### **Kansas Fast Track guidelines**

The following will be used for those Kansas referees who are looking to reach the highest levels of refereeing. The guidelines and expectations are for those wanting to join the program and for those currently participating. Anyone not fulfilling these expectations will not be considered for the program or could be removed if a current member.

#### **Game count**

Each year a member or candidate must work at least 4 Adult amateur games, 1 of which must be a Division 1 game. The 4 must include at least 2 Centers and 2 AR assignments. Each year a member or candidate must work at least 10 Youth games, 4 of which must be U16 or above. This number must include 2 State Cup games. Of the 4 U16 games, must include at least 2 Centers and 2 AR assignments.

#### **Assessments**

Each member or candidate must complete at least 2 Developmental assessments a season, one of which must be completed by a State Assessor, if it is for a current State Referee, both must be completed by a State Assessor. These assessments must be put into the KS Game officials' system. The minimum score for an assessment to count will be 70.

#### **Fitness and testing**

Each member or candidate must complete and pass the current Regional Referee fitness test and the State written test.

#### **Mentoring**

Each member or candidate must be actively involved in a mentoring program at one of their local leagues.

#### **Misc.**

Each member or candidate must keep an up to date game portfolio which can be found on the Kansas referee website. Each member or candidate must be available for the Spring State Cup tournament and for travel opportunities in the summer, as well as certain game assignments requested by the program administrator. Each member or candidate must be in good standing with the State referee committee and the local leagues
