Important Pre-Camp Information

The Rocky Mountain District of USA Hockey is pleased to announce its 2025 Rocky Mountain District Girls Player Evaluation Camp for 2008-10 birth year players. Please find below some important information to review to answer any questions you may have. As a reminder, all participants must be US citizens and registered with USA Hockey for the current season.

Check-In (as posted in Front Lobby)

- **Girls 15** (2010 birth year) – **7:30-8:30am on Fri May 16**
 - Girls 15 first game is 9:15-10:30am on Gainey rink
- **Girls 16** (2009 birth year) – **8:30-9:30am on Fri May 16**
 - Girls 16 first game is 10:45am-12:00pm on Gainey Rink
- **Girls 17** (2008 birth year) – **9:30-10:30am on Fri May 16**
 - Girls 17 first game is 12:15-1:30pm on Gainey Rink
- **Players** – Do not arrive early for check-in or be late for your scheduled on-ice games
 - Leave your gear outside of check-in, you will receive your assigned jersey/socks (parents stay outside)

What to Bring:

- Full USA Hockey equipment (including mouthguard) is required to participate in the camp
- Extra hockey sticks and water bottle (water will not be provided on the bench)
- Jerseys (blue or gold) plus socks will be provided by the RMD

Camp Schedule:

The final Camp Schedule can be found by clicking [RMD Camp](#). The Girls Camp will commence on Friday with their first game per age group followed by a Goalie session for all age groups. If interested, shooters (need 12) can sign up at registration check-in. Friday will conclude with player/parent seminars per age group that will cover training, nutrition, mental health, & future opportunities. Saturday will kickoff with more games with a mix of age groups (e.g. 16 Gold vs 17 Blue, etc.) Sunday will include a final 75-min game per age group.

Team Assignments:

Team Assignments by age group will be posted by EOB Friday, May 9, 2025, on the [RMD Camp](#) website.

Trainers:

Certified trainers will be rink side for all sessions of the Camp. Trainers will have **final say** as to whether a player can continue to participate if an injury or illness occurs. If a player has a special medical condition that the Camp medical staff needs to be aware of, please bring appropriate documentation. The Camp cannot dispense any type of medication, so it will be up to the player to follow her medication protocol.

Cell phones:

No cell phones are allowed in the locker rooms. Violation of this will result in confiscation of your cell phone until the player’s session ends – **no exceptions.**

Valuables:

Please note that the Camp will not be responsible for lost or stolen valuables of any type. Participants who bring valuables to the Camp do so at their own risk.

Parents:

Parents, family and friends are welcome to attend the Camp, but will only have access to the viewing stands. Please do not try to view from the bench area. **Only camp participants/staff have access to the bench area, which will be strictly enforced – NO EXCEPTIONS!** We respectfully request your cooperation.

Camp Check-out:

The Camp ends after the player’s last game on Sunday, May 18th.

National Camp Selections:

Players selected to advance from the RMD PEC Girls Camp to one of USA Hockey’s National Camps will be notified of their selection on **Thursday May 22, 2025**. Names of such selected players to advance will be posted on the USA Hockey website. It is USA Hockey’s Girls National Camps policy that NO players shall be notified prior to this date.

Miscellaneous:

- **Please do not bring any nuts to the camp.** We may have some players who have allergic reactions and we do not want to place anyone in harm’s way. We ask for your cooperation.
- All Players are required to abide by the Player Code of Conduct, including a **No Tolerance Policy** for bullying or harassment. Players should notify their coaches immediately if in an uncomfortable situation.
- No Tolerance means No Tolerance – any player found to be in violation of the Player Code of Conduct will be ineligible to participate further in this Camp plus future Camps. Parents will be notified of the situation and asked to arrange for their player’s transportation home as soon as possible.
- We have an excellent coaching staff in place for the Camp. Each team will have at least two coaches including NCAA Division I/III, ACHA and Tier I team coaches and staff from USA Hockey. All of the Coaches and staff are here to help, so don’t be afraid to ask questions. Unfortunately, due to time constraints, no individual player evaluations will be conducted by the coaches at the end of the Camp. But again, please don’t be afraid to ask your coaches questions during the Camp. Most of the Coaches have “lived the dream” you are pursuing. They love the game and really enjoy being around and mentoring those who play the game.
- Parking may become an issue on certain days of the Camp, so please allow adequate time to find parking.
- Players must allow sufficient time to travel to/from the rink so they are timely for all events during the Camp while keeping continuity with their warm-up and routines as well as being a cordial and present teammate.
- Lastly, we hope everyone has a great experience and fun. Relax and enjoy the Camp, work hard on the ice, make new friends, be a good teammate, and talk with your Coaches. If you leave Camp without having made additional friends, then you simply will not have taken full advantage of the entire Camp experience.
