

2012 Berks County Chapter of the PA Hall of Fame Inductees



Rick Bausher

Rick Bausher was captain of the basketball team and co-captain of the golf team at Gov. Mifflin, graduating in 1972.

He has taught and coached at Mifflin for 36 years, the last 29 as the head girls basketball coach, compiling a 473-267 record. He is the winningest coach in Berks girls basketball history.

He just directed the Mustangs to the PIAA Class AAA semifinals, and his teams have won seven Berks titles and one District 3 championship.

In golf, he has won BCGA Junior and Partners titles and the Heidelberg Country Club championship.



Katie (Kauffman) Beach

Katie (Kauffman) Beach was a field hockey and track standout at Wilson, graduating in 1992.

She went on to play field hockey at the University of Maryland, where she made the All-American first team in 1994 and '96 and helped the Terrapins win the NCAA title in '93.

She played in the 1996 Olympics in Atlanta, was a member of the U.S. World Cup team in '98 and 2002, and helped the United States win the silver medal in the 1999 Pan-American Games.

She was named the U.S. national field hockey player of the year in 2000.



Keith Bricker

Keith Bricker, a 1978 grad, is the leading scorer in Conrad Weiser basketball history with 2,221 points, which still ranks third in Berks history.

He averaged 28.1 points per game for his career and was the county scoring champion as a junior and senior. He was the Berks player of the year as a senior.

He went on to be a three-year starter at Albright College, earning the Ron Regar Award as the team MVP in 1982.



Doug Dahms

Doug Dahms was a football, wrestling and track standout at Muhlenberg, Class of 1971, and Lebanon Valley College.

He was an assistant football coach at Wilson for 30 years before taking over as head coach in 2006. He has compiled a 68-12 record and won five Lancaster-Lebanon League Section 1 titles in six seasons.

He is in his 22nd season as the head coach of the Wilson boys and girls track teams. He has been named the Berks track coach of the year 17 times.

He has been inducted into the Muhlenberg, Lebanon Valley and Wilson halls of fame.



Stacey (Jack) Edwards

Stacey (Jack) Edwards was the first girls player in Berks scholastic basketball history to score 2,000 points, finishing her Kutztown career with 2,034 in 1983.

She still ranks fifth on the all-time list.

She went on to become an All-Metro section and All-American nominee at Manhattan College, where she scored 1,665 points. She still ranks fourth in career points and career rebounds at the school.

She has been inducted into the Kutztown High School and Manhattan College halls of fame.



Bruce Harbach

Bruce Harbach was a football, basketball and baseball standout at Wilson, Class of 1973, and went on to play football at West Chester University.

His football coaching career has had stops at Reading High, Albright College, Roanoke (Va.) High and Wilson.

He has been the head coach at Lancaster Catholic since 2002, compiling a 104-23 record and winning four District 3 titles and PIAA Class AA championships in 2009 and '11.

He also coached the West Lawn Legion baseball team for five years.



Donyell Marshall

Donyell Marshall graduated from Reading High in 1991 as a McDonald's All-American and All-State first-team selection in basketball after setting the school record with 1,581 career points.

He went on to become a first-team All-American selection and the Big East Player of the Year at the University of Connecticut as a junior in 1994.

He left UConn early and was the No. 4 overall selection in the NBA draft, chosen by the Minnesota

Timberwolves.

He went on to play 15 seasons in the NBA with eight teams, averaging 11.2 points per game for his career. He shares the NBA record for most 3-point field goals in a game (12) with Kobe Bryant.

He is an assistant coach with the Maine Red Claws of the NBA Development League.



Willie Pegram

The late Willie Pegram was Reading High's first All-State first-team basketball selection in 1957 after leading coach Bill Horine's team to a 16-0 Central Penn League record and its third straight District 3 title.

He had 374 points and 364 rebounds as a senior.

He later moved to the Washington, D.C., area and was a top player in its rec leagues.



Joe Reedy

Joe Reedy, a 1980 Central Catholic grad, won the Jack Flowers Award as the top basketball player in the county as a senior after leading the county in scoring with a 27.5 average.

He went on to an outstanding four-year career at Mount St. Mary's College, where he led the team in scoring and rebounding as a junior and senior. He finished with 1,305 points and was named to the Maryland all-state team.

He was inducted into the Mount St. Mary's Hall of Fame in 1995.



Jay Weitzel

Jay Weitzel, a 1950 Wilson grad, won the PIAA golf championship in 1948 and was the District 3 champion in '49.

He also was the No. 2 scorer in Berks basketball as a senior.

He won the Berks Publinx title and was a finalist in the National Junior Chamber of Commerce tournament.

He went on to be the head pro at the Hershey Country Club for 40 years.

He was inducted into the Wilson Sports Hall of Fame in its inaugural class.
