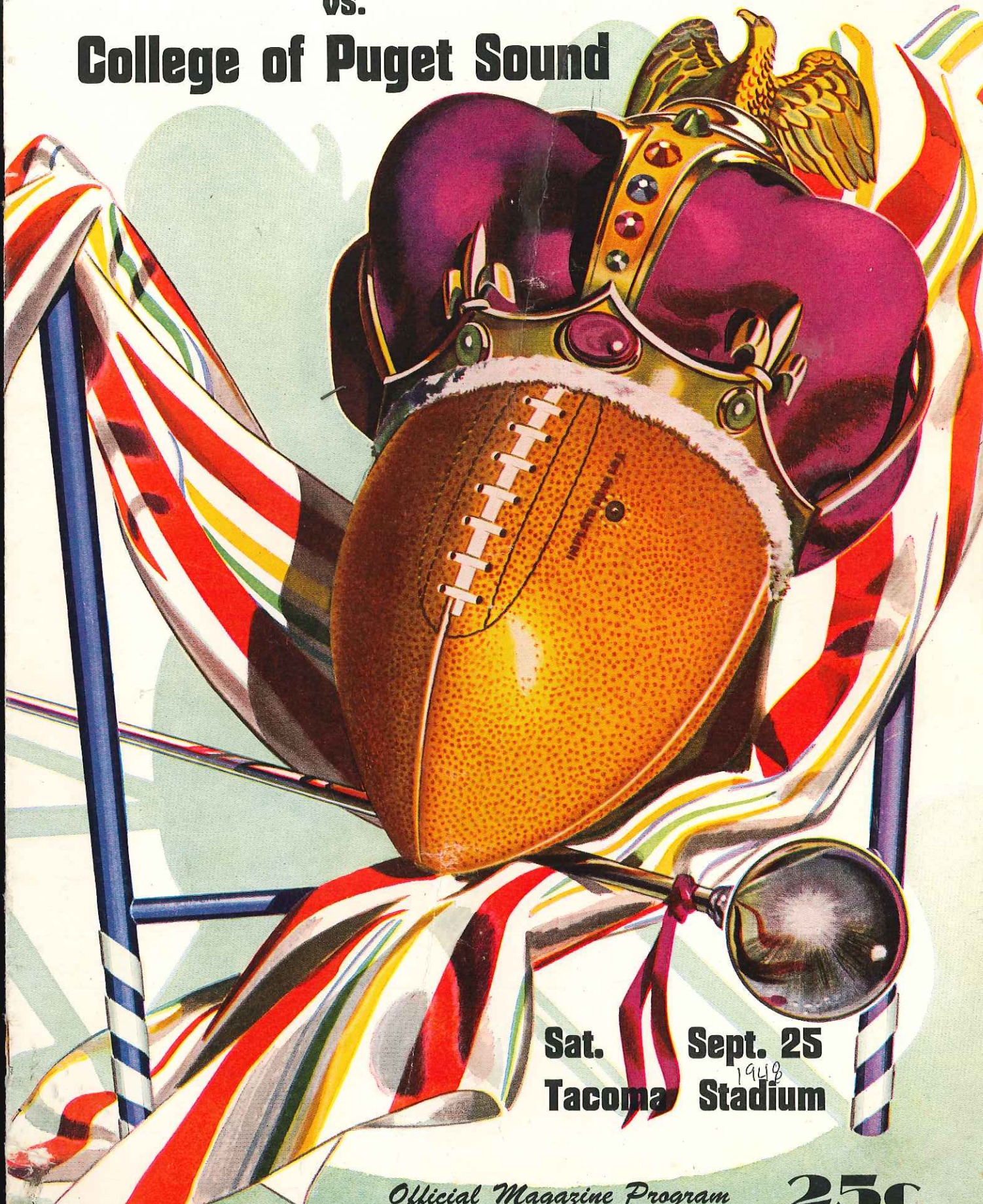

## Crosstown Rivals

Tonight, Pacific Lutheran and the College of Puget Sound pry off the lid opening the '48 collegiate football season in Tacoma.

The Gladiators are out to make it three straight over their north end rivals, and the Loggers are out to stop the victory skein.

Instead of one meeting per season, as they have done in the past, the two teams will play twice this year. Tonight's game is a King's-X battle. The November 19 game will be the Totem Pole game and also will count in the Evergreen Conference standings.

But both teams are out to win tonight. They don't care whether it counts in the standings or not.

This fall the two schools are in the same conference for the first time. CPS pulled out of the Northwest League and joined the Evergreen Conference, which is made up of the six teams who comprised the Winco loop, plus CPS and the University of British Columbia. UBC entered the new loop after the grid schedules had been drawn up, so they will not compete in that sport until 1949.

Having the two local colleges in the same league will add more flavor to the local rivalry, and also assures local grid fans a lot of top-notch football entertainment. The new league will be the strongest college loop in the Pacific Northwest.

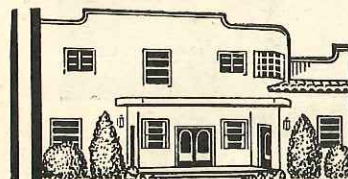

# PLC's Sophomore Coaches

Now entering their sophomore year as collegiate coaches, Marv Tommervik and Marv Harshman are on the spot this fall. Last year they guided their Lutes through an undefeated season, winning 7 and tying 2.

Every team on their schedule this fall will be laying for the Lutherans. St. Olaf tried to break the unbeaten skein last week, but the Parklanders emerged on top, 14 to 6. PLC supporters hope the Lutes can do it again tonight.

In '47, Pacific Lutheran was co-champion of the Winco loop with Eastern. The Gladiators and Savages tied in their game, 7 to 7.

But the Lute bosses didn't rest on their laurels when the moleskins were put away in mothballs. Marv Harshman guided his basketball charges to the title, and Marv Tommervik, not to be outdone, did the same in baseball. Harshman's track men, not given much chance in the early season, swept the second spot in the conference meet. So in their first year of coaching the Marvs took three titles and a second in the four major sports.

The Marvs are a pair of football-wise gentlemen. Their teams are well coached and know what they are doing on the field. During their collegiate playing days, the Marvs never gave up. They had lots of spirit and fight. They have breathed that same spirit into their players. PLC fights. The Marvs are good sportsmen and cheerful, likeable personalities. Their men like them and go all out for them.

Assisting the Marvs in their coaching chores this season are three of the pillars of last year's line—Don D'Andrea, Little All-American center; Eldon Kylo, All-Winco tackle; and Elmer Peterson, All-Winco guard.

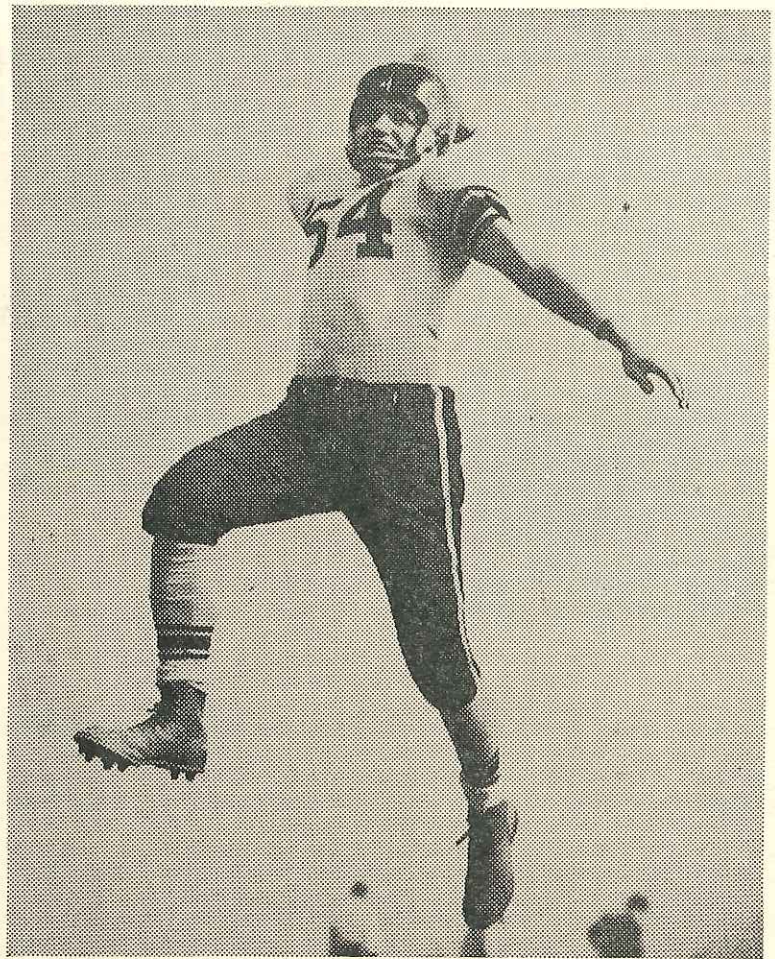

## *Lutes: 1948 Edition*

Led by Captain Jack Guyot, a veteran football-wise P.L.C. eleven will trot out on the field to do battle with the College of Puget Sound Loggers. However, only five of them were regular starters on last year's undefeated club.

Guyot, a rugged, hard-running veteran of two years in college ball, is the fullback. Jack scored 54 points last season and bulled his way for 694 yards from scrimmage in 144 attempts last fall. He continued this fall where he left off, plunging for one of PLC's two touchdowns against St. Olaf last Saturday.



GENE STRANDNESS

The halfbacks are Gene Strandness and Blaine McKanna, both playing their third year for the Lutherans. Strandness passes and runs like a demon, and McKanna is a dream at snagging passes. In the quarterback slot is John Jurkovich, a sophomore. John does the punting and is also adept at passing.

D'Andrea, Kylo and Peterson are missing in the line, so the forward wall is considerably lighter this year. The ends are Bob Andrew and Vern Morris, a couple of powerful wingmen. Andrew is playing his third year on the flanks for the Lutes. This is Morris's first year, but he played for the University of Washington "B" team in '46.

In the tackle posts are a pair of rugged lads, Jack Proud and Carl "Bud" Hatley. Proud is in his third season for the Lutes, and Hatley, switched from end where he played last year, is a second year man.

Jack Carbone and Rick Daniels are manning the guard slots. Carbone, the tough ex-Clover Parker,

is with the Gladiators for his third season. Rick is a sophomore who is as rough as they come.

Lute coaches were worried about replacing Don D'Andrea at center, but Steinar Gorud played a whale of a game against St. Olaf. Gorud is also playing his third season at Luteville.

Coaches Tommervik and Harshman substitute freely, so there are others who will see plenty of action tonight. Outstanding reserve backs include Wayne Brock and Doane Blair at left half, Lowell Knutson and Harold Malnes at right half, Norm Sturm at fullback, Bob Brass and Ted Kauth at quarterback.

Roy Hagen, junior guard from Auburn, is one of the mainstays in the line, but will see little or no action tonight because of a bad knee. Dick Olsen and Elwood Furseth will play a lot at guard, as will tackles Bob Macready and Jack Justice. Ends Bob Dinsmore, Hal Schrupp and Ben Hanson will play a lot of ball; and center Bob Corcoran will spell off Gorud.

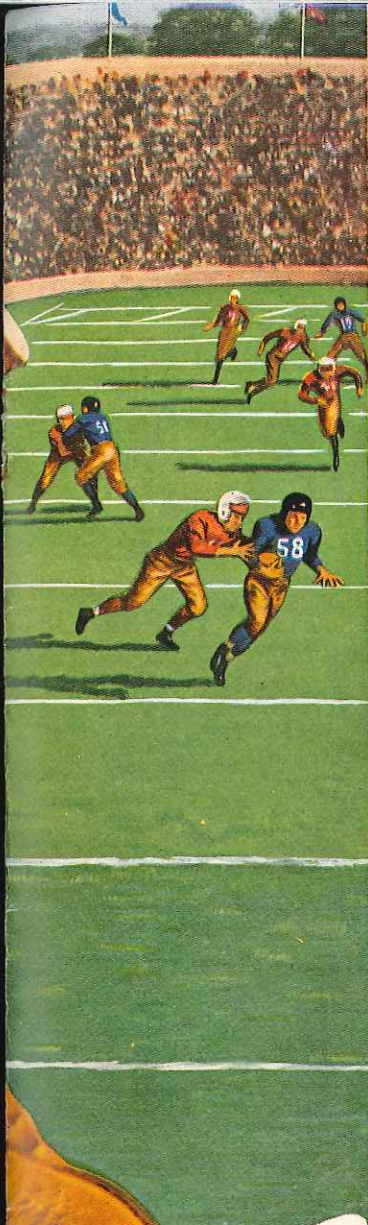

Harry Mansfield, ex-Stadium, playing his third year for the Loggers, is the key man in the CPS attack. Quarterback Harry handles the ball off the "T" formation, and also does a lot of the kicking and passing.

Bob Robbins at fullback is playing his third year for the north enders. He's a big fellow and hits hard.

Burt Ross, sophomore who played at Vaughn high, is the right half. Left half will be filled by Len Kalapus, powerful runner who played on the Washington State frosh club last year. He is a Lincoln high grad.

The big husky line will have veteran Verne Martineau in the pivot post. Playing his third season, the big boy missed last year's crosstown clash because of injuries. Logger guards are a pair of lads who pack lots of beef. They are Warren Wood, who played fullback last year, and Dick Hermson, playing his third season.

A pair of rangy boys man the tackle slots. They are Bill Kowalski, ex-Stadium and Logger sophomore; and Hank Pond, a transfer from Wake Forest.

The men on the wings are Dick Greenwood, who was a regular last season; and Dick Brown, big ex-Stadium who transferred from Washington State in mid-year.

Reserve linemen who will be in there tonight include Ingvald Thompson, letterman end who transferred from WSC; Bob Bulleri, another ex-Cougar who tips the beams at a mere 273 and plays center; Ed Annas, freshman end from Enumclaw; and Harvey deCarteret, letterman guard who also played some ball at WSC.

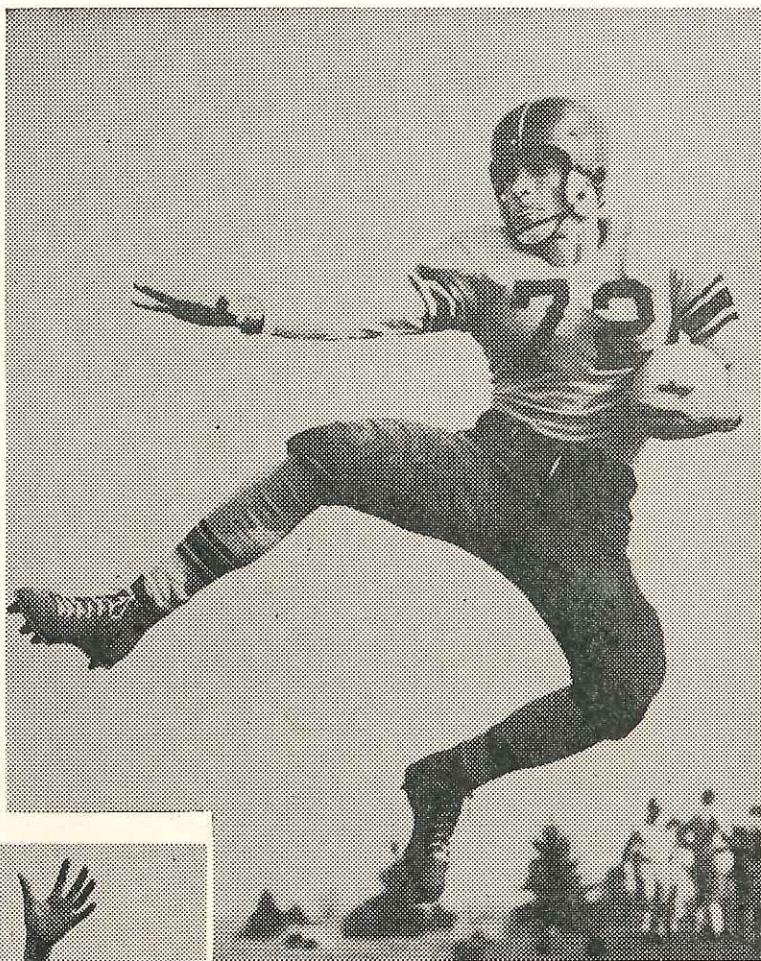
## Speedy Mac

Blaine McKanna is the fleetest half-back on the Lute eleven. He just seems to coast along when viewed from the stands, but he constantly out-maneuvers defensive backs when he goes down under passes.

Mac is light. He weighs a mere 160. But he knows how to use that weight. Seldom does he miss on a blocking assignment.

Modesty is one of his great virtues. When he makes a brilliant open field run, he tells his teammates, "beautiful blocking." He never takes the glory, but lauds his fellow players for what they do. He is a clean cut chap, well liked by all fellows on the squad.

A junior this year, Mac hails from Longview. He played prep ball for R. A. Long high before the war. After a tour of duty in the army, he entered PLC.



## Big John

Punter and passer de luxe for the Lutes is this 206-pound bruiser from Anacortes, John Jurkovich. Playing in the quarterback spot this fall, John has fit into the post like a duck to water, and has become very adept in running interference. He's a whirlwind on defense, too, hitting opposing ball carriers like a ton of bricks.

Jurkovich is a sophomore and last season was one of the finest freshman backs in the conference. Great things are expected from this six-foot powerhouse this year.

He is a quiet, unassuming fellow on the campus. But he's like a bull in a china shop on the gridiron. He spends his summers fishing salmon in Puget Sound waters. In addition to his football prowess, he does well on the basketball court. He was a regular guard last season.

## New Logger Mentor

Coach John Heinrick, College of Puget Sound head mentor, is fielding his first college football team tonight.

However, the jovial Irishman is no newcomer to collegiate athletics. For the past three years he has been the basketball coach at the north end college.

Heinrick has been associated with college football for many years, as an official. He has umpired for the Pacific Coast Conference, the Winco league and the Northwest Conference.

During his college days he played football for Central Washington (Ellensburg Normal, then) and the U. of Washington.

He began his coaching career at St. Leo's high in Tacoma, and then moved up to Bellarmine high. From there he went to Stadium high, Tacoma, where he coached football for 12 years.

Heinrick coached teams are always fighting teams, well drilled in fundamentals. His team tonight will be no exception.

Surrounding Heinrick on the Logger coaching staff are a pair of capable assistants. They are Rod Giske and Jim Mahnke.

Giske, who coaches the line, was a great lineman for the Washington State College Cougars during his playing days.

Mahnke comes to CPS this fall from Yelm, where he coached in high school for three years.

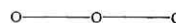
