

# Gun Raffle Ticket Fundraiser

Policy Approved July 28, 2024

The Crookston Blue Line Club (CBLC) holds an annual gun raffle fundraiser each season. Fundraising is a necessary effort to grow our program by providing equipment to our players Spring Ice, Our PEP program, and keeping hockey fees reasonable and competitive.

Each CBLC player's family is required to buy/sell 1 \$200 book (10 tickets) per season. Tickets are \$20 per ticket. The cap for each family is \$200. Player levels that are required to sell tickets are Mini-Mites, Mites, 8U, Squirts, 10U, Pewees, 12U & Bantams. Learn to skate are exempt from selling raffle tickets, but families are welcome to if they want to participate in the raffle fundraiser.

If you choose not to participate in selling the raffle tickets, there is a buyout option for \$250. If you choose to do this you will not receive any raffle tickets.

The gun raffle tickets need to be paid for before December 1st. If you need to have a payment plan setup to pay for them, please reach out to the CBLC Executive Director and they can set up a payment plan. Tickets will not be handed out until tickets are paid in full.

Raffle tickets will be distributed at the parents meeting at the beginning of the season for the player's families who have already paid in full, if you miss the parents meeting it is your responsibility to pick up your tickets. Every family will receive a pre-labeled envelope with your tickets inside. The CBLC will try to coordinate with the parent rep of each team to help distribute the tickets if not picked up at the parents meeting.

If the player's family does not sell 10 tickets, the remaining unsold tickets automatically become theirs. It is each CBLC player's family fundraising obligation to contribute to the fundraising raffle each year for each player. You can choose to write in your name on the tickets.

CBLC cannot be responsible for any lost or stolen tickets. Lost or stolen tickets are considered sold tickets and it will be the responsibility of the selling family to pay for these tickets.

A log is kept listing all player's family names and raffle ticket numbers issued to them. Each player's family is responsible for making sure all tickets are returned by return date. By law all the raffle tickets that were printed must be returned to the CBLC whether sold or unsold.

All tickets need to be returned by February 15th. You can drop your tickets off at the South entrance of the arena in the drop box located outside of the CBLC office.

Age restrictions:

Person's under 18 may sell raffle tickets

Persons under 18 may NOT purchase raffle tickets or win a raffle prize. This rule is set by the Minnesota Gambling Control Board.
