

## Florissant Guidelines

Below is a general outline of the James J. Eagan Ice Rink Renter COVID-19 policy as we prepare to open on October 26<sup>th</sup>. The policy below is subject to change at anytime due to changes in St. Louis County's COVID restrictions, so please be flexible throughout the season with us.

### **Masks**

There will be a strict mask policy for everyone who is not on the ice. This means that while entering the building or walking around the rink you WILL be required to wear a mask. Only when walking to, or when on the ice is when you will not be required to wear a mask.

### **No Showers**

Unfortunately due to St. Louis County COVID-19 guidelines, we are not allowed to let patrons use the showers here. We understand how important this is for you after hockey, so as soon as we get the go ahead from St. Louis County, we will bring these back.

### **Adult Hockey**

The big point here is that "Scrimmages" ARE allowed, but "Games" ARE NOT allowed. The difference between a scrimmage and a game, is a scrimmage is a game played between the same group of people, and a game is played between two different groups of people. Games between two separate groups are currently not allowed.

## **Capacity**

St. Louis County is currently under a 50% capacity restrictions(fire code). This means currently that the ice rink can have a maximum of 150 people.

## **COVID-19 Positive Tests**

If a rink employee tests positive for COVID-19, the ice rink is subject to be closed down to be disinfected. The timeframe of the closure will be dependent on how widespread the exposure is thought to be. If someone in your hockey group tests positive, you need to tell me immediately!! Depending on the case, your group could be asked to cancel rentals in the near future to stop the spread of COVID-19. If this were to happen, you would be refunded in full for ice time not used.
