LAST TIME OUT

Led by five different goalscorers and a shutout from **Aerin Frankel**, the U.S. Olympic Women's Ice Hockey Team punched its ticket to the 2026 Olympic Winter Games gold medal game with a 5-0 semifinal victory over Sweden. Frankel finished the game with 23 saves, recording her third shutout of the tournament, becoming the first goaltender in Olympic women's hockey history to do so.

QUICK SHOTS

TODAY'S MATCH UP

Today's game marks the gold medal game of the 2026 Olympic Winter Games. The U.S. enters the contest at 6-0-0-0 (W-OTW-OTL-L), having advanced to the gold medal game after a 5-0 victory over Sweden. A win today would mark the first time since 1998 that the team went undefeated in route to a gold medal.

ALL TIME AGAINST CANADA

When the two teams take the ice tonight, it will be the 12th all-time meeting between the U.S. and Canada at the Olympics. The U.S. is 3-1-1-6 against Canada in Olympic contests.

LAST TIME AGAINST CANADA

These two teams met nine days ago on Feb. 10 in the final game of the preliminary round. **Hannah Bilka** scored twice and **Aerin Frankel** posted a 20-save shutout to lead the U.S. to a 5-0 victory. With the win, Team USA clinched the top overall seed heading into the playoffs.

IN THE GOLD MEDAL GAME

Today marks the seventh time the U.S. has skated in the gold medal game at the Olympics. All time the U.S. is 2-4 in gold medal games having won gold in 1998 and 2018.

EIGHTH STRAIGHT MEDAL FOR TEAM USA

Regardless of today's outcome, the U.S. will go home with a medal, marking the eighth straight Olympic Winter Games that Team USA has medaled in women's hockey. The red, white and blue have medaled in every Olympics that women's hockey has been staged.

KNIGHT TIES U.S. OLYMPIC GOAL RECORD

Forward Hilary Knight's second period goal against Finland on Saturday marked her 14th career Olympic score, tying the American record for goals at the Olympics. Natalie Darwitz and Katie King also have 14 career Olympic goals.

KNIGHT TIES U.S. OLYMPIC POINT RECORD

With an assist on Team USA's first goal of the night against Canada, Hilary Knight registered her 32nd career Olympic point, tying Jenny Potter for most points by an American at an Olympics.

FRANKEL BREAKS TOURNAMENT SHUTOUT RECORD

Aerin Frankel recorded her third shutout of the tournament on Monday, following a 23-save shutout against Sweden, setting a new Olympic record for most shutouts in one tournament. The record was previously two shutouts set by seven goaltenders previously.

FIVE-STRAIGHT SHUTOUTS

Team USA's defense has posted five straight shutout performances, holding Finland, Switzerland, Canada, Italy and Sweden off the scoresheet. The last time an opponent scored on the U.S. was 8:37 into the second period of the opening game against Czechia. The U.S. has outscored opponents, 31-1.

TEAM USA AT A GLANCE

ROSTER BREAKDOWN

The 2026 U.S. Olympic Women's Ice Hockey Team features 23 players, 13 forwards, seven defenders and three goaltenders, and boasts 21 returnees from the 2025 U.S. Women's National Team that took home gold at the 2025 IIHF Women's World Championship in April. Eleven of the 23 have prior Olympic experience.

CAPTAIN AMERICA

Hilary Knight (Sun Valley, Idaho) is the captain of Team USA for the 2026 Olympic Winter Games. Forward **Alex Carpenter** (North Reading, Mass.) and defender **Megan Keller** (Farmington Hills, Mich.) are alternate captains.

BEHIND THE BENCH

John Wroblewski is the head coach of the 2026 U.S. Olympic Women's Ice Hockey Team. **Shari Dickerman**, **Brent Hill** and **Josh Sciba** are serving as assistant coaches, while **Alli Altmann** is the team's goaltending coach.

2026 OLYMPIC WINTER GAMES

The U.S. Olympic Women's Ice Hockey Team is one of 10 teams competing at the 2026 Olympic Winter Games from February 6-22 in Milan, Italy.

The tournament features ten teams divided into two groups of five. Team USA is competing in Group A alongside, Canada, Czechia, Switzerland and Finland. Group B includes Germany, France, Italy, Japan and Sweden. Each group will play a single round-robin series before the playoff round.

OLYMPIC SUCCESS

The U.S. has earned a medal at every Olympics where women's hockey was staged, winning two golds, four silvers and one bronze.

GOLDEN RETURNEES FROM THE 2018 OLYMPICS

Six players were on the ice the last time the U.S. won gold at an Olympic Winter Games in 2018 in PyeongChang. Those returnees include **Cayla Barnes, Kendall Coyne Schofield, Megan Keller, Hilary Knight, Kelly Pannek** and **Lee Stecklein**.

2014 U.S. OLYMPIC TEAM RETURNEES

Only four players remain from the 2014 U.S. Olympic Women's Ice Hockey Team that took home silver in Sochi - **Alex Carpenter, Kendall Coyne Schofield, Hilary Knight** and **Lee Stecklein**.

ONE PLAYER REMAINS FROM THE 2010 OLYMPICS

Hilary Knight is the lone player on the team that skated at the 2010 Olympic Winter Games in Vancouver.

2025 WOMEN'S WORLDS RETURNEES

The 2026 U.S. Olympic Women's Ice Hockey Team includes 21 players from the 2025 U.S. Women's National Team that took home gold at the most recent international tournament, the 2025 IIHF Women's World Championship in April. The group includes **Cayla Barnes, Alex Carpenter, Kendall Coyne Schofield, Britta Curl-Salemme, Joy Dunne, Laila Edwards, Aerin Frankel, Caroline Harvey, Taylor Heise, Tessa Janecke, Megan Keller, Hilary Knight, Ava McNaughton, Abbey Murphy, Kelly Pannek, Gwyneth Philips, Hayley Scamurra, Kirsten Simms, Lee Stecklein, Haley Winn** and **Grace Zumwinkle**.

KNIGHT EARNS RECORD FIFTH OLYMPIC NOD

Forward **Hilary Knight** is skating in her fifth Olympic Games here in Milan, after competing in 2022, 2018, 2014 and 2010, winning a medal in every Olympics she's participated in. Knight is the first American, man or woman, to represent Team USA in five Olympics in ice hockey, and the sixth woman ever to skate in five Olympics.

COYNE SCHOFIELD AND STECKLEIN SKATE IN FOURTH GAMES

Forward **Kendall Coyne Schofield** and defender **Lee Stecklein** are skating in their fourth Olympic Games. Both have won three previous medals, gold in 2018 and silver in 2022 and 2014.

FOUR PLAYERS REPRESENTING U.S. AT THIRD OLYMPICS

Cayla Barnes, Megan Keller, Kelly Pannek and **Alex Carpenter** all return to the Olympic stage for the third time in their careers. All four have won a medal in each of the Olympics they've skated in.

FOUR RETURN TO OLYMPIC STAGE FOR SECOND GAMES

Caroline Harvey, Grace Zumwinkle, Hayley Scamurra and **Abbey Murphy** are all back on the U.S. Olympic Women's Hockey Team for the second time. All four represented the U.S. previously at the Olympic Winter Games in Beijing back in 2022, taking home silver.

12 OLYMPIC NEWCOMERS SET TO MAKE DEBUT

Twelve players on the U.S. Olympic Women's Ice Hockey Team are set to make their Olympic debut in Milan, including, **Rory Guldlay, Haley Winn, Kirsten Simms, Laila Edwards, Britta Curl-Salemme, Tessa Janecke, Hannah Bilka, Joy Dunne, Taylor Heise, Ava McNaughton, Aerin Frankel** and **Gwyneth Philips**.

ALL 23 PLAYERS BOAST INTERNATIONAL EXPERIENCE

All 23 players on the team have represented Team USA on the international stage prior, skating in at least one IIHF Women's World Championship prior to the Olympic Winter Games.

EDWARDS MAKES HISTORY

Defender **Laila Edwards** became the first black woman to represent the United States in women's hockey at the Olympic Winter Games when she took to the ice Feb. 5 against Czechia. She previously made history as the first black woman to skate for the U.S. Women's National Team at an international event when she represented the U.S. at the 2024 IIHF Women's World Championship.

WROBLEWSKI'S FINGER PRINTS ON TEAM USA

Head coach **John Wroblewski** became the head coach of the U.S. Women's National Team in August 2022 and has won two golds and two silvers at the IIHF Women's World Championship since. Prior, Wroblewski was the head coach of the USA Hockey National Team Development Program from 2016-2020, where he coached numerous future NHL players, including **Matt Boldy, Jack Hughes, Quinn Hughes** and **Brady Tkachuk**, all members of the 2026 U.S. Olympic Men's Ice Hockey Team.

COLLEGE CONNECTION

All 23 athletes on the Team USA roster have competed or are currently competing as women's hockey student-athletes at a U.S. college or university. Six players have ties to the University of Wisconsin, five players have ties to the University of Minnesota, four players with Boston College and Northeastern University ties, three for Ohio State and one for both Clarkson, Cornell and Penn State. In total, eight different schools have representation on the team.

PATTY KAZMAIER MEMORIAL AWARD HONOREES

Four members of the team have been honored with the Patty Kazmaier Memorial Award, bestowed annually to the best women's player in NCAA Division I college hockey: **Taylor Heise** (2022), **Aerin Frankel** (2021), **Kendall Coyne Schofield** (2016) and **Alex Carpenter** (2015).

U18 WOMEN'S WORLD CHAMPIONSHIP ALUMNI

A total of 19 players on the 2026 U.S. Olympic Women's Ice Hockey Team represented the U.S. at an IIHF Under-18 Women's World Championship, including **Cayla Barnes, Hannah Bilka, Alex Carpenter, Kendall Coyne Schofield, Britta Curl-Salemme, Joy Dunne, Laila Edwards, Rory Guldlay, Caroline Harvey, Taylor Heise, Tessa Janecke, Megan Keller, Ava McNaughton, Abbey Murphy, Kelly Pannek, Kirsten Simms, Lee Stecklein, Haley Winn** and **Grace Zumwinkle**. Dunne was most recently on the U18 team in 2023.

WNT ALUM TAKES DEVELOPMENT ROLE

U.S. Women's National Team alum **Ellen Hughes** has been on staff of the U.S. Women's National Team in a development role since October 2023, serving as a player development consultant. Hughes played on the 1992 U.S. Women's National Team, and is also the mother of U.S. Olympic Men's Ice Hockey Team members **Jack Hughes** and **Quinn Hughes**.

PWHL REPRESENTATION

Five of the eight PWHL teams are represented on Team USA's roster, with six players on the Minnesota Frost leading the way. Four players play for the Seattle Torrent, three for the Boston Fleet, two for the Ottawa Charge and one for the Montreal Victorie.

SPANNING GENERATIONS

Team USA spans generations with a 16-year age difference between the youngest and oldest player on the team. **Joy Dunne** is the youngest at 20 and **Hilary Knight** is the oldest at 36.

FIRST TEXAS NATIVE TO MAKE AN OLYMPIC TEAM

Forward **Hannah Bilka** is the first player from the state of Texas to represent the United States in women's hockey at the Olympics. Bilka hails from Coppel, Texas, right outside of Dallas.

FIRST PENNSYLVANIA NATIVE TO MAKE AN OLYMPIC TEAM

Goaltender **Ava McNaughton** is the first player from Pennsylvania to take the ice for Team USA in women's hockey at the Olympics. She is from Seven Fields, Pennsylvania, a suburb of Pittsburgh.

OLYMPIC MOM

Forward **Kendall Coyne Schofield** is the first mom to skate for Team USA at the Olympics since Jenny Potter did so in 2010. Coyne Schofield gave birth to her son Drew in July 2023.

TALL AND SMALL

There is an 11 inch height difference between the tallest player on the team and the shortest. **Laila Edwards** measures in at 6-1, while **Kendall Coyne Schofield** and **Cayla Barnes** measures in at 5-2.

JOHN WROBLEWSKI, HEAD COACH

John Wroblewski is serving as the head coach of the 2026 U.S. Olympic Women's Ice Hockey Team after leading Team USA since August 2022. Wroblewski has led the U.S. to two golds (2025, 2023) and two silvers (2024, 2022) at the IIHF Women's World Championship.

Wroblewski joined the U.S. Women's National Team following two years (2020-22) as the head coach of the Ontario (Calif.) Reign, the AHL affiliate of the LA Kings, and four seasons (2016-20) as the bench boss of the USA Hockey National Team Development Program.

Over his four years with the NTDP, the program reached its first USHL playoff berth since 2012 and finished top-three in all 12 international tournaments played. He led his team to 33-consecutive international victories from 2016-18, and also oversaw the development of 29 NHL Draft picks, including Jack Hughes, who was selected first overall by the New Jersey Devils in 2019.

At the IIHF level, Wroblewski guided the U.S. Under-18 Men's National Team twice, resulting in a gold in 2017 and bronze in 2019.

The Neenah, Wisconsin, native began his coaching career as an intern assistant coach with the NTDP and was promoted to a full-time assistant coach the following season, a position he held from 2008-10.

Wroblewski, a player on the inaugural NTDP roster in 1997, skated four years with the University of Notre Dame (1999-2003). He went on to play four years (2003-07) professionally with the ECHL's Fresno Falcons, recording 125 points (65-60) in 273 career games.

ASSISTANT COACHES

SHARI DICKERMAN, ASSISTANT COACH

Shari Dickerman is returning as an assistant coach for the U.S. Women's National Team at the 2026 Olympic Winter Games, after serving in the same capacity since the 2022-23 season.

Dickerman, who is in her second season as head coach at Minnesota State University, previously served as assistant coach of the 2022 U.S. Collegiate Women's Select Team, that competed at the 2022 Collegiate Series against Canada in August. Prior to her appointment to the USA Hockey staff, Dickerman served as an evaluator at numerous USA Hockey camps.

A member of the Mavericks staff since 2009, Dickerman has helped lead Minnesota State for the last 15 seasons and was named head coach in March 2024.

As a player, Dickerman was an All-American goaltender for the Mavericks.

BRENT HILL, ASSISTANT COACH

Brent Hill is returning as an assistant coach for the U.S. Women's National Team during 2026 Olympic Winter Games, after serving in the same capacity since the 2022-23 season.

Hill is currently serving as an assistant coach of the Quinnipiac Women's Ice Hockey team, a role he's held for the last three seasons.

Hill was on the bench as an assistant coach for the 2015 U.S. Under-18 Women's World Championship, leading the squad to a gold medal at the 2015 IIHF Under-18 Women's World Championship.

Prior to Quinnipiac, Hill spent four seasons at the helm of Bishop Kearny Selects Academy, following a season as an assistant coach at Merrimack University and four seasons as an assistant coach at RPI.

JOSH SCIBA, ASSISTANT COACH

Josh Sciba is reprising his role on the U.S. Women's National Team staff during the 2026 Olympic Winter Games, after serving in the same capacity since the 2022-23 season.

As an assistant coach, Sciba helped lead the U.S. Under-18 Women's National Team to a gold medal at the 2022 IIHF Under-18 Women's World Championship, after serving in the same capacity for the 2019 U.S. Under-18 Women's National Team.

Sciba is in his second season as assistant coach for the New York Sirens, following a six-year stint as head coach of Union College.

As a player, Sciba was a member of the USA Hockey National Team Development Program from 2001-03, prior to playing four years at the University of Notre Dame.

ALLI ALTMANN, GOALTENDING COACH

Alli Altmann returns as the goaltending coach of the U.S. Women's National Team after serving on the U.S. Women's National Team staff for the last four seasons (2021-2025).

Altmann also guided the U.S. Under-18 Women's National Team for four seasons, having served in the goaltending coach role from 2017-22. She guided the U.S. to two golds and two silvers during that time.

Altmann is currently the co-owner and vice president of DEVENIR Goaltenders. She played four seasons for Minnesota State University, recording a career .901 save percentage.
