TODAY'S GAME

The U.S. National Sled Hockey Team is set to play China here today at WinSport Arena in Calgary in its third and final preliminary-round game of the 2024 World Para Ice Hockey Championship.

Puck drop is set for 1:30 p.m. MT, and the game will live stream on the Paralympics YouTube page.

The winner of today's contest will take the top seed in Group A, earning a bye through the quarterfinals.

The U.S. enters this contest with an unbeaten 17-0-0-0 (W-OTW-OTL-L) record on the season after beating Slovakia, 10-0, and Korea, 11-0, in the opening two games of the 2024 World Para Ice Hockey Championship. The U.S. has outshot its two opponents a combined 51-5.

Team USA is 3-0-0-0 (W-OTW-OTL-L) against China all-time. The U.S. faced off against China once before this season, winning 11-1 in the preliminary round of the 2023 Para Hockey Cup in Quispamsis, New Brunswick, in December.

TALKING POINTS

THE STREAK CONTINUES

The U.S. National Sled Team is currently riding a 39-game winning streak, dating back to the Sled Series vs. Canada in October, 2021. In that span, Team USA has captured gold at the 2022 Paralympic Winter Games, won gold at the 2023 World para Ice Hockey Championship in Moose Jaw, and earned titles at two Para Hockey Cups and two IPH Cups.

FARMER TOPS THE RECORD BOOKS... AGAIN

Declan Farmer (Tampa, Fla.) set a pair of new records for the U.S. National Sled Team in its preliminary round game against Korea on Sunday. After tallying a hat trick and two assists in the contests, Farmer segt new marks for most goals in a single-season in team history (33), and most points in a single season in team history (52).

LAST TIME OUT

Declan Farmer (Tampa, Fla.) notched a hat trick and added two assists, setting new U.S. records for single-season goals (33) and points (52), to help lift the U.S. National Sled Hockey Team to an 11-0 shutout over Korea in its second preliminary round game at the 2024 World Para Ice Hockey Championship on Sunday at WinSport Arena in Calgary.

"We really moved the puck well today," said **David Hoff**, head coach of the U.S. National Sled Hockey Team. "We finished our chances well today too, especially with the way we got out to that strong start in the second period."

Kevin McKee (Davenport, Iowa) was named U.S. Player of the Game in the win, notching a goal and an assist. **Griffin LaMarre** (Haverhill, Mass.) earned the shutout in goal for Team USA.

SPUDS STARES DOWN 200

Team captain and longest-tenured player **Josh Pauls** (Green Brook, N.J.), also known by many as "Spuds", entered the 2024 World Para Ice Hockey Championship with a record 197 career games played.

Today's contest marks his 200th career game played, making him the first player in team history to reach that milestone.

All three preliminary-round games for Team USA will stream live on the Paralympics YouTube page. Broadcast details for quarterfinals, semifinals, and medal-round games will be announced at a later date.

LEADING TEAM USA

David Hoff (Bottineau, N.D.) is in his sixth season as head coach of the U.S. National Sled Hockey Team. In March of 2023, Hoff was named the 2022 Paralympic Coach of the Year by the USOPC. USA Hockey's Northern Plains District Coach-In-Chief, Hoff led the U.S. to an unprecedented fourth-straight Paralympic gold medal at the 2022 Paralympic Winter Games. In his debut season as bench boss, Hoff coached Team USA to a 10-1-0-1 (W-OTW-OTL-L) record, including an undefeated 4-1-0-0 (W-OTW-OTL-L) mark at the 2019 Para Ice Hockey World Championship in Ostrava, Czech Republic. He added a second world championship gold medal to his resume after guiding Team USA to a top-of-the-podium finish at the 2021 IPC Para Ice Hockey World Championship in Ostrava, its record fifth gold medal in world championship history. In his Paralympic debut in 2022, Hoff led Team USA to a perfect 4-0-0-0 (W-OTW-OTL-L) record and the gold medal. In 2023, Hoff led team USA to an unbeaten 16-2-0-0 (W-OTW-OTL-L) record, capped off by winning his third world championship.

Josh Pauls (Green Brook, N.J.), who has helped the U.S. capture the gold medal in the last four Paralympic Winter Games (2010, 2014, 2018, 2022), is serving as captain of the U.S. National Sled Hockey Team. Pauls is in his 16th season with the U.S. National Sled Hockey Team and his seventh as team captain.

TIDBITS



INTERNATIONAL SUCCESS

The defending Paralympic gold medalists and World Para Ice Hockey champions, Team USA has claimed five Paralympic Winter Games gold medals (2022, 2018, 2014, 2010, 2002) and six International Paralympic Committee Sled Hockey World Championship gold medals (2023, 2021, 2019, 2015, 2012, 2009) in addition to ten Para Hockey Cup titles (2023, 2022, 2019, 2018, 2017, 2016 (Dec.), 2016 (Jan.), 2015, 2012, 2009), two International Para Hockey Cup titles (2023, 2022), the 2018 Turin Para Ice Hockey International Tournament and the 2016 IPC Pan-Pacific Championship title.

Since the 2014 Paralympics, the U.S. has skated to a 93-4-1-3 (W-OTW-OTL-L) record across all competitions. The U.S. has captured three Paralympic gold medals and four World Championship gold medals in this span.

USA HOCKEY HAPPENINGS

U.S. WOMEN'S NATIONAL TEAM EARNS SILVER ON HOME SOIL

Mohawk Valley Garden and the city of Utica, New York, hosted the 2024 International Ice Hockey Federation Women's World Championship. The event, which took place April 3-14, 2024, included 29 games and featured the top women's hockey players from across the world. Host venues for the 10-team tournament were the Adirondack Bank Center and Utica University Nexus Center.

Team USA earned its 23rd-straight medal, taking home a silver following a 6-5 overtime loss to Canada in the gold medal game.

The U.S. has made it to the gold-medal game in all 23 of the IIHF Women's World Championships, winning the gold in six of the last nine tournaments (2013, 2015, 2016, 2017, 2019, 2023).

TEAM USA TAKES HOME SILVER AT U-18 MEN'S WORLDS

The U.S. Under-18 Men's National Team took home silver following a 6-4 loss to Canada in the gold medal game at the 2024 IIHF Under-18 Men's World Championship in Finland on Sunday.

The team's silver medal marks the program's 20th all-time medal at the tournament.

James Hagens was named the tournament's Most Valuable Player following a 22-point performance. Hagens received the Directorate Award for Best Forward and Cole Hutson received the Directorate Award for Best Defender. Hagens and Hutson were named to the Media All-Star Team.

U.S. MEN'S NATIONAL TEAM GEARING UP FOR MEN'S WORLDS IN OSTRAVA

The 2024 IIHF Men's World Championship will be played May 10-26, in Ostrava, Czechia & Prague, Czechia. The U.S. Men's National Team will compete in Group B alongside France, Germany, Kazakhstan, Latvia, Poland, Sweden and Slovakia. All Group B games will be played at Ostrava Arena in Ostrava, Czechia, while Group A will take place at Prague Arena in Prague, Czechia.

USA HOCKEY NATIONAL GOALTENDING SYMPOSIUM

The inaugural USA Hockey National Goaltending Symposium will be held May 30-June 2, 2024, in Saint Paul, Minnesota. The four-day event will celebrate goaltending and provide a unique, in-depth educational opportunity for coaches. A star-studded lineup of speakers, including elite-level goalies, goalie coaches and leaders in the industry from across the country, will be featured at the event, which begins at 5 p.m. CT on Thursday, May 30, and ends at 12 p.m. CT on Sunday, June 2.

The Symposium is open to all USA Hockey members who want to learn more about goaltending and coaching the position.

TOYOTA USA HOCKEY WARRIOR NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP

The Ice Vault Arena in Wayne, N.J., played host to the inaugural Toyota USA Hockey Warrior National Championship, April 11-14, 2024. Over 750 players across 34 teams from around the country competed for top warrior hockey honors in the United States.

USA Hockey's Warrior Hockey discipline is dedicated to injured and disabled U.S. military veterans who have served our country and play the sport of ice hockey. To be eligible to compete in Warrior Hockey, participants must have a discharge under honorable conditions with the ability to provide official documentation from their designated branch of service.

TOYOTA USA HOCKEY SLED NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

Expanding in 2024 to include every level of sled hockey, including youth, the Toyota USA Hockey Sled National Championship took place April 18-21, 2024, at the Ice Line Arena in West Chester, Pa.

Over 1,080 players across 60 teams from around the country competed for national championship honors in nine different tiers, including six adult and three youth classifications.

CHIPOTLE-USA HOCKEY NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

A total of 23 champions were crowned from late March to mid-April at the 2024 Chipotle-USA Hockey Girls and Youth National Championships at 10 different host sites across the country. Champions hail from 14 different states.

As part of USA Hockey Girls and Youth Nationals, some 7,000 players have competed for American hockey top honors at various host sites across the United States, culminating into national champions.
