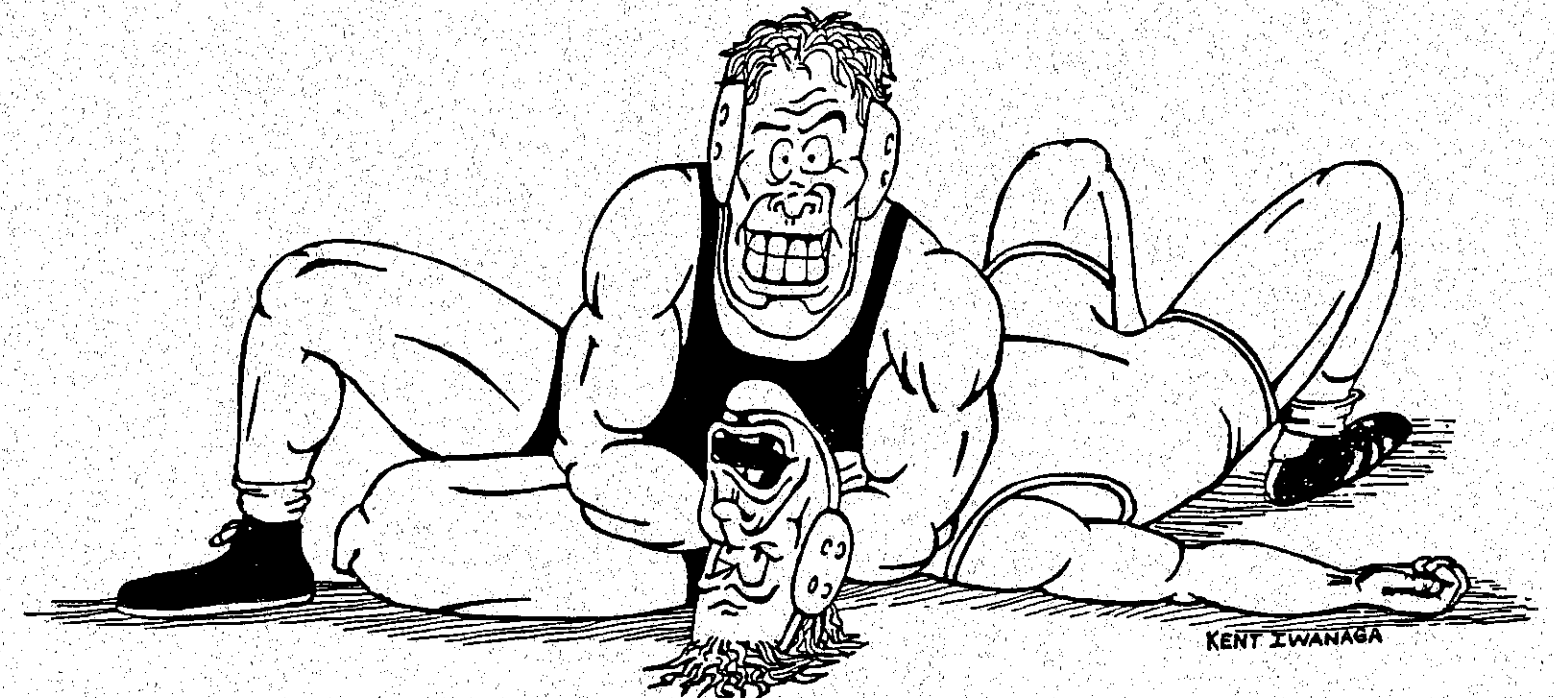

Fondy freshman earns spot in 119 semifinals

MADISON — When wrestling practice began back in November, Fond du Lac freshman Brandon McNab hoped just to have a chance for one WIAA State Tournament match.

Now the Sabish Junior High School ninth grader finds himself in the Division 1 119-pound semifinals at the University of Wisconsin Field House.

McNab earned a takedown 24 seconds into overtime to eke out a 3-1 decision over Durand Brown of River Falls in Thursday's quarterfinals to set up a semifinal showdown today with Wauwatosa East/West's Andy Welnetz, a 5-2 quarterfinal winner over Racine Park's Neil Pope.

The semifinal round is set to begin at 5:30 p.m. at the Field House. Welnetz (34-1) is the cousin of former Cardinal state qualifiers Bruce, Ryan and Steve Welnetz.

In other Thursday matches involving Cardinals, Yoshi Yanagawa used eight takedowns to beat Kettle Moraine's Ben Schlueter 17-11 in a 130-pound preliminary, but surrendered a takedown with four seconds left and dropped a 4-3 quarterfinal decision to Wausau West's Jake Saari, while Jason Feudner was nipped 3-2 by Stoughton's Tim Klubertanz in a 135 opener.

"I never expected to get this far," said McNab, who improved his record to 31-8 with his 13th straight win. "I just wanted to make it here and maybe get a match or two."

McNab started the day with a 9-5 win over Shawano's Chris Herm to set up the meeting with Brown. He gave up an escape to fall behind 1-0, but tied the match when Brown was called for stalling with four seconds remaining.

He used his experience as a national junior Greco Roman champion to counter Brown's headlock attempt and gain the winning takedown in overtime.

"After he got the stalling point, I knew it was all mine," he said.

In both of his matches, McNab fought over strong first-period takedown attempts.

"He got caught a couple of times and wrestled out of it," Cardinal coach Larry Marchionda observed after McNab's first match. "I knew the longer the match, the more confident he would feel. He took his best shots right away. He knows his wrestling. He took over."

After a year at Goodrich, he decided to stay in the United States. Because of WIAA rules, he was forced to sit out a year, but rejoined the team this season.

"I like it here — there's no crime and it's peaceful," said Yanagawa, a native of the Tokyo suburb of Maebashi. "I love Fond du Lac."

After school ends in June, Yanagawa plans to return to Japan to attend college, possibly majoring in international business.

Before that, however, Yanagawa (31-8) has a chance to wrestle back to fifth place. He was to face Racine Park's Robert Urban (27-6) this morning.

■ OH, SO CLOSE: Feudner fell behind after giving up a reversal to Klubertanz eight seconds into the second period of their match.

However, he closed within 2-1 when Klubertanz was whistled for stalling later in the period. He tied the match with a hip-heist escape midway through the period and gained what appeared to be the winning takedown just before the buzzer, but the referee ruled the move came after time expired.

"I thought he had it with one second left," said Marchionda. "We looked over and thought 'oh yeah.'"

FDL hopes to learn against the best

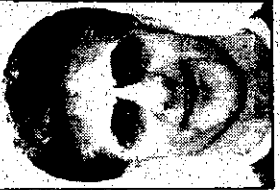

Rural Athens High School has just 186 students, but in state wrestling circles, the Blue Jays are considered giants. The defending WIAA Division 3 state champions are currently ranked No. 2 in the nation by USA

Wrestling Magazine and coming off a strong showing in the Midwest Classic Tournament at Columbus, Ohio, where they finished second to top-rated Stow (Ohio) Walsh Jesuit.

Athens, which has won 17 consecutive Marawood Conference titles, will be a heavy favorite when the 31st annual Badger State Invitational gets underway Tuesday at the University of Wisconsin Field House.

"The thing that makes the Badger State so attractive is that it has the best teams in all divisions in one big tournament," said Fond du Lac coach Larry Marchionda, whose Cardinals will join Athens and two-time defending Division 1 state champion Merrill in the one-day, 17-team tournament. "And not only that, it will have one the best teams in the nation in Athens."

Marchionda said the Bluejays are strong because coach Jerry Wagner, who founded the school's program in 1962, teaches an on-the-mat style that confounds opponents.

"I think Athens' wrestling style is very difficult for high school wrestlers to cope with — it's a completely different style," he said. "I've actually seen an Athens wrestler go straight to the mat. If there is a weakness with them, it's in the neutral po-

sition. But they're very strong on the mat."

With a team returning just one placewinner — fourth-place heavyweight Peter Ringhand — from last year's tournament where the Cardinals placed sixth, one might think Marchionda is throwing his young team to the wolves. But the coach doesn't feel that way. It's all part of a learning process, he said.

"We develop our schedule with a different philosophy than most teams," Marchionda explained. "You're only allowed so many competitions a season. We want to be teaching early. If teams schedule competitions early, they sit in January. We spend the early time teaching and drilling. We know that will affect us now, but we're not concerned. We're looking down the road.

"It helps us all," he said of this week's tournament. "As coaches it helps us find the areas we need to work on. It's helpful for the wrestlers because they get to wrestle the best in the state. That helps them to evaluate themselves and to redevelop their goals."

A prime example of that philosophy is Cardinal sophomore Jeremy Barthels. As a freshman last year, he admits the atmosphere may have gotten the best of him. He went 3-2 as a 119-pounder and didn't

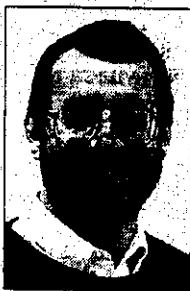

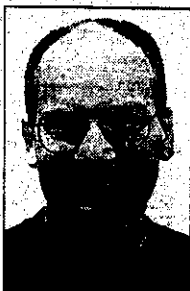
