Tess has played softball for 52 years starting with the 4-H program. With that start, she has traveled across the country playing a game she loves.

While playing Senior softball, her teams won six national championships. In 2007, with the encouragement of USA Softball Hall of Fame member, Penny Knupp, Tess took up umpiring at the high school level. In 2010, she registered with ASA (now USA Softball) and attended her first of many national schools. With her knowledge of the game, she moved up the ranks quickly and was able to umpire in her first national championship in 2012. That was the first of a streak of championship events for every year with the exception of 2014, which she chose to take a vacation with her family, and again in 2020. Tess is due to umpire in the JO Cup in 2021.

Tess has umpired many of our state tournaments and Special Olympic tournaments. She says hard work and the love

of the game have given her, and many of her brothers and sisters in blue, a chance to umpire all over the United States. She has many great memories that can never be taken away. Tess is currently on the District 11 umpire staff as the fast pitch UIC. Congratulations on this reaching this achievement in your umpire career.

Dominic (Nick), is starting his 40th year of umpiring. Nick is regular in umpiring slow pitch and fast pitch games. He received his Elite status after being selected for the 18U Gold as pictured in Oklahoma City this past summer.

Nick began as a slow pitch umpire with goals of working high level softball. While in Muskegon, he was viewed and watched by former USA Softball of Michigan umpire, Dave Ritsema. This was the break that Nick needed; he was given the opportunity to umpire in some of the tournaments that Muskegon hosted. By being around these tournaments he kept hearing comments from other umpires about how the Michigan umpires were regarded across the country and the chances they were getting at the national level. Nick knew he wanted to be at that level and started working on fine-tuning his game and learning the finer points. He also started umpiring fast pitch at the high school level.

After being assigned to the 16U Gold, Nick realized he may have a chance to reach the Elite status as an umpire after being around such a great group of umpires. Nick is one of the few umpires who has umpired at a
