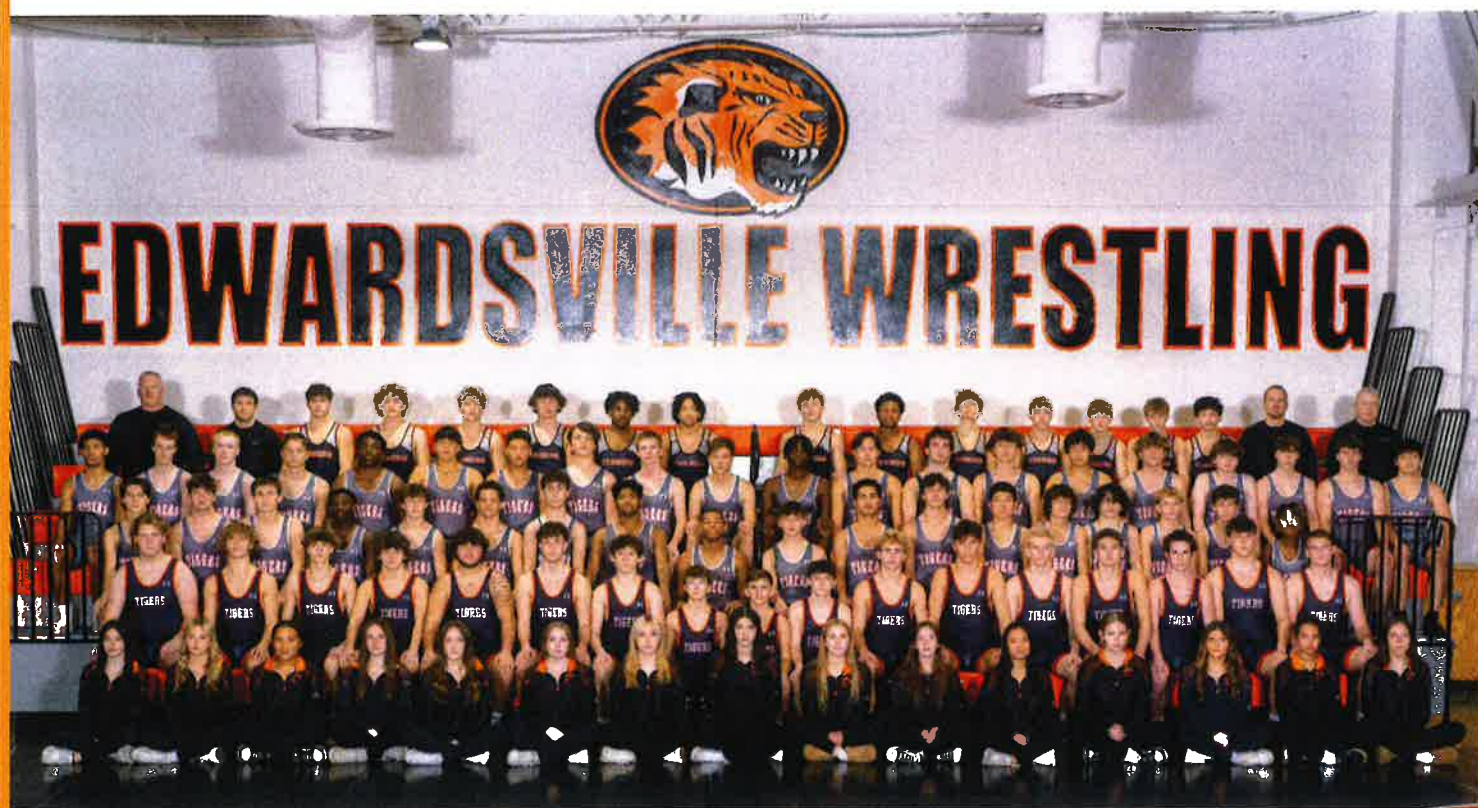
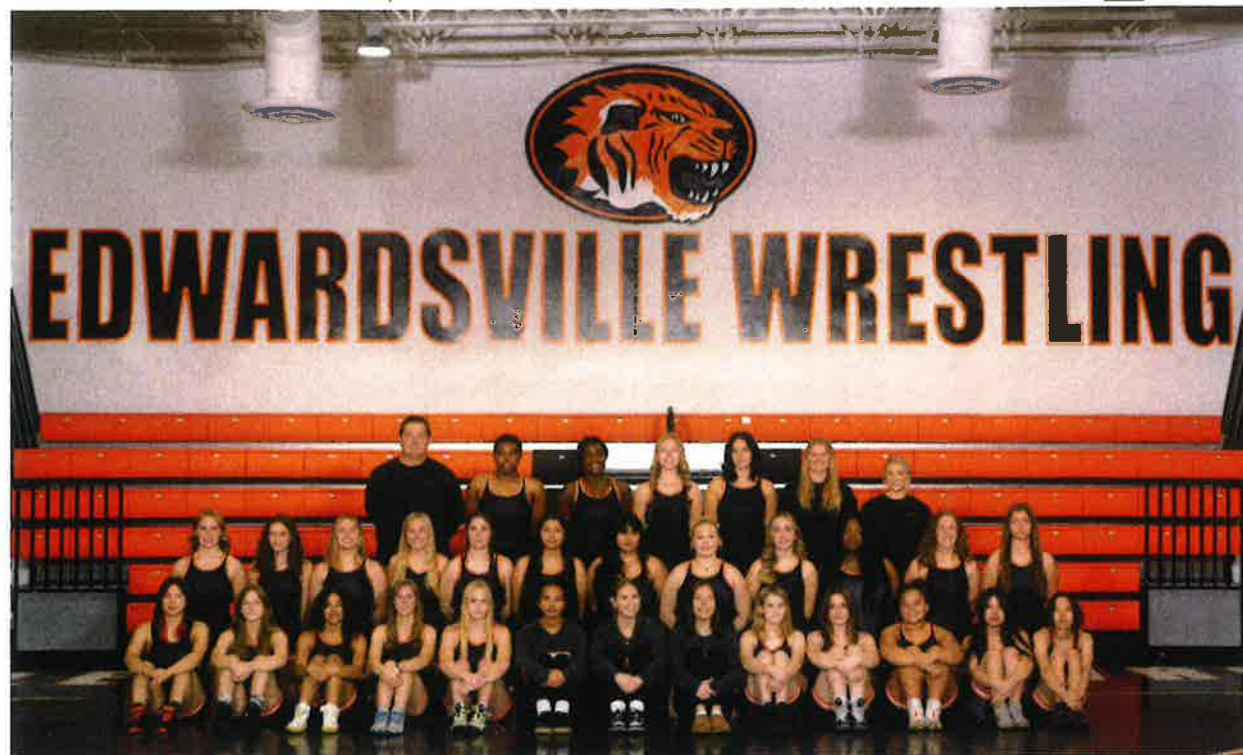

Varsity Overview

Parents, Wrestlers, and Tiger Wrestling Fans welcome to another end of the year celebration where we get to honor our wrestlers. Our theme this was **"Journey over Destination."** Understanding that growth, perseverance, and dedication are just as important as the final results. From the first practice to the last match, our team pushed through grueling workouts, early mornings, and tough competition, never losing sight of the bigger picture. Every takedown, every point scored, and every lesson learned on and off the mat contributed to our progress. Whether it was a hard-fought victory or a tough loss, each experience shaped us into stronger athletes and individuals.

As the season wrapped up, the results speak for themselves. Not just in wins and podium finishes, but in the resilience and camaraderie built along the way. We celebrated personal bests, first-time victories, and the bonds formed through shared struggles and triumphs. While the final matches may mark the end of this journey, the lessons and grit developed throughout the season will carry on far beyond the mat. This journey was about more than just wrestling. It was about pushing limits, overcoming obstacles, and embracing every step of the process.

As a staff, we stress the importance of our vision of the program, **"To compete at a high level against elite competition with integrity"**. We finished the season with a 16-4 record, which resulted in our 14th in a row Southwest Conference Title. Our depth makes conference duals fun because we have the ability to manipulate our line up as needed. It provides opportunities for other wrestlers to get some action. You never know when the next guy up might have a moment to shine. After watching the underclass compete, the future is bright. The Southwest Conference Championship is not something taken for granted but was a goal the wrestlers achieved. The historic Dvorak Tournament was a good litmus test for the wrestlers. The Tigers were able to leave the tournament with Six individual medals and a 5th place finish out of 42 teams. The next stop was the Cheesehead Tournament where every match provided learning opportunities due to the high caliber competition. Michael McNamara and Roman Janek were able to crack the Top 8 to bring home an individual medal. The Columbia Hickman Tournament allowed for the wrestlers to let it fly, knowing Regionals were right around the corner. We left Columbia Hickman with a Second Place Team Finish with countless individual medals. We entered post-season where we were able to host the Regional Tournament at the historic Lincoln Gym. The goal of the entire season is to progress as a wrestler and peak during post-season. That is what we saw in Edwardsville that day. The Tigers were able to put 10 wrestlers into the Finals, with crowning Eight Individual Champions. However, it took all 14 wrestlers fighting for each other to score team points to win yet another Team Regional Championship. With there only being four Sectionals for 3a division, there is nothing but barn burner of matches every time you step on the mat. Even though some wrestlers' individual season ended that weekend, they competed at a high level against elite competition with integrity. Michael McNamara, Ryan Richie, Simon Schulte, and Roman Janek punched their ticket to the IHSA State Championship by placing top 4, to be able to call themselves top 16 in the entire state of Illinois. Ryan Richie took 5th place, Simon Schulte took 6th place, and Roman Janek took 4th place at the IHSA State Tournament. This was the first time that Edwardsville has more than two placers at the State Tournament.

The season was not over as we wrestled Lincoln Way East at Dual Team Sectionals. Before that dual started, I asked the 21 wrestlers who were on the roster to do one thing, when they walk off the mat to be able to look the seniors in the eye and say they left it all out there. Going down to the last match we were down 29-30. It took the 13 guys before the last match to put ourselves in position to win the dual. Blake Mink fought off a hard shot in the beginning of that match, from then on he was not going to be denied. Blake ended the match with a tech/pin for win the dual 35-29 for the team to become Sectional Champions. Even though Friday night at Dual Team State did not end the way we wanted, the boys fought hard and proud of them. They are the 5th team to make it to Dual Team State and get to call themselves Elite 8.

Tonight we will be saying goodbye to our Senior class. Even though we are graduating eight senior boys, the impact they had on our program will be everlasting. Their coachability, work ethic, and love for Edwardsville Wrestling is immeasurable. I am excited to see where your journey takes them, but know that they will always have a home with Edwardsville Wrestling. This is a challenge to the underclass on who is going to step up. Your actions will have to match your words. If I can leave you with one word, it would be **Consistency**. Excited for the work and growth you are going to put into the off-season.

Thank you to all the wrestlers and parents for entrusting us with the opportunity to coach. It is not something that we take lightly and are truly honored to do so. Remember that journeys are rarely the same and comparison can be the thief of joy. You will have highs and lows on journey, but know that as long as you are part of Edwardsville Wrestling you will never be on that journey alone. **Tiger Style**

Year four of Girls Wrestling has just completed!!!! As we will discuss tonight, we have our first 4 year wrestlers completing their career who started as Freshmen. Our season was full of highlights, learning experiences, growth, and fun and laughs. It continues to be a joy to watch the development of the girls, our wrestling program, and girls wrestling growth around the country. Our participation increased to 25 girls completing the season. Along with the increase in numbers continues the increase in commitment and dedication. With our combination of experience and new girls, all of them took the opportunity to get better in their skills.

The girl's wrestling schedule was once again full of competition, as we participated in 6 regular season tournaments, including – Granite City, Pontiac "The Munch", Wonderwoman, Oswego East, Anna Jonesboro, and our own 618 tourney. This year's team not only competed in all these, but brought home 5 Championship team trophies. On top of that, we were also crowned both Regional and Sectional Champions in the post season. These tourneys along with Dual wins over North Pointe and Seckman in Missouri, made for a fun and successful season.

This year the IWCOA introduced the first ever Girl's Dual Team State Tournament, held in Hoffman Estates. Through a selection process, we were one of 16 teams invited to the event and the only Team South of Chicago. We finished 4 and 2 in the event, capturing 5th place in the State..... It was a highly competitive event and showed how much fun the duals can be.

This year's post season just ended, and it's been a competitive 5 weeks. We won the regional and sent 11 girls on to the Sectional tournament in Highland. Out of the Highland sectional, we tied the school record for girls in 6 State Qualifiers, including 2 Sectional Champions in Holly Zugmaier and Emma Rogers. Only Tinley Park Coop had more State Qualifiers than us. It was a great experience for the girls at State, with Emma and Holly both making the medal stand, placing 6th in their weight class. Awesome job!!!

25 girls in the program also brings 25 different personalities, and it is just an awesome thing to see girls reach out and help their teammates on and off the mat. Team comradery can be the main ingredient in having a successful program and the girls did great with this during the season.

As with the boys, we want to celebrate the great season, but not be satisfied. We will be losing three (3) great Seniors – Gianna, Madison, and Holly, but the cupboard is not empty. We will have many returners and next year looks to be just as successful. The goal is to continue to climb the ladder to even more success, while still having fun and learning life lessons. This can only be done with continued training and belief. I challenge all the girls to stay active in the sport, and let's see if we can even climb farther next season.

Lastly, I am so thankful for my wonderful assistant coach Carly Foster, and all of her dedication and guidance in developing these girls. None of this success is possible without her. In JV level tournaments we placed as follows: 1st at the Francis Howell North Tournament, 1st at the Jerseyville Meat Grinder, 1st at the Lindbergh JV Dual Team Tournament, and finally 1st place at the Southwestern Conference Tournament. We also sent our Underclass squad to the Hallsville Varsity Tournament and placed a very respectable 3rd place. Also, a big thanks to Coach Matarelli for finding matches for as many of our kids as possible. With the low numbers in other programs, and ours having great numbers it can be difficult getting kids matches. Coach Matarelli works very hard to get exhibition matches and rotate kids as much as possible to get all our kids competing!

Overall, all these young men did a great job all season long competing at a high level knowing in some cases they were being asked to wrestle opponents two years older than them and in some cases a weight class above. They showed toughness, grit, confidence and trust in our staff that we were putting them in the right situations to not only grow as wrestlers but preparing them individually for future success in our program.

We would like to thank the parents of all the wrestlers for supporting their sons this season, without your support it would be very difficult to be the program we are today. We appreciate the time you allow us to spend with your sons and helping you mold them into great young men of character on and off the mat.
