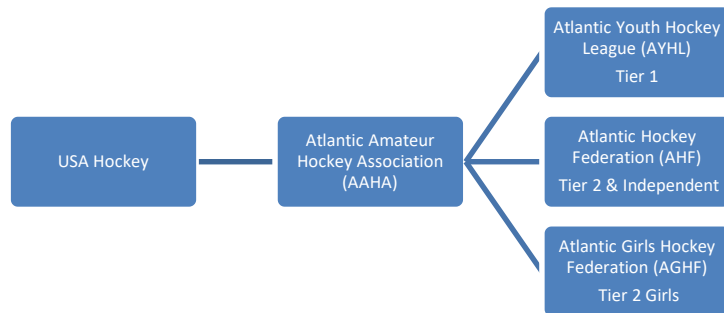

4. Players and Parents

4.1 **REGISTRATION**

4.2 **EXPECTATIONS**

The organization follows USA Hockey's Code of Conduct for all Administrators, Coaches, Game Officials, Parents, Players, and Spectators. However, below are some additional guidelines that we feel strongly about.

Players:

- Play the game for the love of the game.
- Be generous and respectful in winning, gracious and respectful in losing, and obey the rules.
- Work for the good of the team and towards excellence.
- Accept willingly and graciously the decisions of the officials.
- Conduct oneself, at all times, with honor and dignity.

Parents:

- Make sure your son/daughter knows that win or lose, you love them. Let them know that you appreciate their efforts and that you will not be disappointed in them if they fail. Be the person in their life they can always look to for support.
- Try to be completely honest with yourself about your child's athletic capability, their competitive attitude, their sportsmanship, and their level of skill.
- Be careful, do not coach your child on the way to the game or at the breakfast or dinner table. Think of how tough it must be on them to be continually inundated with all kinds of advice, pep talks, and criticism.
- Teach your child to always enjoy the thrill of competition, to be "out there trying", to be constantly working to improve their skills, to take the physical bumps, and to come back for more. Do not tell them that winning does not count, because it does, and they know it. Instead, help them to develop a healthy, competitive attitude – a "feel" for competing, for trying hard, and for having a good time.
- Try not to live your life through your child. You have lost as well as won; you have been frightened; you have backed off at times; you have been the villain before. Do not expect any better of them. They are an extension of you, but do not assume they feel the same way you did, want the same things, or have the same

attitudes. Do not push them in the direction that will give you the most satisfaction.

- Do not compete with your child’s coach. Their coach may become a hero to them for a while, someone who can do no wrong and you may find that hard to take. Also, your child may become disenchanted with the coach. Do not side with them against the coach. Talk to them about the importance of learning how to handle a problem and how to react to criticism. Try and help them understand the need for rules, regulations, and discipline.
- Do not compare your child to others on their team – at least not within their hearing. If they have the tendency to resent the treatment they receive from the coach; if they are jealous of the approval other players receive, try to be honest with them. Do not lie to them about their capabilities as a player. If you are overly protective, you will perpetuate the problem.
- Get to know your child’s coach. Make sure that you approve of their attitudes and ethics. A coach can be very influential, and you should know what their values are so that you can decide whether or not you want them passed on to your child.
- Remember that children tend to exaggerate when they are praised and are criticized. Temper your reaction to the stories your child brings home from the rink. Do not criticize them for exaggerating, but do not overreact to the stories they tell you.
- Teach your child the meaning of courage. Some of us can climb mountains but are frightened to get into a fight. Some of us can fight without fear but turn to jelly at the sight of a bee. Everyone is afraid of something. Courage is learning to perform in spite of fear. Courage is not getting rid of fear, it is overcoming it.

	<p>Organization follows the rules and policies of USA Hockey regarding team roster size, with a maximum of twenty (20) players allowed per roster, including goalies and taxi squad players. Players of all ages may be placed, following annual evaluations; in an in-house/instructional program instead of on a competitive travel team if, in the evaluation process the Organization determines that it is in the best interest of the player and the Organization based on skill level.</p>
5.2	<p><u>EVALUATIONS AND PLACEMENT</u></p> <p>We pride ourselves on our team selection process and truly believe that no other organization in the AAHA goes to such lengths to ensure the integrity, honesty and fairness of the process.</p> <p>For a description explaining the entire process for player evaluations and placement, please visit our website: Evaluation Process (phantomseyouth.org)</p>
5.3	<p><u>HEAD COACHES</u></p> <p>Head Coaches for all teams are finalized after evaluations have concluded.</p>
5.4	<p><u>COACHING PHILOSOPHY</u></p> <p>The Lehigh Valley Phantoms Youth believes their coaching staff is the single greatest asset within the organization, and as such strives to improve the level, caliber, and quality of coaching year in and year out. Our organization’s goal is to become the best coaching organization, not only within the leagues in which we participate, but also in the Atlantic District. Under the leadership and direction of our Vice President of Hockey Operations and the Head of Coaches, we will establish a commitment to excellence and provide the necessary resources and succession plans as our players progress through their hockey playing career from 8U through the 18U levels.</p> <p>The Lehigh Valley Phantoms Youth Board is wholly committed to their coaching staff and fully supports their actions within the guidelines of our organization, the leagues in which we participate and USA Hockey.</p> <p>The Lehigh Valley Phantoms Youth Board of Directors will grant each coach leeway, if required, to create a game winning situation, although winning is not the ultimate goal of the program. The organization believes that winning is an important ingredient to the overall hockey playing experience. The coaches are encouraged to provide each player with ample opportunity to play in all playing situations (power play, shorthanded, etc.), however the decision ultimately resides with the Head Coach regarding how playing time is handled across the team.</p>

- Use discipline only when a situation requires.
- Teach players the tough lessons involving teamwork, sportsmanship, commitment to the team, etc.
- Have fun.

5.5 **COACHING CURRICULUM**

The Lehigh Valley Phantoms Youth organization strives to instill a positive work ethic, a winning attitude, a strong sense of team, sense of respect for others and a positive framework for hockey development through a core curriculum emphasizing the following tenants:

- Team Skills
- Game Skills
- Position Skills
- Skating Skills
- Stick Handling Skills
- Goaltending Skills

Players will experience each tenant through development with experienced and knowledgeable coaches. We will provide players with the opportunity to bond and come together as a cohesive unit. We will create game-like situations through high-tempo practices. We will teach players the basics through advanced roles of positioning. We will provide skating instruction, including power skating classes. Practices will include drills designed to improve stick handling skills and dynamics. We will provide outstanding goaltender coaching.

The Lehigh Valley Phantoms Youth organization believes strongly in the USA Hockey American Development Model (ADM) which emphasizes the development of skills and athleticism for hockey players through innovative teaching methods. This curriculum was designed to provide our Coaches with consistent programming from 8U through 18U Levels, year after year. Each head coach receives the 'core curriculum' for his current level – thereby ensuring proper player development. This system also focuses on the professional development of coaches. Coaches using the USA Hockey system develop creative practices which are designed to meet or exceed game speed and conditions. They practice High Tempo skill development, and as a result, their players love to practice and play because they have fun while perfecting skills.

We want to see a more skillful game for the future of hockey and are genuinely interested in the development of players. Our objective is to ensure that coaches become

	<p>knowledgeable and skilled in coaching methodology, sport science, and the ability to apply and impart this knowledge in players as they develop within our organization.</p>
5.6	<p><u>SUGGESTED TEAM RULES</u></p> <p>These rules may be modified on a team-by-team basis and will be communicated by your head coach.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● All players must be in the locker room a minimum of forty-five (45) minutes before all practices and games. ● All players must be fully dressed and ready to go on the ice fifteen (15) minutes before the start of all practices and games. ● Make sure skates are always sharp and have sticks properly cut and ready for all practices and games. ● All players will respect game officials and any player receiving a penalty must go directly to the penalty box. ● All players will be properly and cleanly dressed at all games, tournaments, and any team functions; as directed by coaching staff. ● All players must attend all practices, games and team functions, unless the Head or Assistant Coach has been notified and has approved of the player's absence. ● All players will respect the coaches, organization and league officials, opponents, fans and any other person who are directly or indirectly involved with the organization or league. ● No alcohol, drugs, vaping, swearing, or abusive language will be tolerated at any time, and no player will be allowed on the ice without full equipment. ● No player is allowed to leave the ice during a practice or game without permission and all players will obey a curfew if and when a curfew is imposed. ● No cell phone use in the locker rooms.
5.7	<p><u>TEAM WEBSITES</u></p> <p>You can find the current season's teams, rosters, and coaching staff listed on our organization's website: Teams (phantomsyouth.org). Each team has a dedicated webpage where the team can share information and users can access information about their ongoing season.</p> <p>Additionally, teams have the option to create their own social media accounts. However, it is essential to ensure that these accounts comply with our <u>Electronics & Social Media Policy</u>. We entrust each team with the responsibility of maintaining compliance with our policies while leveraging social media to engage with their community.</p>

6. Locker Room Policies & Procedures

6.1	USA Hockey requires that all local programs publish their locker room policies to the parents of all minor participants.
6.2	In addition to the development of our hockey players and enjoyment of the sport of hockey, the safety and protection of our participants is central to the LV Phantoms Youth goals. LV Phantoms Youth adheres to USA Hockey's SafeSport Program as a means to help protect its participants from physical abuse, sexual abuse and other types of misconduct, including emotional abuse, bullying, threats, harassment and hazing. To help prevent abuse or misconduct from occurring in our locker rooms, LV Phantoms Youth has adopted the following locker room policy. This policy is designed to maintain personal privacy, reduce the risk of misconduct in locker rooms.
6.3	<p><u>LOCKER ROOM MONITORING</u></p> <p>LV Phantoms Youth has predictable and limited use of locker rooms. To that point, no locker room shall be accessed until 45 minutes prior to any practice; 60 minutes prior to any game. This allows for direct and regular monitoring of locker rooms and better enables the LV Phantoms Youth and the facility to ensure the safety and security of the players and facility. While constant monitoring inside of locker rooms and changing areas might be the most effective way to prevent problems, we understand that this would make some players uncomfortable and may even place LV Phantoms Youth and the facility's staff at risk for unwarranted suspicion or undeserved accusation. For 12U and below, two SafeSport certified adults are expected to be in the room at all times, without exception. For 14U and above, a coach or SafeSport certified Locker Room Monitor will be posted directly outside of the locker rooms during periods of use. Once all are dressed appropriately the door should be propped open only when a coach or manager is not in the room addressing the team. Team personnel will also secure the locker room appropriately during times when the team is on the ice.</p>
6.4	<p><u>PARENTS IN THE LOCKER ROOM</u></p> <p>Except for players at the younger age groups, 10U and below, we discourage parents from entering locker rooms unless it is truly necessary. If a player needs assistance with his or her uniform or gear, if the player is or may be injured, or a player's disability warrants assistance, then we ask that parents let the coach or manager know beforehand that he or she will be helping the player.</p> <p>Naturally, with our youngest age groups it is necessary for parents to assist the players getting dressed. Parents are permitted in the locker room to help these players, only when a SafeSport certified Locker Room Monitor is present. We encourage parents to teach their players as young as possible how to get dressed so that players will learn as early as possible how to get dressed independently. In circumstances where parents are permitted in the locker room, coaches are permitted to ask that the parents leave for a</p>

	short time before the game and for a short time after the game so that the coaches may address the players. As players get older, the coach may in his or her discretion prohibit parents from a locker room.
6.5	<p><u>MIXED GENDER TEAMS</u></p> <p>Some of our teams consist of both male and female players. It is important that the privacy rights of all of our players are given consideration and appropriate arrangements made. Where possible, LV Phantoms Youth will have the male and female players dress/undress in separate locker rooms and then convene in a single locker room before the game or team meeting. Once the game or practice is finished, the players may come to one locker room for a team meeting and then the male and female players proceed to their separate locker rooms to undress and shower, if available. If separate locker rooms are not available, then the players will take turns using the locker room to change. We understand that these arrangements may require that players arrive earlier or leave later to dress but believe that this is the most reasonable way to accommodate and respect all of our players.</p>
6.6	<p><u>EXITING THE LOCKER ROOMS</u></p> <p>As each room will be inspected prior to the next team's entry, all trash should be removed from the floor, benches and hangers and placed into the trash. Simply, the room is to be clean and prepared for the next team without exception. This applies to whether we are at our home rink or visiting any other facility. Any charges incurred as a result of a team's behavior will be billed back to that specific team.</p>

7. Electronics & Social Media Policy

No form of bullying or harassment is acceptable including, but not limited to, the use of electronic or social media. Any violation that has been confirmed will result in a minimum of 1 week suspension for the first offense; 30 day suspension for the second and expulsion for the third without reimbursement.

8. Fundraising Policy

It shall be the policy of the Lehigh Valley Phantoms Youth organization that individual teams will be permitted to fundraise on their own to provide their specific team with funds to play in additional games, practices, tournaments and other team functions. The policy for accounting of and distribution of funds shall be as follows:

- All receipts (original) for the purchase of fundraising material(s) shall be the property of the Lehigh Valley Phantoms Youth and they shall be turned over to the Treasurer of the organization in a timely fashion.
- An accurate accounting of the sales and profit attributed to each team is to be turned over promptly to the Treasurer of the organization.
- All funds are to be held in the name of the Lehigh Valley Phantoms Youth and not by an individual team or individual.
- Player's choosing NOT to participate in fundraising will be required to provide the funds necessary to participate in tournaments and/or additional non-league games.
- Any funds not used by March 15th, will be turned over to the Torchbearer Fund.

9. Additional Policies

9.1 ADDITIONAL PRACTICE/NON-LEAGUE GAME POLICY

It shall be the policy of the Lehigh Valley Phantoms Youth organization to allow individual teams to participate in games and practices above and beyond those funded by the organization. Those games can include additional tournaments. The policy for additional games, tournaments and practices shall be as follows:

- All non-league games are to be scheduled by the team managers in conjunction with the Lehigh Valley Phantoms Youth Scheduler.
- Additional Tournaments may be scheduled by the individual teams but are not to conflict with previously scheduled league and non-league games.
- All additional practices are to be scheduled by the Lehigh Valley Phantoms Youth Scheduler.
- All funds to cover the cost of these games, tournaments and practices will be the responsibility of the individual teams.
- Participation in these games and tournaments is required as part of the team schedule unless the absence is previously discussed/approved by the head coach.
- Funds collected by individual teams to participate in the game(s), tournament(s) and practice(s) are to be turned over to the Lehigh Valley Phantoms Youth Treasurer prior to the game(s), tournament(s) and practice(s).
- All funds are to be held in the name of the Lehigh Valley Phantoms Youth and not by an individual team or individual.
- Payment for additional game(s), tournament(s) and practice(s) are to be made by the Lehigh Valley Phantoms Youth Treasurer.

9.2 **MEDICAL RELEASE POLICY**

If a player seeks medical attention for any injury or illness, the player and / or parent must provide the Head Coach of their team with a doctor's note or release to return to any on ice activities.

Please note that USA Hockey Insurance is an excess policy and members with primary insurance must meet a \$1,000 out-of-pocket expense obligation. Members with no primary insurance must meet a \$3,500 deductible.

9.3 **PLAYING FEE POLICY**

It is the policy of the Lehigh Valley Phantoms Youth that all playing fees shall be established annually by the Executive Board. All such fees shall be payable in accordance with an installment payment schedule established annually by the Board (the "Board Approved Payment Schedule"), with all installments due by November 1st of the then current hockey season.

Any player who is five (5) days late in any payment due to the Organization may be suspended from all on-ice activities until such time as he/she becomes current with respect to the fees owed to the Organization. The Treasurer will inform the President and Coach of the player's team, who will be responsible for enforcement of this rule. Any family who has difficulty meeting the payment schedule may make other payment arrangements with the Treasurer and approved by the Board.

This Playing Fees Policy has been approved by the Executive Board to provide supplementary information to members with regard to playing fees and related matters in accordance with the Lehigh Valley Phantoms Youth Bylaws.

9.4 **FULL EQUIPMENT/PRACTICE POLICY**

It shall be a policy of the Lehigh Valley Phantoms Youth organization that any player participating in practices is required to have full equipment, as per Section 4.3 above. The dangers inherent in the game of hockey preclude players from being on the ice without full equipment. The potential for an injury without full equipment is too dangerous.

9.5 **COACH CONTACT POLICY**

It is the policy of the Lehigh Valley Phantoms Youth that any conversations, and/or contact with a coach shall not take place until after 6:00 p.m. on the Monday following

9.6	<p><u>SUGGESTED ICE TIME MANAGEMENT</u></p> <p>As an organization the Lehigh Valley Phantoms Youth strives to provide all players the opportunity to develop their skills in game situations as well as practice.</p> <p>Coaches are given complete discretion to determine ice time for their players and may increase or decrease an individual player’s game ice time based on skill, work ethic, motivation, and/or disciplinary issues exhibited during practices and games. Use of special teams (power play, penalty kill) may also affect individual playing time.</p> <p>In granting our coaches the discretion to determine individual player ice time, the coaches must take into consideration that the Lehigh Valley Phantoms Youth believes it is unacceptable to have any player sit on the bench for an entire game (goalies excluded), except for disciplinary reasons.</p> <p>At all levels the coach has the discretion to limit an individual’s playing time if it is determined that the risk of injury exists, or for disciplinary reasons.</p>
