### COVID Procedures & Protocols

This document is to remind all that **we as parents and coaches have an enormous responsibility to make the correct and appropriate decisions** when it comes to the virus and sending your child to the skills session and games. Please do not send him/her if they have any symptoms, if someone in close contact is waiting for a result or has tested positive-see our COVID protocol for more detail. **We are all counting on each other during this time** and we owe it to our children/all other families to be responsible and safe.

Our Haverhill Travel Basketball Program will continue to follow COVID protocols outlined by the CDC, Haverhill Public Schools, Mass and the NH Guidelines along with the RVL and MVL we are participating in.

- Upon entering each practice and game facility, you are confirming that no one is experiencing any of the following symptoms in your household. Fever, respiratory symptoms such as runny nose, sore throat, or shortness of breath. Not experiencing any flu like symptoms such as muscle aches, chills, or severe fatigue.
- In addition, if you answer yes to any of the below questions, please contact HTB to discuss your child attending practice or games.
  - Have you or anyone in your household confirmed positive for COVID-19 in the last 30 days?
  - Are you or anyone in your household awaiting COVID-19 test results due to potential exposure to the virus?
  - Do you have COVID-19 symptoms: a fever of 100.0 or higher, difficulty breathing, headache, sore throat, nausea?
  - Have you been asked to quarantine by a doctor or health official within the last 14 days?
- Temperature checks will be taken prior to entry for games entry per the league and facility where games are being played. Any players, coaches or spectators with a temperature above 100.0 will not be allowed admittance into the facility. HTB will not be taking temperatures before our skill development practice.

For league games and skills practices:

- Coaches, players, and spectators are required to wear a mask upon entering all facilities for games and skills practice.
- For skills practice, we will be taking attendance of all players for potential contact tracing and communication to families

- Players will be required to wear a mask while practicing and during games along with sitting on the bench during games. Lowering of mask can be done when drinking water on the bench.
- Players will be required to sanitize upon entering/exiting practice, HTB will have for the players.
- Once the practice or game has ended teams and spectators must immediately round up belongings and head outside.
- In facilities where allowed, 1 parent/spectator will be allowed to watch games. Do not bring siblings to attend league games. Parents attending must wear a mask and remain 6ft apart. Millworks does not allow spectators.
- As the season progresses updates or changes may be made in regards to HTB protocols and league play.

Additional protocol:

- Please be aware that in the event a player does test positive, the entire team may in fact have to quarantine in addition to the player. This may also apply to the team played in a league game as well.
- If a classmate of a player in the same homeroom/class is exposed to a positive case of COVID, the player must quarantine for 14 days from the day of last contact and produce a negative test result.
- If a player has a family member or person in the same household test positive for COVID, the player must quarantine for 14 days from the day of last contact and produce a negative test result.
- If you have a sibling from the same household of a player whose team is impacted by the virus, they are not allowed to attend skills, games or shooting clinics. To be more detailed, if you have a player who was on a team who is in quarantine or waiting for a test result, they are not allowed to participate in HTB activities until negative results are shown and the protocol is followed. In addition, this holds true if a parent of a household is waiting for test results.
- If you, your child or anyone in the household is awaiting a COVID test result, the player is not allowed to attend any games, practice or clinic.
- As a program, we will continue to take each situation or exposure on a case by case basis and follow the revised 7, 10, 14 day quarantine guidelines.
