

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS FOR POST-SEASON PLAY

- What is the post season?
 - For Bantams and Peewees, the post-season will consist of practices during the week, focusing on skills, skating and positional play. Mini games will also be played at practice.
 - For Squirts, the post-season will consist of an in-house league that will have practices during the week and then 3-on-3 games on the weekend. Practices will focus on skills, skating and positional play.
 - The post-season will start the week of March 4 for the Squirt level and the week of March 11 for Peewees and Bantams.
 - The post-season will wrap up towards the end of March.
- How are teams decided?
 - For Squirts, the coaches have gone through and done an evaluation process on each player, based on the regular season. The Squirts will then be divided evenly to make teams with all levels of play mixed together. The teams have been posted to the website, under Teams, then Squirts.
 - Players will be placed into the level of play in which they will participate next season. For example, a second year Squirt will play in the Peewee post-season league.
 - Bantam level players will be mixed each session.
- Are girls included?
 - Girls will be included with the boys, at the appropriate level.
- What jerseys will be used?
 - Tryout jerseys will be handed out.
- Do I have to register my child?
 - No, we are considering this an extension of the regular season registration.
- Does my child have to do the post-season?
 - No, this is optional for any player that wants to continue their season for an additional few weeks. However, we would ask that you contact Kaine Martell if your child will not participate in the post-season so he can make adjustments to teams.
- What is the schedule for the post-season?
 - A schedule is listed on the website, under Teams, then Squirts.
