

## 2022 Distinguished Service Award

Mick McCabe



Mick McCabe is recognized as an advocate, defender, and a devoted fan for his commitment to school sports and the coaching community. Mack has been selected as the 2022 recipient of the MHSCA “Jack Johnson Distinguished Service Award.

Mick McCabe was born in Allen Park, Michigan and graduated from Allen Park Cabrini High School and then graduated from University of Detroit before embarking on a sports writing career at the Detroit Free Press starting in 1970 becoming a well-known name across the state by covering high school and college sports for nearly five decades.

While covering a variety of sports assignments, his primary focus has been on high school and college sports. McCabe was the prep wingman for Hal (“Swami”) Schram, a legendary figure who retired in 1983. The Son of Swami, as McCabe became known, quickly became Michigan’s preeminent prep reporter and famous for his successful predictive columns.

He also tells heartwarming tales and writes about the universal topics that interest young athletes, their classmates, their coaches, their teachers, their parents and anybody who appreciates good journalism and good storytelling.

His induction into the Michigan High School Coaches Association Hall of Fame is only one of many career accolades, including being inducted into the Basketball Coaches Association of Michigan Hall of Fame and the Detroit Catholic League Hall of Fame. Named Michigan Sports Writer of the Year in 2010 and becoming only the fifth sports writer to be inducted into the Michigan Journalism Hall of Fame in 2014. McCabe has won awards from local to national levels for his prep coverage.

Mick and his wife: St. Joyce McCabe have three children: Katie, Kevin, Chris, and four grandchildren.

## Shaun Balhorn



### 2022 Hall of Fame Inductee

Shaun Balhorn began his coaching career in 1996 at Montabella High School, and continues to hold the head wrestling coach position there. In his 26 seasons as coach his teams have achieved an overall record of 507-273. His teams have also earned three league titles, nine district titles, three team Academic All-State honors, produced fifty-seven individual state qualifiers, twenty-nine All-State Wrestlers, two individual state champions, ten individual Academic All-State Wrestlers, had thirty wrestlers with 100+ wins, and one wrestler with 200+ wins. Shaun also coached football at Montabella High School from 1997-2005/2007-2019 with a record of 60-93. His football teams made 3 MHSAA playoff appearances. Montabella's first ever playoff appearance in 2004 earned him the 2004 Coach of the Year award. From 1997-2001, Shaun also served as the JV softball coach with a 96-15 record. In 2000, his team was part of the Montabella Final Four.

Throughout his career Shaun has received many awards and recognitions. He was named the MWA Regional Coach of the Year in 2021, the MSAC Coach of the Year three times, the Daily New Coach of the Year four times, the Morning Sun Coach of the Year three times, achieved his 500th victory in the 2021 wrestling season and was awarded the Dennis Mothersell Award as part of the Montabella Rocket Football Program. Coach Balhorn has also been recognized consistently by his peers for his coaching, knowledge of the rules and his sportsmanship. He has also served on several grievance committees during state tournaments and has organized and managed over fifty individual and team tournaments.

Shaun has been active in many sport associations and in his community. He has been a member of the MHSFCA and the MWA throughout his career and served on several rules and grievance committees in wrestling. He has been active with Montabella Little League, was the field director of Montabella Rocket Football, served as president and founder of the Mustang Youth Wrestling program, served on the school leadership team and served on the worship team at church. In 2021 he began officiating wrestling to continue to serve the wrestling community.

Shaun has been known to say "Wrestling is a sport that you get out exactly what you put in to it." According to his peers he has put "his heart and soul into building a program and a culture that has produced more than simply wrestlers." Shaun "understands the importance of relationships in the classroom, on the fields/courts, and on the mats."

## Corrin Convis Buck



### 2022 Hall of Fame Inductee

Corrin Convis Buck has coached swimming for over thirty-six years at several different high schools and colleges in Michigan, Maryland and Pennsylvania with thirty-three of those years in Michigan. She began her coaching career at Clarion University, Pennsylvania from 1987-1988 as the head assistant coach for men and women's swimming and diving. She was later hired at Michigan State University as the head assistant coach for men and women's swimming and diving for one year, from 1988-1989, and continued as the head women's swimming and diving coach until 1993. From 1993-1995 Corrin served as the head boys and girls swim coach at Frederick High School, Maryland. She returned to Michigan in 1995 coaching at Harper Creek High School and has a dual meet record of 115-83. As the head boys coach (1995-1997) her teams placed third in the SMAC league, had two All-State Swimmers in 1995 and one All-State Swimmer in 1996. As the head girls coach for twenty-six seasons, (1995-2020) her teams participated in the SMAC and SCC league championships and were five times runners-up, placed third seven times, and placed in the top four the remaining years, had eighteen All-State Swimmers, three All-Americans, were city champions for the first time in Harper Creek History in 2017, placed in the top 10 at the MHSAA championships three times and had two state champions. Coach Buck has been the Harper Creek Middle School coach from 1995-present.

Corrin has been honored many times for her service and commitment to coaching. She was named Coach of the Year (Frederick High School, Maryland) in 1994, Regional Coach of the Year in 1997, Zone Coach of the Year in 2014 and 2019, received a 25 Year Award from the MISCA, and a 30 Year Award from the MHSCA.

Corrin has also been involved with the MHSAA as a member of the Council Rules Committee, has served as a zone rep for MISCA for eight years, was a board member of the Michigan Masters and secretary for five years, Sanctions chair and National Coach, has been a Gogua Lake Swim Committee Member and participant for 28 years, was a NCAA YES clinic speaker, and MISCA clinic coaches panel speaker.

"Believe in yourselves as much as I do!" are powerful words from a coach who holds many personal national and world swimming records and titles. Coach Corrin Convis Buck has worked hard and "developed life-long relationships with her athletes" and "they know that she cares about them as students and as a person."

## Frank A. DiCristofaro, Sr.

### 2022 Hall of Fame Inductee



Frank DiCristofaro, Sr. enters the MHSCA Hall of Fame with twenty-nine years coaching experience at the high school level and an additional seven years at the collegiate level. Frank began his coaching career at Allen Park Cabrini High School as the varsity hockey coach. He coached there for thirteen years (1982-1986 and 1990-1999) with a record of 183-132-26. His teams earned eight Regional Championships, were six-time state finalists, were State Champions in 1994 and 1995 and were Michigan Metro League Division Champions four times. From 1986-1990 Frank was the varsity hockey coach at Southgate Anderson High School with a record of 81-12-7. His teams were MHSAA Regional Champions in 1989, MHSAA State Champions in 1989 and Michigan Metro League Division Champions in 1988, 1989 and 1990. From 1999-2002 he served as the varsity hockey coach at Allen Park High School with a record of 36-28-9. His teams were Michigan Metro League Division Champions in 2001. Frank spent one year at University Liggett School as the assistant varsity hockey coach in 2003, before becoming the varsity hockey coach for the St. Clair Shores Lakers Unified Hockey Team in 2004. He coached there for eight years with a record of 129-47-22. His teams were two-time Regional Champions, State finalists in 2005 and four-time Macomb Area Conference Red Division Champions.

Frank is well respected by his peers and has been recognized on several occasions for his accomplishments. He was named Michigan High School Hockey Association Coach of the year in 1989, five time Macomb Area Conference Red Division Varsity Hockey Coach of the Year, six time Michigan Metro High School Hockey League Coach of the Year, the Detroit News Metro Coach of the Year in 1997, eight time New Herald Newspapers Coach of the Year, recipient of the Michigan Metro High School Hockey League Eddie Jeremiah/Art Armstrong Award in 1997 and was inducted into the Michigan High School Hockey Coaches Association Hall of Fame in 2006.

Frank was and active member of the Michigan High School Hockey Coaches Association, the Michigan Metro High School Hockey League and the Macomb Area Conference Hockey Coaches League. He is also a parish member of St. Joan of Arc Parish.

Throughout his career Frank displayed “professionalism, respect and compassion towards his players, opposing teams, officials and administration,” and was “a man of impeccable character who possesses integrity, honesty, intelligence and common sense.”

## Richard D. Hillaker

### 2022 Hall of Fame Inductee



Richard D. Hillaker has thirty-two years of experience as a coach of student athletes at Port Huron High School. Dick began his coaching career as the JV baseball coach from 1965-1971. He took over the varsity team in 1972 and remained the varsity coach of the Port Huron baseball team for the next twenty-two years with a record of 271-219-2. Under his leadership his teams earned two East Michigan League Championships, two Port Huron City Championships, four Richmond Tournament Championships, two South Lake Tournament Championships, two District 13 Championships, were Regional (Flint) Champions in 1988, made the Final Four at MSU in 1988 and were the Mac Red Division Champions in 1991. Dick also served as an assistant football coach at Port Huron High School for thirty-two years (1965-1998).

During his coaching career Dick has been recognized numerous times by his community and his peers for his knowledge and contributions to his sport. He received a National High School Coaching award in 1987, was named District 13 Coach of the Year in 1988, Blue Water Area Coach of the Year in 1989, was the East-West All Star Game Assistant Coach at Tiger Stadium, was named MAC Red Division Coach of the Year in 1991, was inducted into the Michigan High School Baseball Coaches Hall of Fame in 1992, inducted into the Port Huron Sports Hall of Fame in 1999 and had the privilege of working at a few U of M Summer Baseball youth camps with coaches Bud Middaugh, Bill Freehan, and Rich Maloney.

Coach Hillaker “is considered an icon on both the football and baseball fields as well as throughout the city of Port Huron.” The various titles and awards speak of his “personal character, devotion to sports, and devotion to students. They are not titles he sought after, but titles that followed him because of who he was and is.”

Dick has been an active (lifetime) member of the Michigan High School Baseball Coaches Association, the Michigan High School Football Coaches Association, the Port Huron High School Booster’s Club and is a member of the First United Methodist Church.

## David Kowalski



### 2022 Hall of Fame Inductee

Dave Kowalski coached bowling at Bangor John Glenn High School in Bay City for fifteen years (2000-2015). During that time his teams cumulative record was 119-12-2. This includes eight Conference Championships, thirteen Regional Championships, four State Titles and his teams were runner's up four times. He has also had several bowlers that were All State Athletes and Dream Team Members. Described as a "passionate advocate for High School bowling", Dave also served four years as the MHSIBCA at large Director, four years as the MHSIBCA President and thirteen years as the MHSIBCA Area 4 Director.

Over the course of his career Dave has been honored by his peers and community for his service and coaching. He was named the MHSIBCA Coach of the Year in 2007, the MHSCA Coach of the Year in 2012, was inducted into the Bay Area USBCA Hall of Fame in 2010, the MHSIBCA Hall of Fame in 2010, and the John Glenn Ring of Honor Hall of Fame in 2018.

Dave has also been extremely active in his community and other sports associations. He was a part of the Boy Scouts awards from 2003-2005, serves on the Bay Area USBCA Board from 2006-present, the Bay Area USBCA Youth Chair from 2007-present, the SVSU Ambassador Chair from 2017 to present, the SVSU Alumni Board from 2010-2016, helped establish a nursing scholarship at SVSU, the MHSCA Board, and has served on the Delta College Advisory Board since 2005.

## Lois McDonald



### 2022 Hall of Fame Inductee

Lois McDonald joins this class of MHSCA Hall of Fame inductees having coached the Livonia Stevenson varsity women's swim team for twenty years, from 1966-1986. During her tenure her overall record was 189-49-5. This includes eleven individual League Champions, four State Runners up, twenty-nine All American swims, ten State records and fourteen relay titles. Lois also coached the boys' varsity swim team for seven years, 1975-1982 and the girls synchronized swim team for six years, 1966-1972.

Lois received many honors throughout her career. She was the National High School Swim Coach of the Year nominee in 1985-1986, received the Matt Mann Award in 1979 – the first of only three women to win it, was named the MISCA Fall Coach of the Year in 1975, received the MISCA 15 Year Award in 1981, and was the Observer Newspaper Coach of the Year six times.

Lois was passionate about her sport and extremely active in multiple sports associations. She was a member of the American Swim Coaches Association, Michigan High School Coaches Association, Michigan Synchronized Swim Coaches Association (founder), Michigan Women's Coaches Association, Michigan Interscholastic Swim Coaches Association and the National Interscholastic Swim Coaches Association. She also served on the MHSAA swim committee, was the MISCA Girls State Swim Chair, MISCA Director of coaches' swim clinics, MHSAA representative to Detroit News Invite, NISCA National Girls Swim Chair from Michigan, Policy making committee member for Michigan AAU aquatics, AAU Board of Governors, Inter-lakes League Advisory Committee and the AAU State Synchronized Swim Chairman.

In addition, Lois did Masters coaching in Arizona for ten years, coaching two world class swimmers, was a water safety instructor for over twenty years, a member of the Red Cross for over fifty years, was the Spartan AAU Swim Club Head Coach for seven years and the AAU synchronized swim coach in Garden City, MI for ten years. Lois inspired and mentored those around her to lead meaningful productive lives.

## Larry Merx

2022 Hall of Fame Inductee



Larry Merx has accrued thirty-six years coaching experience in track and forty-nine years coaching experience in football at several different high schools in Michigan. He began his career in 1971 coaching varsity boys track at Deerfield High School, then spent the 1972 season at Addison High School, and 1972-73 at Tecumseh High School before hiring in at Ann Arbor Huron High School, where he spent the next thirty-two years as the varsity boys track coach. His teams at Ann Arbor Huron were Conference Champs sixteen times. Larry's football coaching career began in 1972 at Addison High School, from there he coached at Tecumseh High School (1971- 72) and West Bloomfield High School (1973). He coached varsity football for nine years at Ann Arbor Huron High School (1974-83) and were Conference Co-Champions in 1977. Since then, he has coached at Tecumseh High School (Varsity 1983-85), Ypsilanti High School (Varsity, JV 1986-94 -State playoff semi-finalist), Ann Arbor Huron (JV/Frosh 1995-2004), Erie Mason High School (Varsity 2005-2007), Ypsilanti High School (Frosh 2008), Dexter High School (MS/Varsity 2010-13) and Chelsea High School (2013-2021).

Coach Merx has been honored many times by his peers and community for his contributions to his sport. He was named the MHSFCA Assistant Coach of the Year – Ann Arbor Huron in 1997, received the Distinguished Service Award – Ann Arbor Huron 1996-97, the Jim Crowley Award for Distinguished Service -MHSFCA in 2001, was named Assistant Coach of the Year – Dexter in 2008, was inducted into the MHSFCA Hall of Fame in 1999, and the Ann Arbor Huron Hall of Fame in 2008.

Larry has been very active in state associations to promote and facilitate his sport. He has served as the MHSFA President (1997), the MHSFCA Regional Director (1980-82), MHSFCA Placement Committee Chair (1982-84), MHSFCA Newsletter Editor (1984-2015), MHSFCA All Star Committee and Program Editor (1985-2018), MHSFCA Executive Director (2007-18), MHSFCA Rep to MHSCA (2012-present), MHSCA Multi-Sport Athlete Award Committee (2015-present).

## John Pearson

2022 Hall of Fame Inductee



John Pearson's career as swim and diving coach spans 40 years. He started as an assistant men and women's swim and diving coach at Rochester High School from the fall of 1982-winter 1986. In that time his teams had four regional qualifiers. For the next thirty-two seasons he was the assistant men and women's swim and diving coach for Romeo High School. His teams produced nine League Champions, one County Champion, seventy-five Regional Qualifiers, one Regional Champion, twenty-two State Qualifiers, seven State Finalists, three All- State Athletes, eight All-American consideration, and two All-Americans. During this time John also served as Romeo Middle School swim and dive coach for three seasons. These teams produced one League Champion and one County Champion. In the Fall 2015 season John became the men and women's diving coach for Oxford High School. During his seven seasons as coach, his teams had five League Champions, twenty-three Regional Qualifiers, twelve State Qualifiers, two All-State Athletes, and four All-American Considerations. Since the beginning of the Winter 2018 season to the present John has been the men and women's diving coach for Lake Orion High School. These teams have had one League Champion, one County Champion, one Regional Champion, nine Regional Qualifiers, one All-State Athlete and one All-American.

Coach Pearson is well respected in the swim and diving community and has been honored for his service and achievements on numerous occasions. He was named Macomb County Diving Coach of the Year four times, the MISCA Zone 1 Coach of the Year, was the MISCA Bruce Harlan Award Winner in 2016 and was the Greater Romeo/Washington Chamber of Commerce Mentor of the Year.

John has also been actively involved in several sport and community associations. He is a board member of the Macomb County Swim Coaches Association, a board member of the MISCA, diving chair for the MISCA, member of the NISCA Diving All-American Selection Committee, board member of the Greater Romeo/Washington Chamber of Commerce, and chair of the Oxford United Methodist Church Council.

## Don Pluta



### 2022 Hall of Fame Inductee

Don Pluta enters the MHSCA Hall of Fame after coaching varsity wrestling at Holly High School for thirty-six years. He began coaching the varsity wrestling team in 1983. During his tenure his teams accumulated 688 wins – the thirteenth most in Michigan’s history. Included in these wins are nine Flint Metro League Titles, eleven District Championships, three Regional Championships, nine State Individual Champions, fifty-five state placers and four Team Academic All-State Teams. During this time Don also coached varsity, JV, freshman and middle school football (1978-2019), girls’ varsity softball (1978-81), JV wrestling (1977-81), and girls’ JV golf (2016-18).

Throughout his coaching career, Don has been recognized by his colleagues and community for his dedication to his sport, athletes and sportsmanship. He was named Regional Coach of the Year nine times, Flint Metro League Coach of the Year four times, Oakland County Coach of the Year in 2005, Oakland County Referee Wrestling Association Sportsman of the Year in 1997 and 2005, and the Mid-Thumb Wrestling Officials Association Outstanding Sportsman. He has been inducted into the Holly High School Athletic Hall of Fame (2008), the Michigan Wrestling Association Hall of Fame (2019), and the Michigan Chapter of the National Wrestling Hall of Fame (2022). All through his career “Don’s priority has been wrestle hard, wrestle strong, but always, always, conduct yourself in a manner that will demonstrate character and pride in yourself, your parents, your teammates, your school and our sport.”

## Steve Rodriguez



### 2022 Hall of Fame Inductee

Steve Rodriguez accumulated forty years of coaching experience at Ann Arbor Pioneer High School. He began his coaching career as the varsity wrestling coach from 1977-84 and produced one individual State Champion in 1981. In 1985 he took over the women’s varsity golf team and remained in that position for thirty-three years. During those years his teams captured sixteen League Championships, fourteen Regional Championships, two State Championships and had twenty-eight years with Top Ten State Tournament Finishes.

Coach Rodriguez was “a mentor, role model, teacher and leader for Ann Arbor Pioneer students and staff for over forty years.” Because of this he has been the recipient of many honors and recognitions throughout his career. He was named the MIGCA Division 1 State Coach of the Year in 1989, 1993 and 2005, the MIGCA Regional Coach of the Year in 1997 and 2005, the MHSCA Golf Coach of the Year in 1993, the Michigan Association for Health Physical Education Recreation and Dance Sports and Athletic Leader of the Year in 2003, and the National Federation of High Schools Golf Coach of the Year – Finalist in 2008.

Steve supported his sport and community through his participation in several association and community projects. He was a member of the MHSAA Golf Rules Committee, served as Tournament Director for multiple League and MHSAA Regional Golf Tournaments, was the Founder of the Pioneer High School Adaptive PE Program Special Olympics Coordinator, and for thirty-two years his teams participated in the Magic of Christmas Program, shopping for and wrapping gifts for underprivileged families.

The sign in his office reads: “Believe in Yourself Like I Believe in You” This quote reflecting what a colleague said about Coach Rodriguez, “Being able to help students achieve more than they thought they could, was one of his most satisfying goals.”

# Larry Seger

2022 Hall of Fame Inductee



Larry Seger coached tennis a total of fifty-two consecutive years at Thornapple Kellogg High School. He coached the men's varsity tennis team from 1969-2008 for a total of forty seasons earning eight Conference Titles, two Regional Titles, and had two All-State singles players. He also coached the women's varsity tennis team from 1974- 2020 for a total of forty-six seasons earning fourteen Conference Titles, three Regional Titles and had four All-State singles players. His combined dual season record is 741-345 – Third best of all time. Larry also has fifty-two tournament wins and ten undefeated teams (dual seasons) to his credit. At the State Tournament his teams had thirteen Top 15 finishes, seven Top 10 finishes and three Top 5 finishes.

A dedicated and supportive coach, Larry wanted his athletes to “be the best they could, and by emphasizing this over winning, the wins and years just kept coming!” Because of his dedication to his student athletes Larry has received many honors during his career. He was named the Regional Coach of the Year multiple times for men's and women's tennis, and was the Class B Girls Tennis Coach of the Year in 1986. He has also been inducted into the Michigan High School Tennis Coaches Association Hall of Fame (1994) and the Thornapple Kellogg Hall of Fame (2016).

Larry was also a member of the Michigan High School Tennis Association and served on the Board of Directors for multiple years in the 1980's.

2022 Hall of Fame Inductee




Andrew Sheridan served as a basketball coach at Jackson High School for twenty-seven years. He began as the JV boys' basketball coach in 1973 and coached for six seasons with a record of 79-61. In 1977 he became the girls' varsity basketball coach for six seasons with a record of 126-14. His teams earned six Conference Championships, four District Championships, three Regional Championships, were two-time State Semi-Finalists and Finalists in 1980-81 ending the season with a record of 26-1. From 1981-1999 Andrew also coached the varsity boys' basketball team with a record of 256-162. During this time his teams had six Conference Championships, six District Championships, and one Regional Championship.

Through the course of his career Coach Sheridan was recognized several times for his accomplishments with his teams. He was Boys' Basketball Regional Coach of the Year four times, the CAC Conference Coach of the Year three times, the Girls' Basketball AP Coach of the Year in 1982 and Special Mention in 1981, and was inducted into the BCAM Hall of Fame in 2013. He is also the coach with the most wins in Jackson High School History with 256 wins for boys' basketball and 126 wins for girls' basketball.

Andrew has actively supported and promoted his sport as a member of the BCAM, the BCAM All-Star Committee, the Jackson High School Hall of Fame Committee and ran many basketball clinics for the Jackson recreation department. As a coach Andrew Sheridan has long been admired for his hard work, endless energy and the firm, but fair way he coached his student athletes regardless of their position on the team.

## John Michael Tiano



### 2022 Hall of Fame Inductee

John Michael Tiano began his coaching career in 1976. He has coached ninety-nine individual teams in five different sports in more than ten different schools. He has coached football for twenty-seven seasons, men's and women's track for thirty-four seasons, men's and women's basketball for four seasons, gymnastics for two seasons and volleyball for one season. Overall, his teams earned multiple Conference Championships, one District Championship, three Regional Championships, and three State Runner's-Up Awards. John also served as an assistant Athletic Director for three years and a track official for two seasons.

Coach Tiano was recognized many times for his contributions to his sport and his positive impact on his student athletes. He was named Conference Coach of the Year five times, Coach of the Year two times, received the Tom Hickman Award, was named Teacher of the Year and received the Excellence in Education Award six times.

John was actively involved in his community and several sport associations. Andrew Weidenbach has twenty-six years of experience as the varsity hockey coach at Cranbrook Kingswood High School. His overall record is an impressive 504-187-47. Andy's teams have earned ten MHSAA Division III State Championships, two MHSAA Division III State Runners-up awards, and are four-time Champions of the Michigan Interscholastic Hockey League North Division.

Well respected in the hockey community, Coach Weidenbach has received many honors during his career. He was the MHSAA Division III Coach of the Year eight times, the MHSCA Coach of the Year in 2006, the Observer Eccentric Hockey Coach of the Year four times, the Oakland Press Hockey Coach of the Year eight times, and the National Federation of High Schools Coach of the Year in 1998. He was inducted into the National High School Athletic Coaches Association Hall of Fame in 2007, the Michigan High School Hockey Coaches Association Hall of Fame in 2009, and the City of Allen Park Hall of Fame in 2018. He was awarded the Cranbrook Kingswood President's Award for Excellence in 2003, the Pete Dawkins Award in 2001 and was the Cranbrook Kingswood Coach of the Year in 1998. He also served as the Big Eight league secretary from 2003 – 2020.



**Leon Braisted III** has received many honors throughout his coaching career. He has been named the MIGCA Coach of the Year four times, MHSCA Coach of the Year three times, NFHS Coach of the Year in 2018, NHSACA Coach of the Year in 2018, and was inducted into the MIGCA Hall of Fame in 2015. He has been the NHSACA Golf Chairperson at the National Convention, served as MIGCA President Elect, President, Past President and Executive Director.



**Brian Gordon's** coaching career spans thirty-six years and three sports in Royal Oak. He has also served as the athletic director of Royal Oak Novi from 2010 to the present. From 1990 – 2010, Brian coached the Royal Oak Kimball High School baseball team with a record of 419-221. While head coach his teams won five league championships, four district championships, and one regional championship. During this time Brian also coached football at Royal Oak Kimball from 1990-1996 with a JV record of 40-23, and from 1997-2002 at Royal Oak Adams JH with a 28-7 record. From 1992 – 1995 he coached 9th grade boys basketball at Royal Oak Kimball with a record of 49-31. He has been named District Coach of the Year five times, Regional Coach of the Year two times, All-Star Coach; Detroit News Metro Coach of the Year, Oakland County Coach of the Year, Royal Oak Schools Distinguished Coach, and was inducted into the MHSBCA Hall of Fame. He has also been honored for his leadership and hard work in his position as an athletic director. He has been named the Oakland County AD of the Year, the Region 11AD of the year, received the Allen Bush Award, and the Unified Champion Schools Award (Michigan Special Olympics). He has served on the MHSBCA Board of Directors ten times, received the Oakland County Past President Recognition, was President of the Kensington Conference, VP of the Kensington Activities Associations, served as a Coaches Advancement Program Instructor, was a MIAA presenter, and Sport Commissioner (KLAA, OAA).



**Michael Turner** has received many well deserved honors over his coaching career. He has been named MHSBCA Coach of the Year four times, NHSACA Coach of the Year Finalist three times, NHSACA Coach of the Year, NFHSCA Section 4 Finalist, NFHSCA State Coach of the Year, USA Today National HS Hockey Coach of the Year, and was inducted into the Trenton Hall of Fame, the MHSBCA Hall of Fame. He also coached "Replay the Series Hockey Game – Trenton vs Catholic Central." This was a tied game in 1999, resumed 11 years later in 2010 and was shown nationally by Fox Sports. Scotty Bowman was the honorary coach of the Catholic Central team, and Brendan Shanahan was the honorary coach of the Trenton Team. Hockey and Red Wing great, Gordie Howe dropped the opening game puck.



**Steve Zaranek** has forty-two years of coaching experience as the Girls' Cross Country and Track and Field coach for Grosse Pointe South – so far. As the girls' cross country coach since 1979, Steve's teams have an overall dual meet record of 416-46. His teams have won 111 invitational championships, 28 league championships, 27 state regional championships, were team state finalists (top 3 at state regional) 37 times, had 16 top ten state D1 finishes, won the state D1 championship in 2011 and produced 33 All-State athletes. As the girls' track and field coach since 1980, his teams have an overall dual meet record of 281-33. Steve's track and field teams have won 52 invitational championships, 26 league championships, 21 state regional championships, 3 state D1 championships (2011, 2012, 2013), and produced 42 All-State athletes. In addition his teams hold state records in the 800, 1600 and 3200 meter relays and the national high school record in the 3200 meter relay. He has been named MITCA Division 1 Coach of the Year three times for girls' track and field and one time for girls' cross country, MITCA Coach of the Year nominee twelve times, MITCA National Coach of the Year finalist in 2013, and was inducted into the MITCA Hall of Fame in 2007. He has served as an MHSAA committee member 26 times since the mid-80's on various committees, served as the MHSAA state regional host (track and cross country) 40 times, was a clinic presenter for MITCA multiple times since the mid-90's, worked with the summer youth track and cross country programs for Grosse Pointe since 1980, volunteered as the parish athletic director (St. Clare-Grosses Pointe) from 1978-1995, and was the volunteer parish (CYO) youth head coach for basketball/volleyball/track from 1977-2005.



## 2022 NHSACA Hall of Fame



**Kim Spalsbury**



After graduating from Hope College in 1977, Kim Spalsbury began his teaching and coaching career at Fowler High School, and later at his alma mater Grand Ledge High. He retired in 2007 after 30 years of teaching, but he continued to coach reaching 34 years. At Fowler High and Grand Ledge High, he led the Boys' Cross Country teams to a 178 and 36 record, and he led the Girls' Cross Country teams to a 123 and 26 record. Those Cross Country wins included 19 Regional titles, 9 Greater Lansing titles, 30 top five state finishes, 5 State Runners-Up finishes, and 5 State Championships. In Track and Field, he led teams from Fowler to 119 and 17 record with 15 Regional titles, 15 League titles, 4 State Runners-Up finishes and 4 State titles. At Grand Ledge, he led the Boys' Track and Field teams to a 76 and 13 record with 4 League titles and 2 Regional Championships—including the first in school history. He was nominated for Coach of the Year by the Michigan Track Coaches Association ten times in either Cross Country or Track and Field. He was the Michigan Women's Track and Field Coach of the Year and nominee for the National High School Athletic Coaches Association honors in 1990. In 2005 he was named Michigan Boys' State Track and Field Coach of the Year and a finalist in Boy's Track and Field for national honors. He has served Michigan coaches as their president, and has served on the Michigan High School Activities Association committees for over 25 years. He is also involved with civic organizations and summer programs as well as the Michigan Track Officials Association.

**Betty Wrouble**



Coach Wrouble was a five sport athlete while at Clawson High School before attending Central Michigan University where she played Volleyball, Tennis, and Field Hockey. She began her career in education at her alma mater, Clawson High, before moving on to Pontiac Catholic which later became Oakland Catholic. Since Notre Dame Prep opened in 1994, she has been an athletic director and coach as well as holding additional administrative and teaching roles. She has been an educator for 47 years, worked in athletic administration for 43 years, and a coach as well as a registered game official. She has been a volleyball coach for over 40 years with over 1,600 wins as a head coach. She has been a softball coach also for over 40 years with over 1,000 wins. She has led teams to five states titles—one in softball and four in volleyball. She has also taught several leadership classes for the NIAAA, the National Athletic Directors. She has been on the Michigan Interscholastic Volleyball Coaches' Association for over 30 years, and on the Michigan High School Softball Coaches' Association all-state committee for over 35 years. She is a past president of the Detroit Catholic League of Women's Coaches' Association, and has received the Michigan High School Athletic Association Women in Sport Leadership State award.
