



West Mountain Racing Athletes Code of Conduct

As a participant in the West Mountain Racing program, all athletes must realize that they are a visible representative for the WMR program and the school they attend. All athletes participating the West Mountain Racing program are required to follow the established Code of Conduct.

- 1.** All participants are expected to abide by the Rules and Regulations at West Mountain, and away at USSS' and NYSSRA's events and on-snow camps. Remember you are a guest at that facility and should treat all venue employees and the public with courtesy and respect. This Code of Conduct extends to use of social media.
- 2.** Participants are required to train and travel with WMR as WMR and NYSSRA and members, listing WMR as their club affiliation on all registration sites and with USSS. Participants who join other clubs, change their club affiliation from WMR and/or state affiliation from NYSSRA etc. at any point during the season will be removed without a refund.
- 3.** Participants are required to wear helmets and the WMR Team Coat (uniform) while training, at races, on podium and at on-snow camps.
- 4.** Participants are required to always conduct themselves in a sportsmanlike manner treating their teammates, coaches, employees and visiting athletes and coaches with respect.
- 5.** Participants are to be properly dressed and wear the required protective gear.
- 6.** Participants must listen to and be courteous to coaches and staff.
- 7.** Participants must be on time for scheduled activities.
- 8.** Participants must maintain their athletic eligibility by registering with USSS and NYSSRA.
- 9.** The Participant must adhere to directives of West Mountain Racing staff while training.
- 10.** Participants of West Mountain Racing may be disciplined or removed from the team without refund for the following infractions:
 - Competing and/or traveling with another club and/or coaches
 - Use of smoking tobacco, vape pipes and/or pens, and chewing tobacco
 - Use and/or possession of alcohol
 - Use and/or possession of narcotics and non-prescription drugs.
 - Behavior that is detrimental to the program and/or other athletes.
 - Theft of property
 - Suspension from school

If any of the above infractions occur during a camp and/or race, the athlete will be sent home immediately and without refund. If any of the above infractions occur during training etc. all program privileges will be suspended until the situation is resolved. The Program Director reserves the right to remove the training pass from a participant and without refund. Other disciplinary measures can be taken by the Program Director or Mountain based on the severity of the situation.
