TODAY'S GAME

The U.S. Paralympic Sled Hockey Team is set to face off against China here today (March 10) in its third and final preliminary-round contest of the 2026 Paralympic Winter Games at Milano Santagiulia Ice Hockey Arena.

Puck drop is set for 1:35 p.m. local time/8:35 a.m. ET, and the game will be televised on USA Network and will live stream on Peacock.

The U.S. enters this matchup with a 2-0-0-0 (W-OTW-OTL-L) record after skating to a 13-0 victory over Germany yesterday (March 9). The win guaranteed the U.S. a spot in the semifinals, set for Friday (March 13).

China also enters this contest with a 2-0-0-0 (W-OTW-OTL-L) record after defeating Italy, 11-1, yesterday. The winner of today's matchup will earn the top seed in Group A entering the semifinal round.

The U.S. sits atop the tournament rankings with 27 goals for, while China slots in second with 23 goals scored in two games.

Team USA and China have played just once previously in the Paralympics, a matchup that saw the U.S. skate to an 11-0 victory in the 2022 Beijing Paralympic Winter Games semifinals.

Most recently, the U.S. earned a 13-2 victory over China in the semifinals of the 2025 Para Hockey Cup in Dawson Creek, B.C., in December.

The Paralympic preliminary round follows a round-robin style format within each group, with the top two seeds in Group A and B each advancing to the semifinals on Friday, March 13, followed the medal round on Sunday, March 15.

All-time at the Paralympics, Team USA holds a 28-2-0-6-1 (W-OTW-OTL-L-T) record.

TALKING POINTS

SHOWTIME

Team USA's 14-1 preliminary-round win over host Italy on Saturday (March 7) was historic for both the sport of sled hockey and Team USA. A whopping **8,992** fans attended the game, a new all-time record for attendance at a sled hockey game in a major tournament. The mark surpassed the previous high of 8,600, set at the 2019 World Para Ice Hockey Championship in Ostrava, Czechia, in a game between the U.S. and Czechia.

STUFFING THE STAT SHEET

The U.S. Paralympic Sled Hockey Team leads the tournament with a whopping 27 goals through two contests in Milan. With seven points (4g, 3a) in yesterday's (March 9) win over Germany, **Declan Farmer** (Tampa, Fla.) now has 53 (29g, 24a) career Paralympic points, becoming the first American player to surpass 50 career points at the Paralympics.

Farmer has recorded a tournament-best eight goals, 13 points, and +18 rating through two contests. Meanwhile, **Jack Wallace** (Franklin Lakes, N.J.) and **Noah Grove** (Frederick, Md.) are tied for the tournament lead amongst defenders with eight points apiece. Grove's seven assists through two games rank second amongst all skaters.

David Eustace (Stoneham, Mass.) also has worked his way to the top of the leaderboards, as his five goals rank third for all skaters in the tournament, and his 10 points slot him at 10th-best amongst all skaters.

BROADCAST DETAILS

The game will be televised live on USA Network. Every game of the 2026 Paralympics will also live stream on Peacock.

LEADING TEAM USA

David Hoff (Bottineau, N.D.) is in his eighth season as head coach of the U.S. National Sled Hockey Team, and the 2026 Paralympic Winter Games mark his second as head coach of the U.S. Paralympic Sled Hockey Team, and third since joining the staff as an assistant coach in 2016. In March of 2023, Hoff was named the 2022 Paralympic Coach of the Year by the USOPC. USA Hockey's Northern Plains District Coach-In-Chief, Hoff led the U.S. to an unprecedented fourth-straight Paralympic gold medal at the 2022 Paralympic Winter Games. In his debut season as bench boss, Hoff coached Team USA to a 10-1-0-1 (W-OTW-OTL-L) record, including an undefeated 4-1-0-0 (W-OTW-OTL-L) mark at the 2019 Para Ice Hockey World Championship in Ostrava, Czech Republic. He added a second world championship gold medal to his resume after guiding Team USA to a top-of-the-podium finish at the 2021 IPC Para Ice Hockey World Championship in Ostrava, its record fifth gold medal in world championship history. In his Paralympic debut in 2022, Hoff led Team USA to a perfect 4-0-0-0 (W-OTW-OTL-L) record and the gold medal. In 2023, Hoff guided the U.S. to an unbeaten 16-2-0-0 (W-OTW-OTL-L) record, capped off by winning his third world championship. He then led the U.S. to a 19-0-0-1 (W-OTW-OTL-L) record in 2023-24, earning a silver medal at the 2024 World Para Ice Hockey Championship in Calgary, Alberta, and most recently, helped lift the U.S. to a World para Ice Hockey Championship gold medal in 2025 in Buffalo, N.Y.

NEWS & NOTES



LEADERSHIP GROUP

Leading the charge for Team USA is captain **Josh Pauls** (Green Brook, N.J.), who is the most decorated Paralympian in the history of sled hockey with four career gold medals.

Travis Dodson (Deming, N.M.), a two-time Paralympic gold medalist, is serving as alternate captain, alongside three-time gold medalist **Declan Farmer** (Tampa, Fla.), who entered the tournament with the U.S. Paralympic career records for goals (21), assists (19), and points (40).

Overall, **13 players are returning** from the gold-medal winning 2022 U.S. Paralympic Sled Hockey Team, and nine players from the squad that won gold at the 2018 Paralympics.

CAPTAIN AMERICA

U.S. Paralympic Sled Team captain **Josh Pauls** (Green Brook, N.J.) is already the most decorated Paralympic sled hockey athlete of all-time, with an incredible four gold medals to his name, most of any player in history. Seeking his fifth-consecutive gold, Pauls was selected by his Team USA peers to be a flag bearer for the United States at the 2026 Paralympic Winter Games Opening Ceremony in Verona on Friday (March 6).

FIRST-TIMERS

While the U.S. is returning 13 players from its squad that won gold in Beijing at the 2022 Paralympics, there are four players who will be making their Paralympic debut in Milan.

BRETT BOLTON: 19-year-old Forward **Brett Bolton** (Rockledge, Fla.) made his U.S. National Sled Team debut at the 2022 IPH Cup and has recorded 18 points (8g, 10a) across 54 career games.

LIAM CUNNINGHAM: The youngest member of Team USA, 18-year-old defenseman **Liam Cunningham** (River Falls, Wis.) made his U.S. National Sled Team debut at the 2023 IPH Cup in Ostrava, Czechia, and helped the U.S. capture gold at the 2025 World Para Ice Hockey Championship in Buffalo, N.Y.

KAYDEN BEASLEY: 19-year-old forward **Kayden Beasley** (Coats, N.C.) debuted for the U.S. National Sled Team at the 2024 IPH Cup, and has since tallied 20 points (6g, 14a) in 29 career games.

LONDON UTHKE: 18-year-old defenseman **Landon Uthke** (Albert Lea, Minn.) first debuted for Team USA at the 2025 IPH Cup and helped Team USA to championships at the 2025 IPH Cup, and 2025 Para Hockey Cup.

COLORADO CREW

The U.S. Paralympic Sled Hockey Team held its 2026 Residency Camp, Jan. 7-Feb. 20 in Superior, Colorado, at Blue Sports Stable. Camp included daily off-ice workouts and on-ice sessions at least four times per week. Many members of the team permanently reside in Colorado, including native **Malik Jones** (Aurora, Colo.), along with **Declan Farmer** (Tampa, Fla.), **David Eustace** (Stoneham, Mass.), **Noah Grove** (Frederick, Md.), **Evan Nichols** (Haymarket, Va.), and **Jen Lee** (Daly City, Calif.). Additionally, **Brett Bolton** (Rockledge, Fla.) is currently attending the University of Colorado Boulder.

TENDY TANDEM

The duo of **Griffin LaMarre** (Haverhill, Mass.) and **Jen Lee** (Daly City, Calif.) will return in goal for the U.S. after the tandem backstopped Team USA to a Paralympic gold medal in 2022 and two World Para Ice Hockey Championships in 2023 and 2025. Road-trip roommates and close friends off-the-ice, the duo has been an elite tandem on-the-ice, especially in big moments.

LaMarre started in goal for Team USA in the 2025 World Para Ice Hockey Championship gold-medal game against Canada, making 10 saves to lift the U.S. to a 6-1 victory. Lee started four contests in the 2022 Paralympics and didn't allow a single goal across 165 minutes of action.

OLYMPIC MAGIC

At the 2026 Olympic Winter Games, Team USA captured gold in both the men's and women's ice hockey tournaments, setting the stage for the U.S. Paralympic Sled Team to sweep the Olympic and Paralympic hockey tournaments for the first time in history.

In the men's tournament, the U.S. went unbeaten to capture its third gold medal ever and first since the 1980 "Miracle On Ice" team did so in Lake Placid, New York. After winning all three of its preliminary round games in regulation to win Group C, the U.S. needed Quinn Hughes' overtime goal to get past a tough Sweden team in the quarterfinals. After earning a 6-2 win over Slovakia in the quarterfinals, the U.S. used an overtime goal from another Hughes -- Quinn's brother Jack -- to best Canada, 2-1, in the gold-medal game.

In the women's tournament, Team USA claimed gold, the program's third all time, in dominant fashion, posting an undefeated 6-1-0-0 (W-OTW-OTL-L) record, ultimately defeating Canada, 2-1, in overtime of the gold medal game. The U.S. went undefeated in preliminary round play, topping Czechia, Finland, Switzerland and Canada, before beating Italy in the quarterfinals, Sweden in the semifinals and Canada in the gold medal game. Team USA dominated the competition, outscoring its opponents 33-2, and posting five shutouts in its gold medal run.

CHIPOTLE-USA HOCKEY NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

A total of 23 champions will be crowned in the month of March at the 2026 Chipotle-USA Hockey Girls and Youth National Championships at 11 different host sites across the country. As part of USA Hockey Girls and Youth Nationals, some 7,000 players have competed for American hockey top honors at various host sites across the United States.

HOCKEY WEEK ACROSS AMERICA

Created by USA Hockey in 2008, Hockey Week Across America is an annual event designed to engage the hockey community in celebrating the sport of hockey at all levels and exposing the sport to new audiences. Held March 2-8, 2026, Hockey Week Across America included Try Hockey For Free Day, Hockey is For Everyone Day, and more. For more information, click [here](#).

TRY HOCKEY FOR FREE

Saturday (March 7) was the second of two annual national Try Hockey For Free days in the United States as part of Hockey Week across America. It's a day where hundreds of rinks around the United States invite the local community to try the sport of hockey for free.

Rinks around the country also host special events such as Girls Try Hockey For Free, Sled Try Hockey For Free and Adult Try Hockey For Free.

100,000 GIRLS HOCKEY PLAYERS IN THE U.S.

For the first time in history, USA Hockey eclipsed 100,000 girls hockey players nationwide in 2025-26.

Since women's ice hockey was first played in the Olympic Winter Games in 1998, the number of girls and women's players in the United States has grown by 257% from some 28,000 players to more than 100,000 today.
