

Bill Day, a native of Vienna Virginia, comes to the Ashburn Ice House having just completed six years of service in the US Army, achieving the rank of Captain and several meritorious and service awards.

He grew up playing youth hockey for the Reston Raiders and Ashburn Xtreme before moving on to Junior Hockey with the Washington Junior Nationals (Atlantic Junior Hockey League) and the Jersey Hitmen (Eastern Junior Hockey League). During his junior career he was a two time AJHL All Star and led the Jersey Hitmen to their first ever EJHL championship. He was recruited to play NCAA Division 1 Hockey for the United States Military Academy at West Point

While at West Point, Day lettered for four years, playing in over 100 career games as a defenseman and forward before graduating with a Bachelors of Science in Management in 2012, and commissioning in the US Army as a Signal Officer.

After completing the Signal Basic Officer Leaders Course at Fort Gordon, GA in December of 2012, Day was assigned to Fort Carson, CO in the 4th Infantry Division. From January 2013 to December 2014, he was a Platoon Leader in Bravo Company, 2nd Special Troops Battalion, 2ND Armored Brigade Combat Team. During that time he was deployed to Kuwait for nine months in support of Operation Spartan Shield.

Upon return to the United States, Day then served as the Battalion Signal Officer for the 4th Engineer Battalion at Fort Carson. His duties included leading the operation of information technology, cyber security, information assurance, and communications across seven different Engineer Companies while also advising the Battalion Commander on all areas related to signal and IT support.

At the end of his tour of duty at Fort Carson, Day was assigned to the Army West Point Athletic Department, where he served as the Director of Hockey Operations for the Army West Point Hockey Team from June of 2016 to August 2018. His responsibilities included developing and managing the budget, coordinating all team travel logistics, and serving as the Assistant Camp Director for the Army West Point Youth Hockey Camps. During his time with the program, the team had consecutive top 3 regular season league finishes, earning a first round bye in each season, and making the Atlantic Hockey Conference Final Four in 2017.

Day currently resides in Washington D.C. with his fiancé Lindsey.
