LAST TIME OUT

Team USA jumped out to an early 2-0 lead off goals from **Hannah Brandt** (Vadnias Heights, Minn.) and **Hilary Knight** (Sun Valley, Idaho), but Canada battled back to take a 3-2 lead heading into the last 10 minutes of the third. With 1:29 remaining in the game, **Alex Carpenter** (North Reading, Mass.) tied it, sending the game to overtime. The U.S. would ultimately take the game, 4-3, winning in a shootout. Knight and Carpenter tallied the shootout scores, while **Nicole Hensley** (Lakewood, Colo.) stood tall in net.

QUICK SHOTS

TODAY'S MATCHUP

Today's meeting between the U.S. and Canada marks the second game of the 2022-23 Rivalry Series and the second matchup between the two teams in three days. The U.S. currently leads the series 1-0 following a 4-3 shootout victory, the first shootout in Rivalry Series history, in Kelowna, B.C. on Tuesday.

IN THE RIVALRY SERIES

Following Tuesday's shootout victory, the U.S. holds a 4-2-1-2 (W-OTW-OTL-L) record over Canada all time in the Rivalry Series. Canada won the 2018-19 Rivalry Series by the 2-0-0-1 record, while the U.S. won the 2019-20 Rivalry Series by the 3-1-1-0 record.

HENSLEY'S HOT HAND

Goaltender **Nicole Hensley** (Lakewood, Colo.) made 28 saves in Tuesday's shootout victory over Canada, including a key stop on a penalty shot attempt by Canada's Marie-Philip Poulin with less than a minute left in overtime. She also stopped all four Canadian shootout attempts. It marked her first-ever shootout as a member of the U.S. Women's National Team.

BRENGMAN'S FIRST NATIONAL TEAM POINTS

Defender **Riley Brengman** (China Township, Mich.) picked up her first point as a member of the U.S. Women's National Team, assisting on **Hannah Brandt's** (Vadnias Heights, Minn.) first-period goal.

HAVE A KNIGHT

In the opening game of the 2022-23 Rivalry Series, forward **Hilary Knight** (Sun Valley, Idaho) registered three points (two goals, one assist), including the game-winning goal in the shootout.

TEAM USA AT A GLANCE

ROSTER BREAKDOWN

Team USA's roster for the November Rivalry Series games features 23 players - 13 forwards, seven defenders and three goaltenders. Of the 23, 14 players were members of the 2022 U.S. Olympic Women's Hockey Team and 16 are returners from the silver-medal winning team that most recently took the ice at the 2022 IIHF Women's World Championship.

Riley Brengman (China Township, Mich.), **Becca Gilmore** (Wayland, Mass.), **Kelsey King** (Elk River, Minn.), **Maureen Murphy** (Buffalo, N.Y.), **Gabby Rosenthal** (Blaine, Minn.) and **Haley Winn** (Rochester, N.Y.) will all make their U.S. Women's National Team debut during the November Rivalry Series swing.

AYE AYE CAPTAINS

Kendall Coyne Schofield (Palos Heights, Ill.) is the captain of Team USA for the 2022-23 Rivalry Series. **Hilary Knight** (Sun Valley, Idaho) and **Lee Stecklein** (Roseville, Minn.) will serve as alternate captains.

BEHIND THE BENCH

John Wroblewski is serving as head coach of the 2022-23 U.S. Women's National Team following his debut with the team during the 2022 IIHF Women's World Championship. **Shari Dickerman**, assistant coach at Minnesota State and **Josh Sciba**, head coach for Union, will both serve as assistant coaches. **Alli Altman** will be the goalie coach. Both Sciba and Altman also served on the coaching staff of the Women's Worlds team.

2022-23 RIVALRY SERIES

One of the fiercest rivalries in all of sports, the Rivalry Series is an annual series between the women's national teams of the United States and Canada.

Established by USA Hockey and Hockey Canada during the 2018-2019 season, the Rivalry Series in an annual showcase of the highest level of women's hockey at varying locations in the United States and Canada.

Following a two-year hiatus due to the pandemic and preparation for the 2022 Olympic Winter Games, the Rivalry Series resumes with seven games across three months - three in November, two in December and two in February.

The U.S. won the 2019-20 Rivalry Series by the tally of four games to one.

RIVALRY SERIES SUCCESS

The U.S. and Canada have competed in the Rivalry Series twice prior, with the U.S. winning the series in 2019-20 and Canada winning in 2018-19.

2019-20: The won the series by the tally of four games to one.

2018-19: won the series by the tally of two games to one.

TEAM TIDBITS

2022 U.S. OLYMPIC TEAM RETURNEES

The November roster for the 2022-23 Rivalry Series returns 14 players from the 2022 U.S. Olympic Women's Hockey Team that captured silver in Beijing in February 2022. Those returners include, **Hannah Brandt, Alex Carpenter, Kendall Coyne Schofield, Jincy Dunne, Savannah Harmon, Nicole Hensley, Megan Keller, Amanda Kessel, Hilary Knight, Kelly Pannek, Maddie Rooney, Abby Roque, Hayley Scamurra** and **Lee Stecklein**.

2022 WOMEN'S WORLDS RETURNEES

In total, 14 members from the 2022 U.S. Olympic Team, in addition to **Aerin Frankel** and **Rory Guilday**, were on the most recent edition of the Women's World Championship team. That team competed in August at the 2022 IIHF Women's World Championship in Herning, Denmark. After sweeping the preliminary round, 4-0, the team took home silver following a 2-1 loss to Canada in the gold medal game.

WOMEN'S NATIONAL TEAM NEWCOMERS

Riley Brengman, Rebecca Gilmore, Kelsey King, Maureen Murphy, Gabby Rosenthal and **Haley Winn** will all make their U.S. Women's National Team debut during the November Rivalry Series swing.

PATTY KAZMAIER MEMORIAL AWARD HONOREES

Four members of the team have been honored with the Patty Kazmaier Memorial Award, bestowed annually to the best women's player in NCAA Division I college hockey: **Aerin Frankel** (2021), **Kendall Coyne Schofield** (2016), **Alex Carpenter** (2015) and **Amanda Kessel** (2013).

FROM ALASKA

Forward **Clair DeGeorge** hails from Anchorage, Alaska. DeGeorge is one of only nine players from Alaska to represent the U.S. on the Women's National Team and is the first since 2019-20, when she skated during the Rivalry Series in 2019-20.

COLLEGE CONNECTION

All 23 athletes on the Team USA roster have competed or are currently competing as women's hockey student-athletes at a U.S. college or university. The University of Minnesota, Northeastern University and Ohio State University top the list with four athletes each. Boston College, Clarkson University and the University of Wisconsin have two athletes each, while Cornell University, Harvard University, Lindenwood University, Minnesota State University and University of Minnesota Duluth have one athlete. Eleven different schools have representation on the team.

U18 WOMEN'S WORLD CHAMPIONSHIP ALUMNI

A total of 14 players on the 2022 U.S. Women's National Team represented the U.S. at an IIHF Under-18 Women's World Championship, including **Hannah Brandt, Alex Carpenter, Kendall Coyne Schofield, Clair DeGeorge, Jincy Dunne, Becca Gilmore, Rory Guilday, Megan Keller, Amanda Kessel, Maureen Murphy, Kelly Pannek, Abby Roque, Lee Stecklein** and **Haley Winn**. Guilday and Winn were most recently on the U18 team in 2020.

MINNESOTA MADE

A total of seven players were raised in the state of Minnesota: **Hannah Brandt, Rory Guilday, Kelsey King, Kelly Pannek, Maddie Rooney, Gabby Rosenthal** and **Lee Stecklein**. Four attended the University of Minnesota, **Hannah Brandt, Amanda Kessel, Kelly Pannek** and **Lee Stecklein** and one attended the University of Minnesota, Duluth, **Maddie Rooney**.

FROM NEAR AND FAR

A total of 10 different states are represented on the Rivalry Series roster. Seven players hail from Minnesota, four are from New York and three are from Michigan. A pair of players on the team both come from Illinois and Massachusetts, while one player comes from each of the following states: Alaska, Colorado, Idaho, Missouri and Wisconsin.

AROUND USA HOCKEY

U.S. HOCKEY HALL OF FAME TO ENSHRINE CLASS OF 2022

Steve Cash, Jim Johansson, Jocelyn Lamoureux-Davidson, Monique Lamoureux-Morando and **Ryan Miller** are the five hockey legends that will enter the U.S. Hockey Hall of Fame as the Class of 2022. The 50th anniversary U.S. Hockey Hall of Fame Induction Celebration, which will include the formal enshrinement of the Class of 2022 and also include the presentation of the NHL's Lester Patrick Trophy, will be held November 30, 2022, at the RiverCentre in St. Paul, Minnesota.

USA HOCKEY TO HOST 2022 WOMEN'S LEADERSHIP SUMMIT

USA Hockey will host the 3rd annual **Game On: Leadership Summit** in conjunction with the United States v. Canada Rivalry Series game in Seattle. The Summit will take place the weekend of November 18-20, providing information and training to 40 volunteers that support girls/women's hockey. The summit helps empower attendees so they can connect their local community and enhance the diversity of our future leadership pool. The 2022 Summit will focus on leadership tools, including group dynamics, collaboration, communication, community building, and networking.

2023 UNDER-18 WOMEN'S NATIONAL TEAM

The 23-player 2023 U.S. Under-18 Women's National Team was named in November. The team, led by head coach **Katie Lachapelle** (Lewiston, Maine), will compete at the IIHF Under-18 Women's World Championship in Östersund, Sweden January 8-15, 2023. The team returns seven players - **Annelies Bergmann, Cassie Hall, Molly Jordan, Ava Lindsay, Finley McCarthy, Maggie Scannell** and **Josie St. Martin** - from the 2022 U18 Women's National Team.

2022 U.S. NATIONAL SLED HOCKEY TEAM

The 2022 U.S. National Sled Hockey team will be competing at the 2022 Para Hockey Cup in Bridgewater, Nova Scotia from Nov. 27 - Dec. 3. The United States is the six-time defending champion of the event and holds seven overall tournament titles, the best of any nation.

2023 U.S. NATIONAL JUNIOR TEAM

The 2023 IIHF World Junior Championship will be played Dec. 26 - Jan. 5, 2023 in Halifax and Moncton, Nova Scotia. Team USA will host a training camp in mid-December in Plymouth, Mich. to select the 23-player roster.

2022-23 U.S. WOMEN'S NATIONAL TEAM STAFF



JOHN WROBLEWSKI, HEAD COACH

John Wroblewski is serving as the head coach of the U.S. Women's National Team for the 2022-23 season following taking the helm at the 2022 IIHF Women's World Championship, where he led the U.S. to a silver medal.

Wroblewski joined the U.S. Women's National Team following two years (2020-22) as the head coach of the Ontario (Calif.) Reign, the AHL affiliate of the LA Kings, and four seasons (2016-20) as the bench boss of the USA Hockey National Team Development Program.

Over his four years with the NTDP, the program reached its first USHL playoff berth since 2012 and finished top-three in all 12 international tournaments played. He led his team to 33-consecutive international victories from 2016-18, and also oversaw the development of 29 NHL Draft picks, including Jack Hughes, who was selected first overall by the New Jersey Devils in 2019.

At the IIHF level, Wroblewski guided the U.S. Under-18 Men's National Team twice, resulting in a gold in 2017 and bronze in 2019.

The Neenah, Wisconsin, native began his coaching career as an intern assistant coach with the NTDP and was promoted to a full-time assistant coach the following season, a position he held from 2008-10.

Wroblewski, a player on the inaugural NTDP roster in 1997, skated four years with the University of Notre Dame (1999-2003). He went on to play four years (2003-07) professionally with the ECHL's Fresno Falcons, recording 125 points (65-60) in 273 career games.

JOSH SCIBA, ASSISTANT COACH

Josh Sciba is reprising his role on the U.S. Women's National Team staff during the 2022-23 season, after serving in the same capacity at the 2022 IIHF Women's World Championship.

As an assistant coach, Sciba helped lead the U.S. Under-18 Women's National Team to a gold medal at the 2022 IIHF Under-18 Women's World Championship, after serving in the same capacity for the 2019 U.S. Under-18 Women's National Team.

Sciba is currently the head coach of the Union College women's ice hockey team, a role he has served in for the past six seasons.

As a player, Sciba was a member of the USA Hockey National Team Development Program from 2001-03, prior to playing four years at the University of Notre Dame.

SHARI DICKERMAN, ASSISTANT COACH

Shari Dickerman is making her debut as an assistant coach for the U.S. Women's National Team at the 2022-23 Rivalry Series.

Dickerman, an assistant coach at Minnesota State University, previously served as assistant coach of the 2022 U.S. Collegiate Women's Select Team, that competed at the 2022 Collegiate Series against Canada in August.

Prior to her appointment to the USA Hockey staff, Dickerman served as an evaluator at numerous USA Hockey camps.

A member of the Mavericks staff since 2009, Dickerman has helped lead Minnesota State for the last 13 seasons.

As a player, Dickerman was an All-American goaltender for the Mavericks.

ALLI ALTMANN, GOALTENDING COACH

Alli Altmann returns as the goaltending coach of the U.S. Women's National Team after serving on the silver medal-winning staff of the 2021 and 2022 U.S. Women's National Team that both took silver at the Women's World Championship.

Altman also guided the U.S. Under-18 Women's National Team for four seasons, having served in the goaltending coach role from 2017-22. She guided the U.S. to two golds and two silvers during that time.

Altman is currently the co-owner and vice president of DEVENIR Goaltenders. She played four seasons for Minnesota State University, recording a career .901 save percentage.
