The award honors the memory of Peter Schmid, a young member of the Soccer Club who loved the game. The recipients are honored for their sportsmanship, which might include citizenship, helpfulness, attitude, and loyalty. **The relative playing skills of the recipients are not a factor in the selection process.**

Please nominate one or more players from your team, or if you feel the circumstances are exceptional you may nominate your team as a whole. Your eloquence in describing the qualifications of your nominees helps us select the Sportsmanship Award recipients. Please provide enough information on your nominee to help us in our selection, but please also limit your submittal to approximately 300 words or less.

The awards will be presented at the SBSC Annual General Meeting, which is typically held in early February (please refer to the SBSC website for the date and time). Coaches, nominees and their families are invited to attend the meeting and you the coach are asked to read your nominating statement. If you have not participated before I can tell you it's a big deal for the families and reminds us all why we volunteer.
