2000 FOOTBALL COACH OF THE YEAR

JOHN NYHAUG

Viborg



John Nyhaug, a twenty-three year veteran of the coaching wars in South Dakota and of the competitive Tri-Valley Conference, took his Vikings to the top in the 2000 season. They won the state Class 9B championship, posting a 12-0 season record. The Vikings, who bounced back from a 2-6 mark in an injury-plagued 1999 year, roared to success with the competent help of assistants Mike DeBates and Mark Koopman, and with great fan support in Viborg.

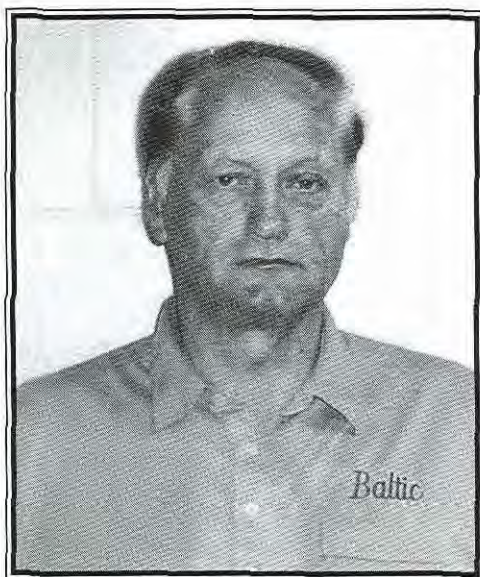
"The Tri-Valley Conference," Nyhaug pointed out, "has won seven state titles in the past eleven seasons. So it's a struggle just to get out of your region. But our kids came through, worked hard and are deserving champions."



2000 BOYS CROSS COUNTRY COACH OF THE YEAR

KURT SCHULTZ

Baltic



"Winning the State Class B cross country championship this year fulfilled one of my lifetime goals," said Baltic boys' coach, Kurt Schultz. "Winning the coach-of-the-year honor with that makes this year extra special."

2000 GIRLS CROSS COUNTRY
COACH OF THE YEAR

TODD THORSON

Ipswich



In his first year of coaching girls' cross country and in the first year of the sport at Ipswich High School, Todd guided the Ipswich Tigers to an undefeated regular season and then to the state Class A girls' team championship.

Todd had to persuade his school board to have a season, and then had to undergo knee surgery days before the season started. This forced him to "stand and watch" instead of running with his team in training. "I had a small part, and the people around me had a big part," Todd said modestly. "I'm really lucky."



2000 GIRLS' BASKETBALL COACH OF THE YEAR

TODD JUTTING

Waverly-South Shore High Schools



In the first year of their basketball co-op, with Todd Jutting as their coach, the Waverly-South Shore Coyotes went all the way, posting a perfect 25-0 record on the way to the South Dakota Class B state championship. This was the first state title for either town.

Todd coached at South Shore for eight years before the two neighboring schools joined forces. The Watertown native has an overall win-loss record of 127-67.

"Our girls worked extremely hard," said coach Jutting. "I'm happy for them more than anything."



2001 GYMNASTICS COACH OF THE YEAR

LINDA COLLIGNON

Madison High School



For the second year in a row Linda Collignon has been named the state's gymnastics coach of the year. After guiding the Madison teams to seven straight consecutive state titles, she has decided to resign from coaching.

Linda credited the quality of her gymnasts and excellent assistants, particularly Diane Braskamp. The continued support and commitment of the Madison community and its school system have been great.



2001 VOLLEYBALL COACH OF THE YEAR

KELLY NORTHRUP

Hot Springs



When the Hot Springs Bison rumbled through the 2001 season with a perfect 42-0-3 record, their coach and their fans expected little less. "From the very start everyone expected great things of us," Kelly said. This was their second state tournament in a row.

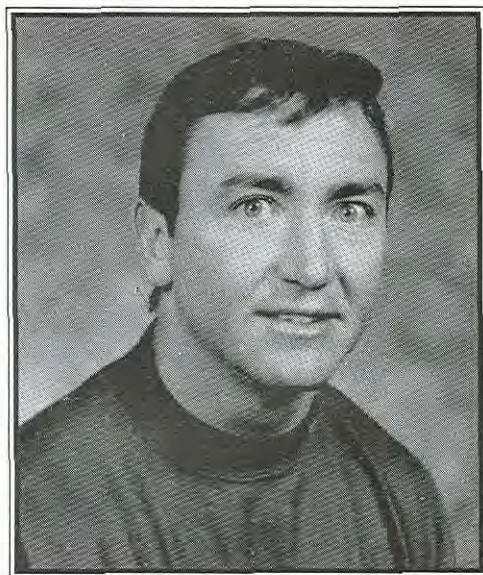
Kelly, a Letcher native who graduated from Huron College, began her coaching career in Alpena. She then went back to Letcher before moving to Hot Springs nine years ago.



2001 WRESTLING COACH OF THE YEAR

TIM WISHARD

Rapid City Stevens



The Rapid City Stevens Raiders overcame several early-season injuries and dominated the field at the State Class A wrestling meet. They won their first state championship since 1988.

Tim was named Coach of the Year for this accomplishment, but modestly gave credit to others. "I want to thank those who started this program before I came here," he said.

After their slow start, the Raiders put together a strong showing at a mid-season tournament in Bismarck, North Dakota, to finish second. At that point, Tim knew his team was on course and they set their goal as the state crown. "They began to know what it takes to be winners," he said.



2001 BOYS' BASKETBALL COACH OF THE YEAR

GALEN SWENSON

Castlewood



Galen Swenson has been named Boys' Basketball Coach of the Year for the second time in three years. His Castlewood Warriors completed another undefeated season and won another state Class B championship with twenty-four straight victories.

His Warriors have an enviable 90-6 record in the past four seasons, and his overall record in twenty years as their head coach is 313 wins and 146 losses. His twelve girls' teams were 221-72, with a 1981 crown.

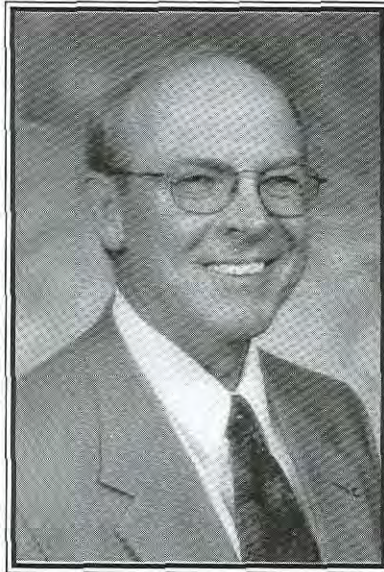

Rapid City Stevens



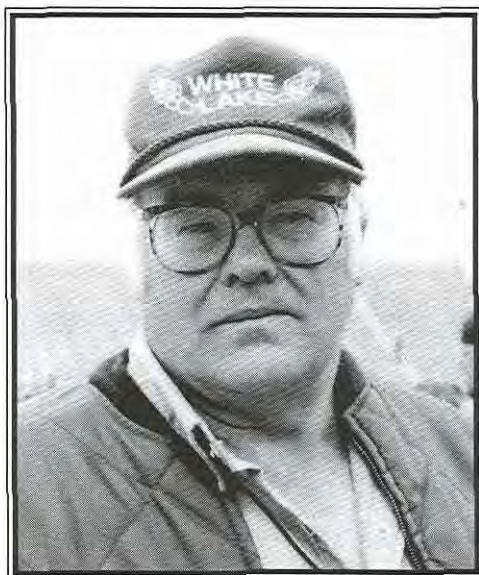

White Lake



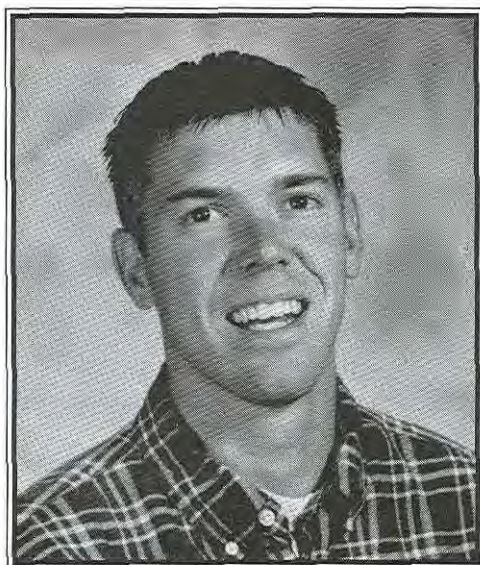

Sioux Falls Washington High School



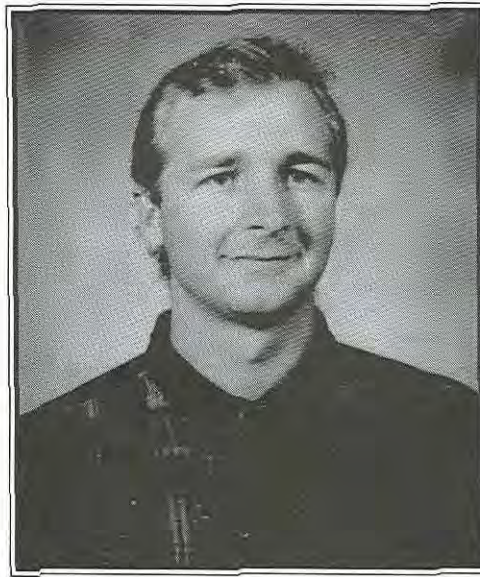

Mick Hogleund graduated from Hamlin High School in 1980. He attended college at the University of Sioux Falls, where he played baseball, basketball and golf. Formerly a cheerleader in high school, at Augustana College and Northern State University, Lynn Senftner is now involved as a coach and an active member of coaches' professional groups.

Lynn began her coaching experience at Winner, then moved to Gregory and has completed her first year as Spirit Coach at Timber Lake. In her first season, cheerleader tryouts were unnecessary as only six girls signed up. This past year, 38 tried out.

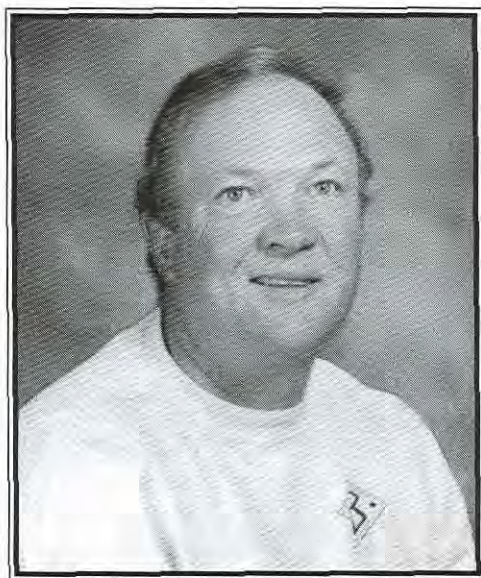

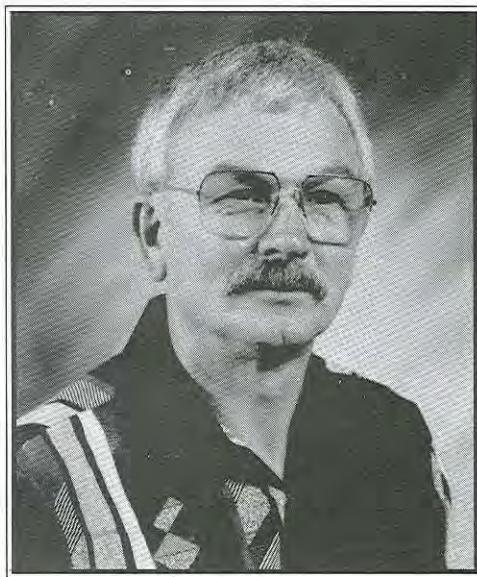
Culver said, "Roger is an outstanding assistant football coach - knowledgeable, loyal and dedicated."

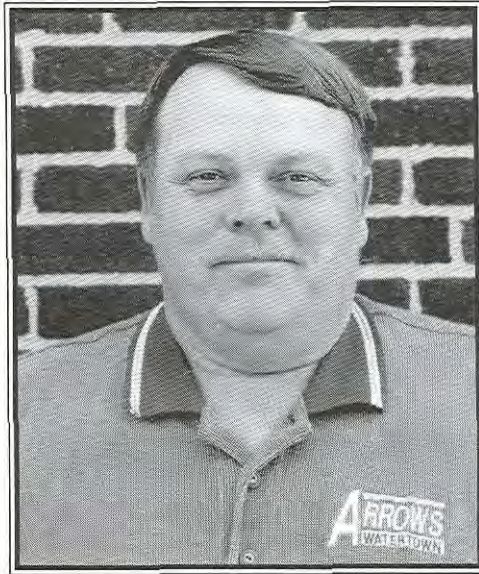
Doc has been awarded the SDHSAA Distinguished Service Award twice.

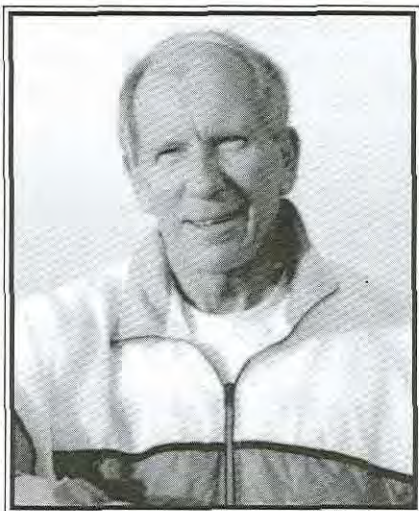


2001 DISTINGUISHED SERVICE AWARD

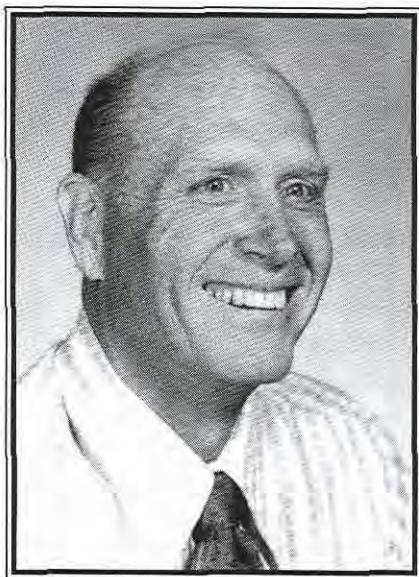

They serve without salary, without recognition, without honors or awards. Special Olympics could not do without them - their devotion, their work and their love.

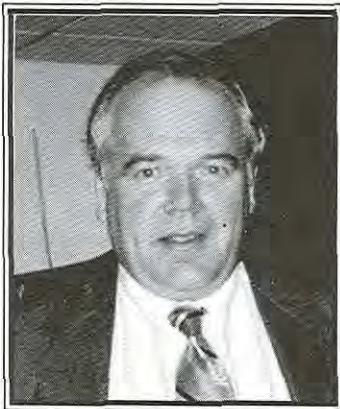
So "thank you" volunteers! You represent the highest values of the human spirit. You get your thanks, not in money or words or praise, but through what you do for Special Olympics.
