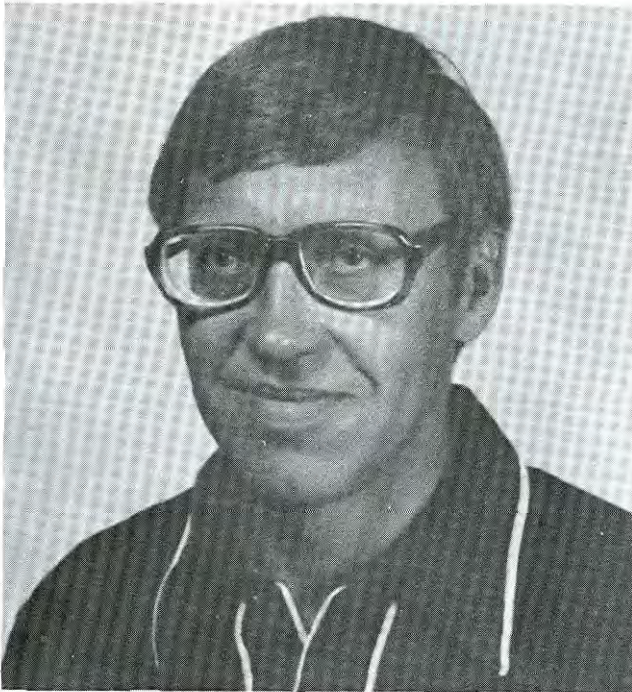
1982 BOYS CROSS COUNTRY COACH OF THE YEAR

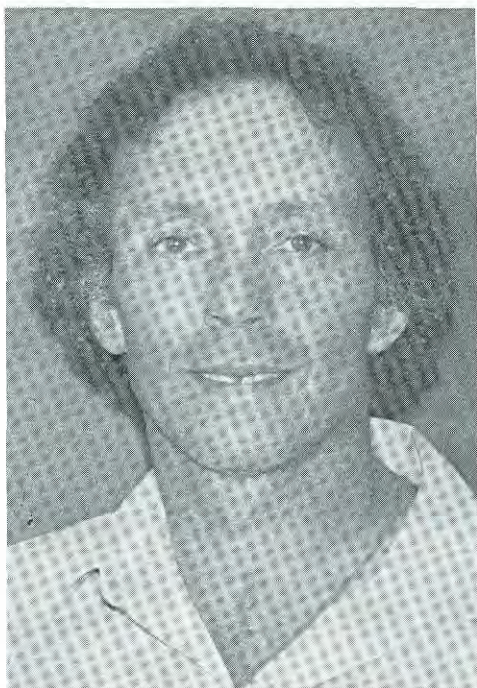
1982 GIRLS CROSS COUNTRY COACH OF THE YEAR

Russ Strande began coaching girls cross country in 1975 at Brookings and has guided them to state championships in 1980 and in 1982. "The award goes back to the kids you coach. We've had good attitude and good hard workers, plus some talent."



1982 GIRLS BASKETBALL COACH OF THE YEAR
DON SHIELDS, PIERRE



Shields' 1982 team had a 21-2 record, a share of the conference title and won the State Class A Championship. In his four years as head coach every team has qualified for the state tourney. "Fair and honesty goes a long way with kids. What we're trying to teach in athletics goes a lot farther than just winning and losing."



1983 WRESTLING COACH OF THE YEAR
WILLIE SEIBEL, VERMILLION



The Vermillion Tanagers piled up 140 points in the state tournament and had three individual champions, winning the 1983 championship, in Seibel's fourth year as head coach. "We were just hoping that come the end of the season we would be all together as a unit."



1983 GYMNASTICS COACH OF THE YEAR
MARK UPWARD, VERMILLION



Mark Upward's squad won their second straight Class B State Championship, outdistancing the runnerup team by 10 points, with 141.88. "We knew we had a good team and could go out and put it together if we wanted it bad enough . . . had a very exceptional year."



1983 BOYS BASKETBALL COACH OF THE YEAR
WAYNE CARNEY, HAMLIN



The Hamlin Chargers compiled a 23-2 record and won the Class B State Championship. In six seasons at Hamlin, Carney's teams have won 80 percent of their games with six district and five regional championships.

Busch began coaching at Todd County High School in 1978, and his teams have a 114-29 record. In the two years of state volleyball tourneys his teams have been the runnerup.

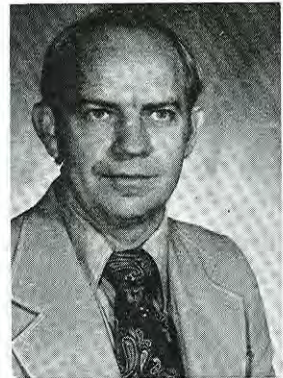
