7:02 PM: Call to order - Welcome/Introductions: Ken

- Introduced Special Guest: Jesse Snyder, District AD
 - Jesse introduced himself and answered questions from the group about current events, WIAA Fall & Spring grade eligibility, role of AD
- Introduced 2025 Board Members, Team/Class/Club Parents, New Members, Staff

- Ken had a meeting with Todd about installing the shed on The Joe. Believes proposed plans will be approved and can be constructed soon for use this season.
- Explained how the shed was funded by 2025 Auction Raise-the-Paddle
- Passed around a Fundraising Flyer and briefly discussed different fundraising options for groups to use

7:35 PM: Treasurer's Report: Lee

- Distributed and explained the two-page Treasurer's Report (Monthly Ending Balance and current date Summary of Accounts)
- Discussed overview of Treasurer's responsibilities and how anyone can request to view any group's Monthly Report

7:38 PM: Fundraising Report: Hoyt

- Husky Concessions – Kim Strege is looking for volunteers for the 10/10 game
 - Hoyt and Lee explained how the Husky Concessions fundraising program works
 - Aramark does take 5-6 weeks to make the actual payout
- 2026 Auction
 - Apr 25th at RTC
 - Groups can begin procuring now, but need to consult Hoyt about the DIBS list
- Snap! Raise – an easy-to-use fundraising platform for groups to ask donor base for donations
 - Consult with Hoyt about limitations on student/coach involvement
 - Snap! Raise takes a 20% cut
- Spirit wear – sell gear at Hazen football games
 - Does not necessarily generate a lot of revenue
 - Need volunteers to work the football games in order to sell your team's items
 - It currently takes two trucks to load and transport all the merchandise. Ken is one of the trucks and will be gone next year. Will require a new truck or team merchandise will unlikely be sold. Boosters transports its own items first over team items.
- Brown Bear car wash tickets can be sold for specific teams, not school-wide
- Poinsettia fundraiser will go live on 9/18 (online and paper orders available). Remlinger Farm pies is an addition to the sale offering. Ordering closes on 11/1
- SportsEngine payment form requests will now be set up by Hoyt, and not Trina. Note, Hoyt can only devote minimal time to setting up simple payment requests.
- Looking for more fundraising ideas? Ask Hoyt if he has any options that no group has claimed
 - Hoyt recently had an opportunity from a storage company who requested help washing the garage doors. No teams wanted this opportunity, so SGE26 took it. It was approximately 12 hours of work across three locations (adult supervision and student



workers earned volunteer hours) and earned \$3K.

- PSAT is coming up quickly in early October for sophomores and juniors

- Parking situation will not improve. Admin will review the parking space allocation that allowed students who do not yet have their driver’s license to purchase a parking space.
