



Paradise Minor Baseball - Technical Director

Summary

Paradise Minor Baseball is seeking applications for the position of Technical Director.

The Paradise Minor Baseball (PMB) Association is a well-established program with a long history of delivering successful Minor Baseball activities in the community. The Association operates a multi-division house league summer program for approximately 500 players aged 4-18. In addition to house league, PMB's All-Star program enters teams from Mosquito to Midget in All Newfoundland Provincial tournaments each summer.

PMB is seeking an experienced candidate with a combination of seasoned coaching and playing experience. The primary objective of the Technical Director is player and coaching development.

The Technical Director will be required to develop and document a training and skills development program for PMB players and coaches to follow throughout the summer season. For the junior division, this program must follow a BASEBALL CANADA Curriculum (i.e. Rally Cap) and ensure that coaches/instructors have the required instruction necessary to teach the players and execute this program.

The Technical Director is a non-voting role that reports to the PMB executive, primarily the vice-president, whose responsibility is over-seeing the Technical Director and summer student Instructors.

Duties and Responsibilities

- Ensures that safety is always the number one priority for all participants and staff;
- Assist the Executive and Student Coordinator with the planning, coordinating and execution of scheduled tournaments;
- Distributes information concerning technical skills development and/or items of interest to the team managers and/or coordinators of house league and all-star;
- Develops practice plan and training clinics for house league and all-star teams;
- Monitors performance of coaches/instructors in all divisions;
- Assists with the evaluation of player development for all-star competition and may recommend player placement on the teams to the coaches;
- Mentor competitive coaching staff;
- May be required to serve as Umpire Chief during scheduled tournaments and/or other leadership roles and responsibilities;
- Makes recommendations for improvements where possible; and
- Other related duties as required.

Experience and Qualifications

- Must have experience coaching, and be currently certified, at the provincial level;
- Played Baseball in multiple divisional levels; and
- Experience instructing players in the sport of Baseball at various ages and skill level.
- The following are not required, but would be considered an asset:
 - Level I Umpire Certification
 - Experience and certification coaching at the Atlantic or National level
 - First Aid Certificate

Application Instructions

The position has a start date of May 1st, 2020 and estimated at about 15 hours per week during baseball season.

The salary is competitive and in line with the occasional nature of the position. While the salary is budgeted, depending upon qualifications and experience of the successful candidate it is somewhat negotiable. The position is for one year and may be extended at the approval of the Executive.

The successful candidate must be able to obtain a clear RNC code of conduct prior to employment start.
