The traditional DH

A DH or P/DH must be declared on the lineup card during the pre-game conference. They cannot be added once game starts.

DH can bat for ANY player & bat anywhere in the batting order.

A sub can replace the DH (RUTH) and become the new DH.

DH (RUTH) can re-enter once as the DH (same as any player).

The DH, and the player they are batting for, are **LOCKED IN THE BATTING ORDER.**

Ruth may only hit in the 4th slot. Any future DH may only hit in the 4th slot and Davis may only hit in the 4th slot.

If the DH (RUTH) plays the field the DH role is done for the game.

If DAVIS bats or pinch-runs, the DH role is done for the game.

A player may NOT courtesy run for Calvin(DH) because Calvin is not a PITCHER when he is on offense. He is a DH.

A sub can replace Calvin(P) on defense and still use a DH.

The DH can both hit & play at ANY POSITION – not just F1.

IF ANY OTHER POSITION IS playing defense AND DH-ing FOR HIMSELF that player CAN re-enter or change positions.

The DH role is terminated by either of two actions:
 1) Calvin(DH) is subbed for IN ANY WAY ON OFFENSE.
 2) A sub or former sub for Calvin (P) or (DH) plays any part on offense.
