- AAHA Admin Report – Submitted Electronically. **Thank you to all the associations who sent volunteers for the Coyotes 50/50 raffle. It was a successful night. Darla, district registrar, requires hardcopies of all documents (no electronic copies). AAHA parent concussion acknowledgement forms should also be included in the binder. Shooting to have all credentialing complete by Feb 1st. Tim reminded everyone to ensure that their association parents are having a physician complete the return to play approval form for any player that has had a concussion. That form should be emailed as outlined at the bottom of the form.**

## **New Business**

- Arizona Hockey Referees Association (formerly AHOA) officials no-show policy **Tim suggested establishment of a small AAHA committee to meet with the AHRA representatives and work together to bring back suggestions to the Board. The appointed committee (Mims, Edwards, Shtrom, and Jacobson) will get feedback from the AAHA member associations and meet with Chris Zorza et al within the next 30 days.**
- Out-of-state squirt rosters containing mite-aged players - President's Day Tournament – **When asked by AHU for feedback on out-of-state 8U-aged players rostering on 10U teams, the EC ruled that 8U should not be allowed to play on older teams for tournaments within Arizona (based upon the policies established by AAHA with respect to this issue). However, given that this was not explicitly outlined in the upcoming President's Day tournament rules (that were approved by our state when granting the USAH sanction) and there are 8U families (playing on 10U teams) that had already made travel plans; it was decided that the EC ruling would not be enforced for this tournament.**

**An official Motion: Urban with 2<sup>nd</sup>: Shtrom was made to allow for 8U players from out-of-state teams to play on 10U rosters for the upcoming Arizona tournaments. Approved 16-0-0. At the request of the EC, the policy committee will propose a written policy regarding this matter for Board consideration at the upcoming February meeting.**

- Mite Committee Recommendations (see mite report) **As previously stated, the mite committee will meet and propose policy changes for Board consideration.**






















## PRESIDENTS REPORT FOR JANUARY 2018

**A.** There has been some question about the application of the eligibility rule for players that play junior games after December 31<sup>st</sup> and those player's eligibility to play on a Tier I or II youth team. The question arises because some junior teams are outside of USA Hockey. The rule addressing eligibility is on page 136 of the Annual Guide Section D.

Subject to an exception for players playing games for a Tier I or II Junior team pursuant to the Youth/Junior Affiliated Player Policy, the rule says that if a player on a youth Tier I or II team plays any games on a Junior roster after 12/31, then the player loses all eligibility on his/her youth or girls'/women's team for the remainder of the season. USA Hockey's Guidelines Regarding Non-Sanctioned Play (beginning on page 41 of Annual Guide, see paragraph J) provides that this rule applies regardless of whether the player plays on a junior team inside or outside of USAH. Teams outside of USA Hockey are not part of the Youth/Junior Affiliated Player Policy, so that exception would not apply to players from those teams. The above is consistent with how the rule has been applied in past, and the rule and the guidelines have both been approved by USA Hockey's Board of Directors.

**B.** There also has been some question within our Arizona Affiliate in regard to number of games for eligibility for Districts and Nationals. Each team must have competed as a team unit in at least (20) games, each player must have played in at least (10) games during the season. For games to count in meeting these requirements that team's player roster form(1-T) must be certified by the AAHA Registrar.

If a player is removed from his original team's (1-T) roster (Team A), and is added to a second team's (1-T) roster (Team B), and then is removed from the (1-T) roster of (Team B) and added back to the (1-T) roster of (Team A) his game count for Team A does not change for his eligibility for Districts and Nationals.

Example:

Joe Smith plays 6 games for Team A (Tier I or II nationally bound team)

Joe Smith plays 2 games for Team B (Tier I or II nationally bound team)

Joe Smith plays 1 game for Team A He now has a total of 7 games for Team A

**C.** The question was asked of the AAHA Executive Committee if 8U players can play on a 10U team in a tournament held within Arizona. The committee referred to the AAHA policy which states.

12.2 Play Up Rules--- All 8U age players ( as defined by USA Hockey) shall only be eligible to participate on an 8U age team. No 8U age player or 8U team shall be permitted to “play Up” in a higher division.

Taking this policy into account the Executive Committee’s decision was that the AAHA registrar will not sanction tournaments within our Affiliate that has 8U players on a 10U roster.

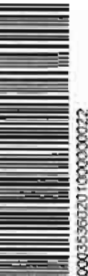

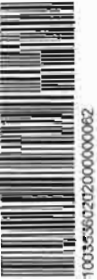

## AAHA Administrators Report for December 2017

There have been a number of things that have taken place this last month and added to the holidays it has made this a very active month.

First, acting as a 'coordinator' for the Arizona Coyotes 5050 Night, developed a spreadsheet of the Volunteers for the event. Then interacting with the Coyotes Community Development team updated them on the Volunteer's status and distributed the correspondence that they wanted out to the Volunteers, this actually continued up to within an hour of the deadline of 5pm on the 28th.

We will not have the final total for awhile, but from the amount announced at the game it should be a very successful fund raising endeavor for the Association.

Next working with Sports Engine, two non-mortary registration sessions were developed for upcoming Mite Jamborees, the AHU Jamboree Jan 28th, 2018 and the CAHA-Chandler Jamboree Feb 4th, 2018. To ensure as fair a registration as possible the registration sessions are not opened to registering until 30 days prior to the event so the AHU Jamboree is the only one that has been opened to date.

Unfortunately due to ice constraints at all of the Jamborees, the number of teams that can participate at any given event is limited so each registration session must be tweaked to reflect the limitations for each individual event.

Additional I have continued to work with Sports Engine on a number of systems issues that have been identified by us. This has proven to be more involved and taking more time than initially anticipated, but ultimately it should make for a better product for everyone.

The Referee's and Coaches pages on the AAHA web site continue to be in need of some significant work. The information currently on these pages is out of date and we are simply not using these and other pages as effectively as we could be.

Lastly we have made some significant in-roads with Tier hockey and those pages this last month, but a lot more work is needed. Currently mostly what has been done is on the News feed, by announcing a number of things about Tier hockey. We need to be promoting Tier hockey more with information in addition to their 'league' games, like successes at tournaments, features on accomplishments by

teams and players, Arizona did have the Number 1 draft in the NHL two years ago and he came from our Tier hockey program.

Tier II continues to be fairly responsive, we have a pretty complete schedule up and teams are starting to know to let me know when there is a change needed. In addition although missing a few games sheets currently the game sheets are pretty up-to-date so the standings and statistics are meaningful.

Tier I unfortunately continues to be another story..... I have been given and have input schedules for a number of the teams, but not all and scoresheets are very difficult to follow up on, with no schedule, don't know if I'm missing a scoresheet or not. We have put up a number of News articles, but a lot more work is needed on promoting both Tier I and Tier II, they are the premier leagues/teams.

All in all very pleased with the work that has been started, but we really need involvement from the Tier hockey people, Referees, Coaching and Adult hockey to truly make the AAHA web page the go to place for amateur hockey in Arizona.

## AZYHL Committee Report for Dec 2017

Things are progressing well with the AZYHL season, which is now about half over. All game sheets to date have been submitted and entered into the system so the league standings are up to date.

Unfortunately however there are still about a half a dozen league games that need to be scheduled or rescheduled and we are running out of time to get those played, league play must be over by the February 24th/25th weekend.

Two games have to be rescheduled from over the weekend before Christmas. One due to one of the teams not showing up and one due to issues around the officiating crew not showing up. The later game was played, but as exhibition. There is some question as to whether the officials were even booked so not sure how this all happened.

The AAHA State Tournaments for Recreational/House teams (AZYHL) have all been scheduled and the ice confirmed. In addition DIBs have been added to the AAHA web site for volunteers to sign up. Unfortunately that is going very slowly, the hope is that that is due to the holidays and competing with the Coyotes 5050 Night volunteer recruitment, it is hoped that once those are over things will pickup.

The AZYHL Committee is working on updates and clarifications to their Policies/Procedures and expect to have, after their Jan monthly meeting, something to submit to AAHA for approval and inclusion in Appendix B of AAHA's Policies and Procedures.

# Bylaw and Policy Committee Report

## January 2018 AAHA Meeting

The following two proposals were tabled at the December meeting awaiting further changes and comments from the Board committees and members. It will be recommended that the Tier Committee review both of these policy proposals at their next meeting and provide further refinement and wording changes to the policy committee and Board.

---

**12.2 POLICY PROPOSAL FOR DISCUSSION:** Allowance of 12U players to individually petition to “play up” on a 14U team.

**Section 12.2 which currently reads as follows:**

12.2 Play Up Rules

All 8U age players (as defined by USA Hockey) shall only be eligible to participate on an 8U age team. No 8U age player or 8U team shall be permitted to “play up” in a higher division.

No team, 10U and above (boys or girls), shall roster a player more than one age group higher (as defined by USA Hockey) only if allowed by the Member Association. Appeals to these roster rules need to be made to the full AAHA Board prior to the August AAHA Board meeting so it can be reviewed by the Board at that meeting. This appeal must be accompanied by an evaluation by the head coach of the current team the player is trying out for as well as the head coach of the prior team the player was rostered on showing the player has the ability to play at this higher level.

**Proposed language from Tony Radtke change for discussion:**

12.2 Play Up Rules

12.2.1 All 8U age players (as defined by USA Hockey) shall only be eligible to participate on an 8U age team. No 8U age player or 8U team shall be permitted to “play up” in a higher division.

1. All players participating on 8U teams must be of an age (as defined by USA Hockey) within the 8U age group. No player classified as a 6&Under player or younger shall be permitted to participate on an 8U team without prior approval of the AAHA Mite Committee.
2. The Hockey Director of the member association requesting to have a 6&Under player(s) “play up” on an 8U team, shall submit a written request to the Chairperson of the Mite Committee detailing the justification for the move. The Mite Committee shall review the request and provide final approval for the move prior to the player(s) being allowed to participate in team activities.

3. Entire teams of 6&Under players or younger shall not be permitted to “play up” at the 8U level.

12.2.2 Players in the 14U and 10U age divisions (boys or girls) may be permitted to “play up” on a team that is no more than one age group higher (as defined by USA Hockey) for the duration of the current playing season if recommended and approved to do so by the Hockey Director of their proposed Member Association.

1. For player(s) recommended to “play up” from the 12U to the 14U age division on non- nationally bound teams at any time or for any duration (i.e. full season, tournaments, or individual games), the Hockey Director of the player(s) proposed and/or current member association must submit the recommendation to the Executive Committee for final approval (with the help of the AZYHL Committee if necessary). This submission must include at a minimum, written explanation of the justification for the move, a signed letter from the parent(s) of the player(s) demonstrating their agreement with the move, along with a written agreement of the Head Coach of the older age group team the player is joining.
2. The Executive Committee (with the help of the AZYHL Committee if necessary) will evaluate the recommendation(s) and make a final decision as to the eligibility of the 12U player to “play up” one age group higher.
3. 12U player(s) awaiting final approval of the Executive Committee may not participate in any 14U team activities until notice of final approval is provided in writing to the Hockey Director of the member association

12.2.3 Any appeals to the outcome of the Executive Committee’s review process outlined above in 12.2.2.1 shall be presented to the full AAHA Board of Directors not less than one week (7 calendar days) prior to the next scheduled AAHA Board meeting so it can be reviewed by the Directors. The Board of Directors will then make the final decision at the same meeting.

12.2.4 Entire teams in the 12U age level may NOT “play up” at a 14U age level

12.2.5 Player(s) at the 10U and 14U age level may be permitted to play on a team not more than one age group higher for a “short term basis” that may include individual games, tournaments or scrimmages provided the move is approved by the Hockey Director of the respective member association prior to the player participating in any team activities of the older age group team.

1. “Short-term basis” for the purpose of this section shall be defined as a temporary reassignment to an older age group team that will result in eventual return to the players original team.
2. “Short-term” call ups shall not exceed 10 total games throughout the duration of the current playing season. If the player(s) exceeds 10 total games as a “short-term” call up, the player(s) will be required to be permanently reassigned to the older age team.

## TIER POLICY PROPOSAL FOR DISCUSSION: From the Tier Committee

### Proposed modifications to Section 13.4 of the AAHA Policy Manual

#### 13.4 Tier I/Tier II State Championships

##### 13.4.1 Guidelines

1. Each playing season AAHA shall conduct Arizona State Championships at the following age divisions for the purpose of **determining teams to represent Arizona in USA Hockey's National** Tournament play according to a schedule approved each year by the AAHA Board of Director

**Youth Boys** Division: 14U and above as defined by USAH; Tier I and Tier II for each age division.

Girls Divisions: 14U; 16U; and 19U; Tier I and Tier II for each age division.

2. The AAHA Board of Directors will announce the Championship dates for each Division prior to October 31st of each year and post to the AAHA website.

The Champion of each **boys' Youth** Tier I, and each **girls Girls** Tier I or **girls Girls** Tier II Divisions shall advance to the Rocky Mountain District Championships.

The Champion of each **boys' Youth** Tier II Division shall advance to the USA Hockey National Championships.

3. All **final** costs, (ice, Referees, Score and Timekeepers, Awards, etc.) per division, related to the State Championship shall be shared equally by ~~ALL associations declared to be Tier I or Tier II in each division, whether or not they participate in the Teams participating in the~~ Arizona State Championships. All cost shall be subject to review and approval by the AAHA Board of Directors.

4. Each Member Association wishing to participate in State Championships must be in good standing with AAHA.

5. Member Associations ~~must~~ shall submit, a \$500 non-refundable fee for each Tier I or Tier II **playing division in which they field a team fielded** for the playing season no later than October 31<sup>st</sup> of each year. The **non-refundable** fee from each ~~team~~ **Member Association** shall be used to offset the final **State Championship** fees due per division from each ~~declared~~ Tier I or Tier II team **participating in the State Championships**.

**Beginning with the 2018-2019 playing season**, Member Associations ~~must~~ shall submit, a ~~\$500~~ **\$1250.00** non-refundable fee for each Tier I or Tier II **playing division in which they field a team fielded** for the playing season no later than October 31<sup>st</sup> of each year. The **non-refundable** fee from each ~~team~~ **Member Association** shall be used to offset the final **State Championship** fees due per division from each ~~declared~~ Tier I or Tier II team **participating in the State Championships**.

6. Each Member Association may declare no more than one team in each division. Member Associations that register multiple teams in a division with the Arizona Associate Registrar shall be free to determine which team may represent the Member Association per Division in any manner they wish.

7. A final cost per team per division to participate in the State Championships will be forwarded to each Member Association no less than thirty (30) days prior to the state of the State Championships.

8. A Credentials Meeting shall be held approximately 7 - 10 days prior to the **state start** of the State Championships. All remaining fees due per **participating** team shall be due no later than this meeting. A coach and/or manager from each participating team shall be required to attend. No one person shall represent more than one team unless prior approval is granted by the Tournament Director. Failure of a team to have a coach and/or a manager present for the credentials meeting shall result in the suspension of the Head Coach of that **team's first game of the State Championship Tournament.**

9. AAHA will pay the entry fee for any team that represents AAHA in the Rocky Mountain District Championships and Tier II Nationals, not to exceed the RMD entry fee per team. **Beginning with the 2018-2019 playing season, AAHA will pay \$500.00 of the entry fee for any team that represents AAHA in the Rocky Mountain District Championships and Tier II Nationals, not to exceed the RMD entry fee per team.**

10. All games shall be played in accordance with District/National requirements as outlined in the latest edition of the USA Hockey Championship Tournament Guidebook including all games being played to a winner.

**The following two proposals were presented at the December meeting and will be open for a motion at this January meeting.**

### **5.1.8 POLICY PROPOSAL FOR VOTE: Appeal Committee in lieu of Full Board**

#### **Section 5.1.8 which currently reads as follows:**

5.1.8 Appeal Procedures – Any person or team that considers himself/herself aggrieved by sanctions imposed by the DC may appeal that decision to the AAHA Board of Directors. ### **5.1.10 POLICY PROPOSAL FOR VOTE: Appeal Committee in lieu of DC**

**Section 5.1.10 which currently reads as follows:**

5.1.10 Penalties imposed by the DC may affirm the original penalty imposed by a game official, or may be additional to that penalty at the discretion of the DC.

**Proposed language change for discussion:**

5.1.10 Penalties imposed by the ~~DC~~-Appeal Committee may affirm the original penalty imposed by a game official, or may be additional to that penalty at the discretion of the ~~DC~~ Appeal Committee.

Discipline Report  
January 2018

The Discipline Committee met on Tuesday December 12, 2017. There were three match penalties and one rule violation that involved a coach and an organization.

1. The AHU Mite White team was reported to have played in a full ice event against a Nevada team. The event was held at Gila River Arena on November 11, 2017. Members of the AHU Mite White Team and AHU were present. They were given an opportunity to present their interpretation of the event. They did indicate they used the full ice surface for their event but did not play a game since there were no referees, scoresheet or clock used. The Discipline Committee determined that the event was a violation under AAHA rule 11.1 and USA Hockey rule located in the Annual Guide on page 146. The Discipline Committee assessed a 30 day suspension to the head coach of the AHU Mite White team and a \$500 fine to the AHU organization. They were informed of their right to appeal.
2. A match penalty was assessed to a player from Desert Vista High School under USA Hockey rule 627 (b) kicking. This penalty occurred in a game in the Arizona High School Hockey Association. The teams involved in the game were Desert Vista and Flagstaff. The player did not disagree with the penalty that was called and did state that he did make a kicking motion at the player. He did not disagree with the penalty that was called and did state that he did make a kicking motion at the player. The Discipline Committee suspended the player from participating in any USA Hockey sanctioned activity through December 17, 2017. The player was made aware of the appeal process.
3. On December 1, 2017 a player playing in the Gilbert Adult League was assessed a match penalty under USA Hockey rule 615(c), removing helmet during altercation. The player was not present for the hearing. The Discipline Committee determined the player to be suspended from participating in any USA Hockey sanctioned adult hockey league through January 27, 2018. The player was made aware of the appeal process.
4. A CAHA Coach was assessed a match penalty under USA Hockey rule 601 (f3) behaving in any manner that is critically detrimental to the game. The coach appeared before the Committee and gave his interpretation of the incident. He also showed a video of the incident. The Committee that the 4 games and 4 practices that he missed was substantial enough as time served for the penalty. It should be noted that the video shown did indicate that the officials did not have control of the game. It should also be noted that this game was played in California and not Arizona.

This concludes my report for January 2018.

# AAHA Mite Committee Summary

## *December 4th, 2017*

The Mites Committee met on December 4th.

Topics discussed were:

- Age up Clinics
- Recommendations for Mites in the 2018/2019 season
- Mites playing Squirts

### 1. Age up clinics

After consultation and recommendations from the Executive Committee, the Mites Committee has decided to take the age up clinics off the schedule.

### 2. Recommendations for Mites in the 2018/19 season- ACTION REQUESTED

a) The committee recommends that Mites can only travel out of state once per season (down from 2 in previous seasons) with the approval of the committee and the board. USA Hockey does not recommend that any Mites travel at all and does not formally recognize Travel Mites. The Mites Committee recognizes that the decision to travel is a decision that each team/ association can decide on individually.

b) The committee recommends that mites should join AZYHL for the upcoming season and have league play. All league games will be held at jamborees around the State.

- The league will consist of 2 divisions (an upper and a lower), play 4x4 half ice, no more than 10 kids on a team.
- Each association will be limited to 2 teams in each division.
- League games will be played at Jamborees and jamborees will eliminate the house/ development league.
- Seeding tournament (jamboree) will be held in October to determine which division the team plays in.
- Mini mites will no longer be allowed to participate in Mites travel teams. This is for 1st and 2nd year mites (example 2011 and 2010 for the 2018/19 season) only. Teams may ask the Mites Committee for age exemptions.
- Teams may move a player up to the higher division to cover for sick or injured players, however, kids in the higher division may not play down on the lower division teams.

### 3. Mites playing Squirts

- Each club can self regulate Mites PRACTICING with squirt teams. The committee sees no need to make a rule or intervene on this issue
- At the end of the travel season (at the conclusion of the AZYHL playoffs) 2nd year Mites may play squirts

-1st year Mites may not play up an age group regardless of the season. (i.e. summer house leagues). Rinks need to be reminded of this policy. This is an existing policy and must be adhered to.

4. Tentatively holding meeting January 24<sup>th</sup> @ 6:30 pm to discuss Scottsdale Jamboree, upcoming jamboree at Gilbert and Chandler.

**Registration Summary and Comparison**

79% of officials registered for the 2017-18 season have completed all of their registration requirements. At this time last year we had a completion rate of 70% so we have had a significant increase in the proportion of officials who have completed all registration requirements.

In the next month it is expected that we will have more completed officials at every level for the 2017-18 season except for Level 4. The drop in Level 4 officials was expected because Arizona is not hosting a national championship this season. The Level 4 designation is only a requirement to travel out-of-state for national tournaments.
