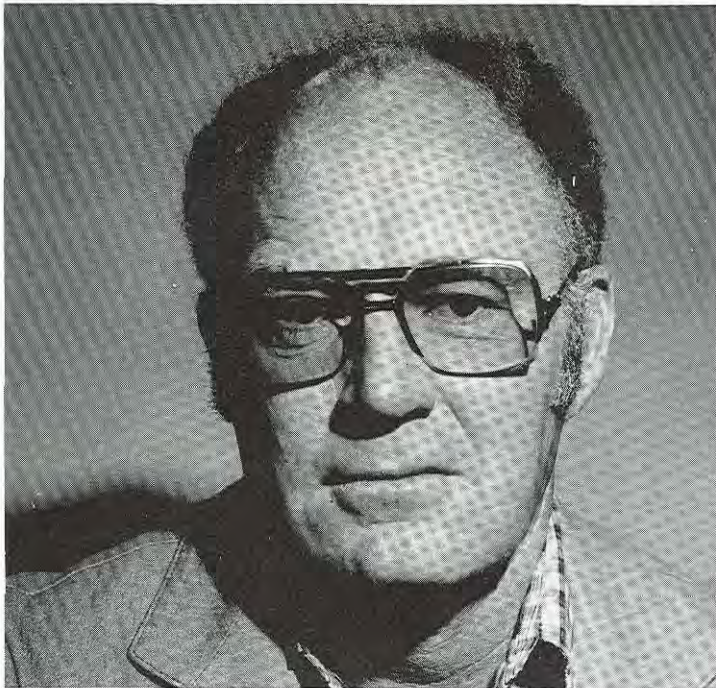

1979 FOOTBALL COACH OF THE YEAR
GLENN SELLEVOLD, MITCHELL



An undefeated season, the Big Eight Conference championship and the No. 1 ranking in the state belong to Glenn Sellevold and his 1979 Brandon Valley Lynx football team.

Brandon Valley recorded a 9-0 season, the third time in Sellevold's prep coaching career he has had an undefeated season. He pulled off the feat in 1967 at Clark, where his team won the Northwest Conference title, and in 1974 with the Lynx.

Since his arrival at Brandon in 1968, Sellevold built a 79-27-2 record there, and his career mark is 101-47-3.



1979 BOYS CROSS COUNTRY COACH OF THE YEAR
RICH GREENO, SIOUX FALLS LINCOLN



At one time his teams had a string of 87 straight victories. His Patriot teams have a record of 116-11.

Greeno was named to the South Dakota Coaches Association Hall of Fame last year and is also a member of the Northern State College Hall of Fame. He won the state coaches track and field coach of the year award in 1969 and 1973, the state sports-writers coach of the year award in 1970 and was NHS/ACA District 6 track coach of the year in 1969 and 1974, and their cross country coach of the year in 1976. In 1974 Greeno was named the NHS/ACA National Track Coach of the Year.



1979 GIRLS CROSS COUNTRY COACH OF THE YEAR
JIM GEMAR, LENNOX



Jim Gemar was named the 1979 Girls' Cross Country Coach of the Year by the association one year after he claimed the boys' honor by his fellow coaches.

"The satisfaction comes in seeing young people do well and take a lot of pride in themselves and what they do," he said.



1979 GIRLS BASKETBALL COACH OF THE YEAR
GALE LUNDBERG, CLEAR LAKE



Lundberg's six-year record at Clear Lake is 118-13. He also won the award in 1976 after his Cardinals won the state Class B title.

Lundberg is a Revillo native and attended Dakota State College.



1980 WRESTLING COACH OF THE YEAR
ROD MOON, MOBRIDGE



Moon's Mobridge wrestling team captured the Class B mat crown with 116 points. He stated the coaching award was more of a tribute to the kids than to coaching.

Moon is a graduate of Black Hills State College.



1980 GYMNASTICS COACH OF THE YEAR
DAWN WILBER, MILLER



After taking Doland to two straight Class B state championships, Mrs. Wilber took over the head coaching job at Miller and developed a successful program. Miller finished runner-up to Wagner in the state meet with only .9 of a point separating the two teams.

It is the second coach of the year honor for her. She serves as an officer of the S.D. Gymnastics Coaches Association and is on the board of directors of the S.D.H.S.C.A.



1980 BOYS BASKETBALL COACH OF THE YEAR
DAN MORAN, STICKNEY



Stickney's team whittled off a 24-2 record enroute to third place in the State Class "B" Tournament. Moran's career record at that time was 301-101.

"I know whatever honors I get, my teams have earned for me. It's the kids that actually do the work".



1980 BOYS TRACK COACH OF THE YEAR
DICK BROOK, SIOUX FALLS WASHINGTON



After fourteen years at Lincoln, Brook left in the spring of 1979 to become Washington's head coach. Last fall the Warriors finished third in the state meet of Class AA cross country.

Last spring the Orange and Black won three of four duals, won the Region 3AA meet for the first time in fourteen years and finished fourth in the state meet.



1980 GIRLS TRACK COACH OF THE YEAR
JACK RASMUSSEN, SALEM



Salem's girls program has been sound since its inception, and the Cubs have won every Big Sioux Conference title in the sport. They won the Class A championship after a narrow miss the year before.

Rasmussen is from Elk Point and a graduate of South Dakota. He earned the honor in his second year of coaching.



1980 GOLF COACH OF THE YEAR
JIM SORENSEN, BERESFORD



His girls team won a third straight state title, and his boys team finished second after being the champion last season.

This is Sorenson's second time to be honored as Golf Coach of the Year.



1980 DISTINGUISHED SERVICE AWARD
SID LUNDQUIST, STRANDBURG

*Given for outstanding contributions to high school athletics and
dedication to the highest and best in high school athletics.*



Lundquist has served high school athletics in the state for many years, most notably as an official scorer in basketball. He has served for District 9 since the A and B divisions were formed, and for the Big 8 tournament since 1941, overall totaling 44 years.

He has refereed football and basketball and currently covers wrestling and basketball tournaments for radio station KSOO in Sioux Falls. Lundquist was named to the South Dakota Baseball Hall of Fame in 1973.

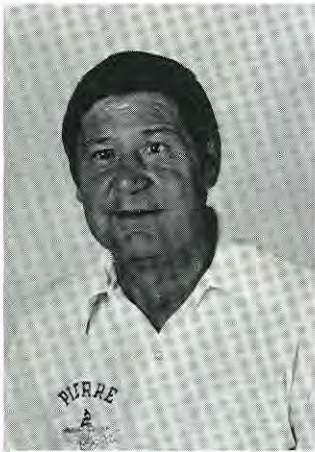


ATHLETIC DIRECTOR OF THE YEAR
ALLEN "PETE" BAKER, SCOTLAND



Baker has been athletic director and coach in Scotland for the past 27 years, earning 200 victories as basketball coach and leading his team to second place in the state "B" tournament in 1964. Pete coached basketball until 1966 and was head track coach until 1973. He presently coaches the cross country and golf squads.

A native of Scotland, Pete coached ten years in Nebraska before returning to his hometown. Scotland's football stadium is called Baker Stadium in honor of the long-time coach.

PHIL TRAUTNER, PIERRE

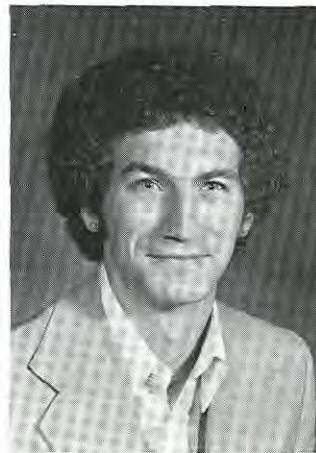

Phil Trautner has coached tennis for fourteen years and compiled a 124-15 record in dual meets. His teams have been state champions twice and have won the conference five times. Trautner has also served 27 years as an athletic director.

Fred Tibbetts coached the Jefferson Hawkettes to the 1978 and 1979 State "B" Championships. During his eight years of coaching at Jefferson he has compiled a record of 160-11. The Hawkettes had previously captured a state championship and had finished in the runner-up position once.

Tibbetts graduated from DeSmet High School and Dakota State College and credits much of his success to "the good athletes and the good program at the Jefferson school".
