## Event On-Course Incident Protocol

- Coaches/Medical Meeting
  - Time and Place via zoom nightly
- Ski Patrol
  - Main Office/Dispatch: (509) 663-6543
  - Patrol Director: Delcie Proffitt
- Chief of Race
  - Roger Taggart, (509) 990-1359
- MRST Staff
  - Program Director: Roger Taggart, (509) 990-1359
  - Safe Sport Coordinator: Danasue Kusakabe, (206) 591-4039
  - Race Administrator: Chip McElearney, (206) 786-2266
- Base Medical Station:
  - **First-Aid Room - 1st Level at Base between Chair 1 & 4**
  - Staffed with RN, MD on call
  - Ambulance on call for all races with Paramedic
  - AED, Tool Cart, Airway Management, Cardiac Monitoring, etc.
- Course Staffing:
  - Ski Patrol with oxygen, toboggan, backboard at upper Ski Patrol building adjacent to race start
  - AED at top of Chairs #2 and 4, Aid Room, and Admin Office in Lodge
- Radio Call Numbers:
  - Jury Radio (channel 11) for start/stop course
    - Patrol to scene when course clear
  - Mission Ridge Patrol (channel 1)
    - Call signs: #19 for MD; #18 for RN; #10 for Patrol Director

## Transport/Evacuation Protocol

- Patrol to transport to First Aid Room
- Triage/Stabilize in First Aid Room by RN/MD
- Need for and means of transport will depend on level of injury
- Moderate and severe injuries (Level II, III, IV) will be transported to Confluence Health Central Campus Hospital via Ambulance for evaluation and treatment and, if needed, Airlift Northwest Air Ambulance (helicopter) to Harborview Medical Center.
