WHICH ACCOUNT TYPE DO I NEED?

ACCOUNT TYPES

If you want to compete in NCAA sports, you need to register with the Eligibility Center at eligibilitycenter.org. Plan to register before your freshman year of high school (or year nine of secondary school).

1. Free Profile Page Account.
2. Amateurism-Only Certification Account.
3. Academic and Amateurism Certification Account.



FREE PROFILE PAGE ACCOUNT

If you are not sure in which division you want to compete, or are a domestic student-athlete who plans to compete at a **Division III school**, create a free Profile Page account.



» No registration fee to create a Profile Page account.



» If at any time you wish to pursue a Division I or II path, you'll be able to **transition** to the right **Certification account**.

Note: All **international student-athletes** who plan to compete at a Division III school should start with an Amateurism-Only Certification account.



ACADEMIC AND AMATEURISM CERTIFICATION ACCOUNT

You must receive an academic and amateurism certification from the Eligibility Center to compete at an NCAA Division I or II school.



Registration fee:

- » Domestic students: \$100.
- » International students: \$160.



- » Before you can go on official visits or sign a Division I or II **National Letter of Intent**, you must have completed the Academic and Amateurism Certification account registration.

Note: A **fee waiver** is available if you meet Eligibility Center fee waiver criteria.

What is an NCAA ID?

Your NCAA ID is one of the ways NCAA Division I and II coach and compliance staff can add you to their **institutional request list**, which notifies the Eligibility Center that you need an academic and amateurism certification completed.

- » To locate your NCAA ID, log in to your Eligibility Center account. Your NCAA ID is in the top-right corner.
- » In addition to your password, you need your NCAA ID any time you call the Eligibility Center with questions.
