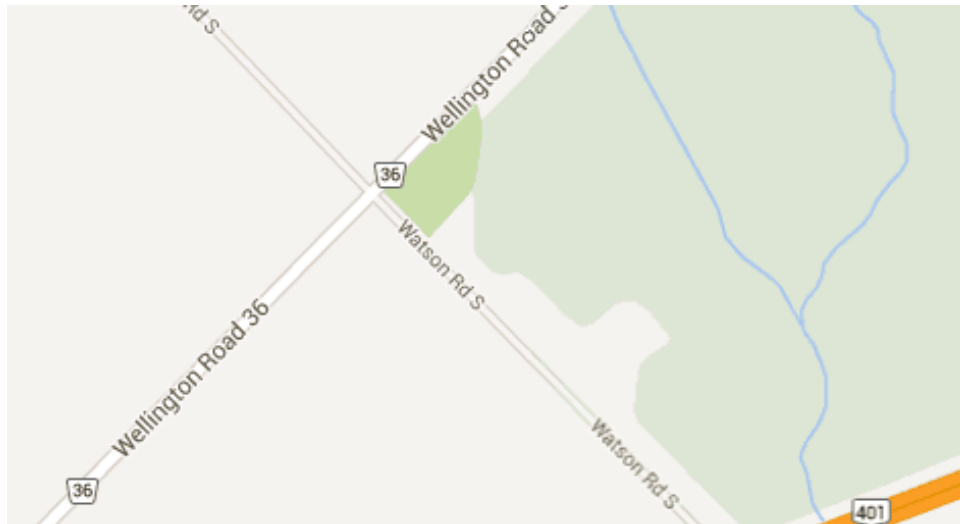

Call Person (2 nd Option):	Assistant Manager on site for PMSC
Call Person (3 rd Option):	Parent Volunteer on site for PMSC

Roles and Responsibilities:

Charge Person:

- Clear the risk of further harm to the injured person by securing the area and shelter the injured person from the elements
- Designate who is in charge of the other athletes on our team
- Protect yourself (wear gloves if you are in contact with bodily fluids such as blood)
- Assess ABCs (check that airway is clear, breathing is present, a pulse is present and that there is no major bleeding)
- Wait by the injured person until the Emergency Medical Services arrive and the injured person is transported
- Fill out an accident report form and follow up with the injured person

Call Person:

- Call for emergency help (9-1-1)
- Provide all of the necessary information to dispatch (i.e. facility location; nature of the injury; what, if any, first aid has been done)
- Clear any traffic from the entrance/access route before the ambulance arrives (recruit someone else to assist, if necessary)
- Wait by the driveway entrance to the facility to direct the ambulance when it arrives
- Call the emergency contact person on the injured person's emergency contact form
