Ferril takes 1st place at Twins Skills Competition

Maggie Ferril, a sixth grader at Orono Middle School in Orono, MN took 1st place in the 2020 Minnesota Twins Baseball/Softball Skills Champions Day. Ferril competed against other athletes in the same age bracket during Champions Day on September 20th, where she finished strong and took first place overall. Her twin brother Jimmy also excelled, taking 1st place in his region, then finishing in 6th place overall.

Over 600 boys and girls participated in the 2020 season of the Minnesota Twins Baseball and Softball Camps. During camp, each player competed in skills competitions consisting of batting, fielding, throwing and running skills. At the conclusion of the summer, the top ten finishers in each age category competed on Champions Day. Due to COVID-19 restrictions at Target Field, Champions Day was held at CHS Field in St. Paul this year.

Ferril qualified for Champions Day when she attended Twins Camp in Delano last July. "Maggie is a good athlete and a terrific young lady who really performed well under the pressure of being on the field at CHS Field," commented Tim Rappe, Twins Camp executive director.
