

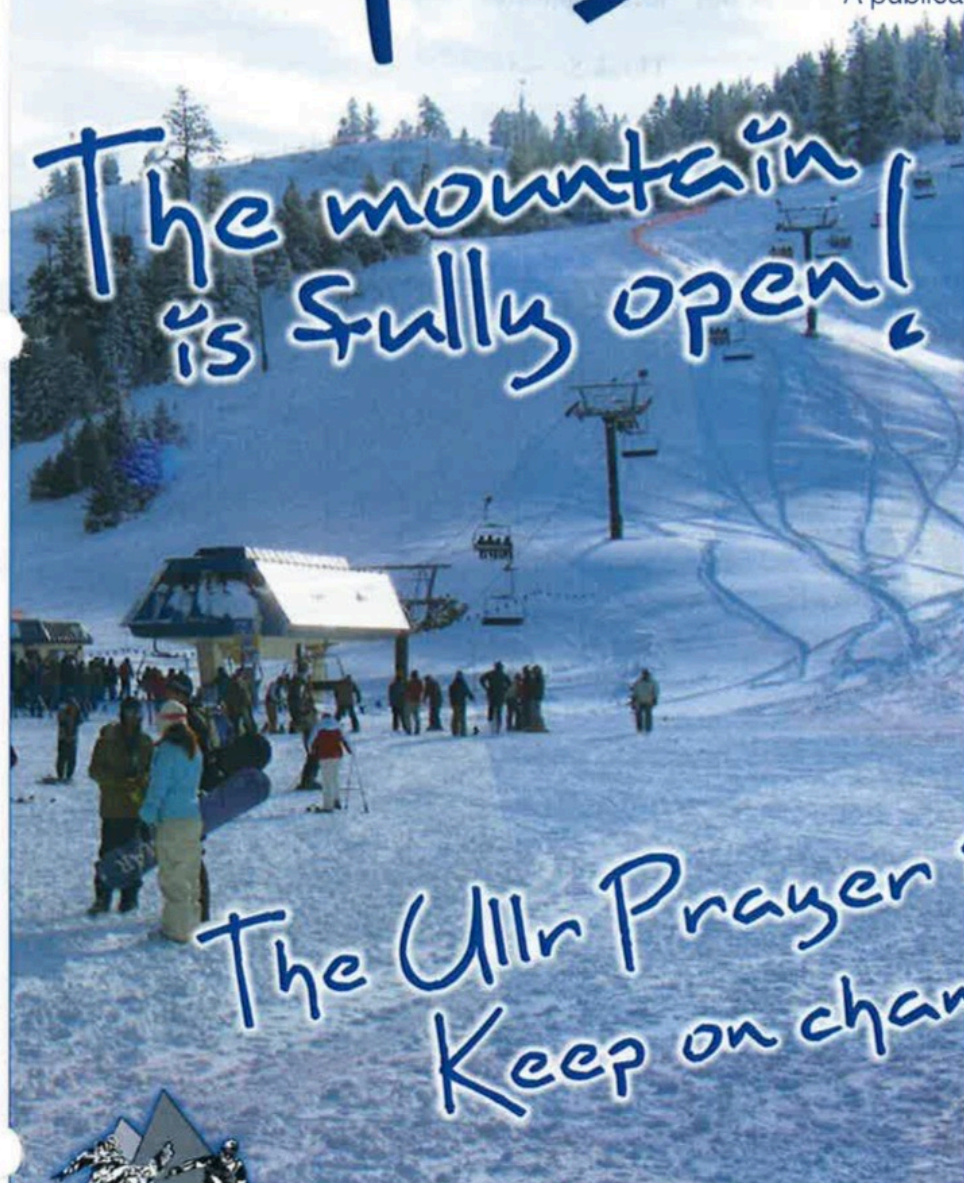



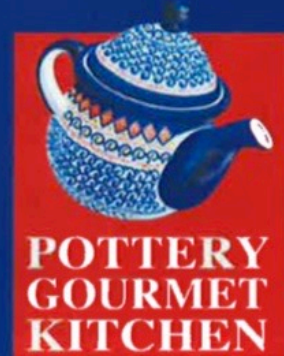

# Intermountain Ski Council joins National Ski Council Federation

Eight regional ski clubs make up the one-year-old Intermountain Ski Council (ISC). PSA's Don Anderson, who is president of the Council, attended the annual meeting of the National Ski Council Federation, held in Winter Park, Colorado in August. The Federation is made up of 27 other councils across the country and its purpose is to share operational and bargaining information among the clubs in the member councils. All aspects of club and council operations are shared, including the latest IRS non-profit tax rules, member recruitment and retention information, trip planning details, and other areas of interest to the clubs. Ski industry representatives and industry equipment suppliers also attend the meeting and, based on the group's size, offer discounts and special pricing on a wide variety of products to the member clubs. It took a full year, but the ISC fulfilled all the necessary membership requirements and was unanimously voted into the Federation at the three day meeting.

As a member of an ISC club, you are entitled to the benefits and discounts of the National Ski Council Federation. The best way to access them is to go to the FWSA website, fwsa.org, pull down "Membership," click "Benefits." You will be able to choose between equipment, services, lodging and "other benefits." You may also be able to use your club's website to explore the Far West Ski Association website for other offers. Joining these larger groups is key to expanding the benefits for our members.

# Idaho Ski Clubs Represented at Far West Ski Association Annual Convention

Seattle was the site and June 5-8 was the date for the gathering of ski club delegates from across the western United States. Over three hundred and twenty five delegates from the west coast to New Mexico and Colorado, along with another 150 industry representatives including some from European resorts, attended the event. Most of the meetings and briefings involved trip planning with many resort people providing the latest information on new lifts, area expansion, lodging options and other travel details. Information on club management, ski industry government regulation, and charity and community involvement was also shared in panel discussion groups. Most attendees were club officers who went back to their clubs and reported the most current information available. Don Anderson, Director of Marketing, was sent to represent the Pocatello Ski Association while most clubs sent two to ten delegates. Pocatello Ski Association is a large club and was entitled to send up to twenty delegates who had voting rights at the meeting. Michael Bouton, President of Bogus Basin Ski Club also attended and helped Don represent the Intermountain Ski Council.

Billy Kidd from Steamboat Springs was a key note speaker. Other speakers provided updates on the Whistler Olympics in 2010 and information on ski history museums and books.

Next year's June convention will take place at the Peppermill Resort in Reno where we hope to have two or three delegates from the Pocatello Ski Association.

# Corporate Night League Racing

The Night Riders Corporate Race League is an evening alpine racing league designed to encourage fun, competition and increased skill. Alpine and telemark skiers and snowboarders over the age of twenty-one are invited to put a team together and sign up for the race series which includes weekly prizes and an end-of-season banquet. Five racers per team and at least one must be female. A team can have more than five team members but only the four fastest times including the fastest female time, will count. All team members must be entered in advance of the series to avoid the occasional "ringer" who stops by for a week.

Teams will have a choice of two different leagues:

- ❖ "Pro" League – Team members are Advanced to Expert with or without racing experience.
- ❖ "Rec" League – Team members are Intermediate to Advanced with no previous racing experience.

### Race Format

Dual Giant Slalom; one run on each course; the four fastest handicapped times will count toward the teams finish each evening; totals will be kept for season rankings and awards.

- ❖ Races start 6pm on the Ridge (Deer Point Chair #1)
- ❖ Course is open until 8:30pm
- ❖ Results posted in the J.R. Simplot Lodge at 9pm during the apres ski party

# Bogus Basin's School Race Program

## 50 Years of Community Tradition

What started as a friendly competition in 1960 between Boise and Borah High Schools with 37 racers, has grown to include 30 high schools, 32 junior high schools, and over 1600 participants in 2008! The 50<sup>th</sup> Dotty Clark Championship Races will be held on February 19 and 20, 2009. The race was named to honor Dorothy Clark, a former Boise High student and successful junior racer at Bogus Basin who died in an automobile accident. The race program combines participation and competition with six Saturday races and three Thursday races in January and February, culminating with the Dotty Clark Race. Points are awarded for the number of racers each school has and fastest times. Saturday races are held in Bitterroot Basin, and Thursday races are on the Lower Ridge. The Boise School District sponsored the program from 1962 – 2005 until liability issues with club sports forced them to discontinue sponsorship. Not wanting to drop the program, Bogus Basin picked up sponsors in 2006 and has grown it to the tremendous participation level anticipated this season. On a typical Saturday race, 125 volunteers set 6 courses for novice, intermediate, and expert skiers and snowboarders. Volunteers also start, time, and record over 900 Junior High and High School racers each week!

To commemorate the 50<sup>th</sup> Dotty Clark, Bogus is sponsoring an ALUMNI RACE on Saturday, February 21. Any racer who participated in the Dotty Clark is eligible. Racers will

be divided into categories and handicaps assigned. Race categories are based on the decade they raced in: 60s, 70s, 80s, 90s, and 00s - male and female. The race will be held on the Lower Ridge beginning at 11:00 am. The cost is \$15.00 and will include a commemorative bib and medals for the top three finishers in each category. An awards ceremony will be held in the Simplot Lodge following the race. Due to the large number of participants over the years, we are capping the race to the first 250 who register. Further details and registration information will be provided on the Bogus Basin website in January.

The Race Program sponsors a unique event in March to raise scholarships for racers who cannot afford equipment or passes. Named to honor a longtime coach and advisor from Vallivue High School, the Butch Wolf Memorial Carve Slice will be held on Saturday, March 14 this year. Two person teams; male, female, or coed, make two runs down the NASTAR course, combining their fastest runs. After the race, teams head down the mountain to Quail Hollow Golf Course for a 9 hole scramble tournament. Winners in each category are based on their placement in each format. A barbeque with door prizes concludes the day. Registration and event information will be posted on the Bogus Basin website in February. Only in Boise can you make fresh tracks in the morning and play golf in the afternoon. Find a partner, support a great program, and enjoy Boise's fabulous lifestyle!

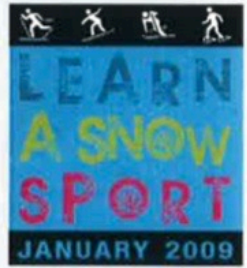

# A Club Member Looks Back



A Thanksgiving feast was hosted by Jane Gabbert with a number of BBSC members in attendance. As expected the stories of fun ski trips of the past, and current forthcoming trips was a major part of the joyful conversation. The early evening progressed smoothly as the wine glasses toasted the turkey that was about to yield to the ski orphans of Bogus Basin.

The conversation turned to the early history of Bogus Basin Ski Area. As the eldest member of the ski orphans, and true native of Idaho and Boise, stories of the 40s & 50s were fun to recall. Growing up in the east end of town the east end guys took up the sport on the foot hills at the north end of Coston Avenue. These were the days of 24" of snow on the valley floor in 1946, '47 and '48. I was really proud of the northland edgeless wooden skis I inherited from my sister who didn't care for the sport.

My formal introduction to Bogus was at the hand of Mr. Jack Morgan and his young son Tommy in 1947. I recall on the first trip to the hill pushing his beautiful Studabaker sedan through the snow and

muddy road to get to the parking area. Next was the introduction to formal ski lessons sponsored by the Idaho Statesman, and learning how to ride the peanut hill rope tow which the area leased from the Bogus Basin Ski Club. At that time the ski school was directed by a gentleman by the last name of Jensen who was employed by Hellers Sporting Goods, 10<sup>th</sup> and Bannock and Murries Drive in on Capitol Blvd. Local ski instructors at this time included the likes of Glen Compton, Rodger Compton, Evert Jones, TJ Jones, Lee and Boue Backes, Keith and Collin Taylor, Norman Gurtson, all PNSA qualified instructors. Next in the chronological line of ski school directors was Dave Clark who installed the dovas dusters as a junior arm of the BBSC. I was installed as President, Deana Gurtson as Secretary and Jim Brandon as Vice President in 1950 and '51. In 1951 and '52 Swarey Engan was ski school director. What a fun time, skiing was not a sanctioned school activity but I made a contract with all my teachers that I would maintain a "B" average allowing me to skip school on Wednesdays to ski with Swarey. He provided me with a pair of reverse camber skis which were really fun in the powder.

highway. My first experience with this event, not competitive at all. Then during one of my practice jumps Frank Brown yelled stick out your chin and what do you know I cleared the knoll with a 120' effort and wet my pant in the process. The effort didn't go unnoticed with the days chuckly on me

This was the era of long thongs with bear trap tow plates which helped me spend 6 months in a hip to toe cast. Not much fun but I did learn how to drive my mother's Studabaker with out using the clutch and earned my life guard certificate while using the YMCA pool as therapy to help the healing of the lower leg. Mounting bindings for Greenwood's while at Idaho Sporting Goods was part of the recovery process.

The '54 & '55 season was a time of regaining leg strength and mental healing. Thanks to Gene Gillis I was able to place in a number of regional races giving me the opportunity to ski for the University of Colorado. Off season was good to me as life guard and swim instructor at the Hillcrest County Club. I was able to earn my tuition moneys until it was time to serve in Uncle Sam's army. So in 1960 I was on guard while Greenwood watched over the Hillcrest kids. While at CU I sold skis for Greenwood to team members and fraternity brothers. I did make the roster of the U.S. military ski team while stationed in Anchorage, Alaska.

Upon discharge from the Army and my 3 year world wide adventure I took my first real job with Weyerhaeuser's laminated beam division in Tacoma, Washington and it took until 1972 to get back to Bogus.

The real changes at Bogus began in the 1960s and I don't miss the long rope tows, tee bars and plater pulls that I grew up with. I love Bogus. Bogus Basin has more potential than any regional ski area in the northwest.
