The SKATE VEGAS Championship will be conducted in accordance with the rules and regulations of U.S. Figure Skating, as set forth in the current rulebook, as well as any pertinent updates which have been posted on the U.S. Figure Skating website. This competition is also sanctioned by Skate Canada. Rules may be adjusted for Skate Canada participants to accommodate the current Skate Canada rulebook (i.e. for program length).

This competition is open to all eligible, restricted, reinstated or re-admitted persons as defined by the Eligibility Rules, and is a currently registered member of a U.S. Figure Skating member club, a collegiate club or an individual member in accordance with the current rulebook. Competitors may also be currently registered members of Skate Canada. If skater is not a member of either U.S. Figure Skating or Skate Canada, please refer to the U.S. Figure Skating rule book regarding entry rules.

SERIES INFORMATION: The Skate Vegas 2019 competition is not part of 2019 Excel Series, however, we will be offering the Excel events.

Canadian skaters entering the Excel skating events must complete all required elements in the level entered. Canadian skaters will not be penalized for length of program or receive a time deduction

ELIGIBILITY/TEST LEVEL: Competition level is the highest test passed as of the entry deadline, in the discipline the skater is entering. Entrants may skate one level above that for which they qualify, but they may not skate down in any event.

Age restrictions/requirements: Singles free skate events (Well Balanced Program) have the following requirements.

- Juvenile: Girls – 12 years of age or younger; Boys – 13 years of age or younger
- Open Juvenile: Girls – 13 years of age or older; Boys – 14 years of age or older
- Intermediate must be under the age of 18
- Adults must be 21 years of age or older

Skaters entering pre-juvenile and lower events will be divided as closely as possible by age, should the number of entries warrant more than one group.

ENTRIES: Online registration using the U.S. Figure Skating Event Management System (EMS) via www.usfsaonline.org is the ONLY method available to enter the competition. The registration deadline is April 27, 2019.

CANADIAN AND FOREIGN SKATERS: Canadian and foreign skaters intending to register for this competition must set-up a non-member to access U.S. Figure Skating's registration site. If you have questions or need assistance with the online registration process, email EMSsupport@usfigureskating.org.

REFUND POLICY: Entry fees will not be refunded after entry deadline unless no competition exists or the event is canceled. There will be no refunds for medical withdrawals. Any refunds are subject to LOC and a \$25 fee may be applied. The online processing fees are not refundable. Checks returned for non-sufficient funds and contested credit card charges will be issued a \$ 25.00 fee. Payment of the fee will be required before the skater is allowed to participate in practice ice or events.

SCHEDULE: Competitors may be scheduled on any day or time for the announced dates of the competition. Notification of competition and practice ice times will be available by phone or email.

FACILITIES: The competition will be held at the City National Arena, 1550 Pavilion Center Dr. Las Vegas, NV 89135. It is located in Summerlin which is west of the Las Vegas Strip. The Rinks are 200'x85'. There is a snack bar located in the lobby and the Mackenzie River Pizza Restaurant Bar & Grill is on the second floor, which overlooks the double rink facility. <https://www.citynationalarenavegas.com/>

LIGHTING/CURTAIN:

All Showcase programs will be performed under full arena lighting. A curtain will be used during showcase events. The curtain will be placed in such a manner that it will take up approximately ¼ of the ice surface. Showcase participants will need to adjust their programs accordingly.

MUSIC: The **EMS Skater Portal** is the ONLY acceptable method to submit program music. If your music is not available at the time of registration, you can logout of your account and return to the EMS Skater Portal later to upload your music at a later date but music MUST be submitted no later than May 1, 2019. Please be sure you are uploading the correct music for the correct event segment.

The uploaded program music MUST conform to the following specifications:

- Programs per file: One [1] - Only one piece of competition program music (e.g. Free Skate) per file is allowed.
- File Format: mp3 - The uploaded file music must be an mp3 file (MPEG-1 or MPEG-2 Audio Layer III). Simply changing the file extension to "mp3" from another file format is not acceptable.
- Bit Rate: 192 kbps is requested (bit rates between 128 and 320 kbps will be accepted).
- Maximum file size: 10 MB
- Maximum run time: Five [5 minutes]
- ID3 Metadata [tags]: None - The Chief Music Coordinator strongly recommends that mp3 files DO NOT contain any ID3 metadata, commonly called tags. This is especially true of any embedded images such as album cover art, picture of the skater, etc. Please, NO EMBEDDED IMAGES!
- Maximum leader: Two [2] seconds] - The leader is the silence between the start of the track and the actual start of the program music. The Chief Music Coordinator recommends that there be NO leader.
- Maximum trailer: Two [2] seconds] - The trailer is the silence between the end of the

program music and the end of the actual track. The Chief Music Coordinator recommends that there be NO trailer.

Backup Music at Event (CDs): In addition to submitting the music online, all competitors/teams must also have at least one [1] backup copy of their competition music on CD, AT RINKSIDE, during the actual competition event or official practice. CDs must meet the following requirements:

- In standard Audio CD format (Compact Disc Digital Audio). Other formats, including mp3 are NOT acceptable.
- Lead in time (time before the music begins) on CDs may not exceed two [2] seconds.
- Due to the compatibility and reliability reasons, music may NOT be submitted on re-recordable "CD-RW" discs.

PLEASE, no CD-RWs! The LOC, competition officials, and volunteers exercise reasonable care when handling CDs. However, they are not responsible for damage to or loss of any CDs. The LOC is not responsible for CDs not picked up by the end of the competition. Those CDs will be destroyed.

LIABILITY: U.S. Figure Skating, Vegas Golden Knights Center of Excellence, the Vegas Golden Knights Organization, and the City National Arena accepts no responsibility for injury or damage sustained by any participant in this competition. This is in accordance with Rule 1600 of the official U.S. Figure Skating Rulebook.

JUDGING SYSTEM: The International Judging System (IJS) will be used for the following events: All Well Balanced Events : No Test through Senior, and Excel Events Pre-Preliminary -Senior, Adult Silver, Gold, Adult Masters Intermediate-Novice, Masters Junior-Senior. For Solo Dance events a modified IJS System will be used.

All competitors skating in these events must submit a planned program content form (PPC) online via the EMS Skater Portal. **The Planned Program Content form must be completed before Midnight on May 1, 2019.**

The 6.0 Judging System will be used for: Compete USA, Snowplow Sam, Basic Skills 1-6, Pre Free Skate, Free Skate 1-6, Excel Beginner and High Beginner, Adult Pre-Bronze, Adult Bronze , and all Interpretive and Showcase events.

REGISTRATION: Registration will begin on February 1, 2019 at 12:00 a.m and end at 11:30 pm on April 5, 2019 Registration will be open one to two hours before the first event and run through the last event of the day. The registration table will be located in the lobby of the rink. Please register promptly upon arrival.

PRACTICE ICE: Depending on the number of applicants, practice ice for the competition may be offered through the competition committee. If offered, final details for scheduling practice ice will be made available to competitors through the EMS Portal on or near April 10, 2019.

PHOTOGRAPHY/VIDEOGRAPHY: Cynthia Slaughter Photography and Coronado Videography will be available for purchase at the rink during the competition. All other videotaping and photography is restricted to hand held battery operated equipment, without monopod or tripod. No photography or videotaping, except by the official photographer, without the express permission of the person being photographed or videotaped is allowed. Photography

or videotaping for any commercial purpose is strictly prohibited. Flash photography is prohibited at all times during the competition.

AWARDS: Medals will be awarded to first through fourth place winners for all events.

OFFICIAL NOTICES: An official bulletin board will be maintained in the rink lobby. It is the responsibility of each competitor, parent and coach to check the bulletin board frequently for any schedule changes and/or additional information. Skaters are requested to arrive 45 minutes prior to the scheduled time of their event. A tentative schedule of events will be posted prior to the competition.

TEST CREDIT: Skaters that meet the requirements for test credit may request their test credit forms at registration. Forms must be picked up at the registration desk prior to the end of the competition.

IMPORTANT NOTICE FOR ALL COACHES:

To be a credentialed coach at a sanctioned non-qualifying competition, coaches must meet the following requirements:

Coaching U.S. Figure Skating athletes:

- Current member in good standing with U.S. Figure Skating
- Completed background check (green light status)
- Completed SafeSport Training*
- Continuing Education Requirements (CERs) for the 2018-19 Competition Season
- Proof of current general liability insurance with limits of \$1 million per occurrence/\$5 million aggregate.

Coaching Compete USA athletes:

- Learn to Skate USA Instructor membership OR U.S. Figure Skating full membership
- Completed SafeSport Training* (for coaches 18 years old and over)
- Completed background check (green light status) (for coaches 18 years old and over)
- Learn to Skate USA Instructor Certification completed (for coaches under 18 years old)

*SafeSport training is available through www.usfsaonline.org for full members of U.S. Figure Skating (through Learn to Skate USA portal for instructors). There is no cost to this training and certification is valid for 2 seasons

The LOC will have a list of compliant coaches who are approved to receive a credential at the competition. Coaches will need to check in at the event registration desk and show a government issued photo I.D. to receive a credential.

If a coach cannot provide a photo I.D. and is not on the list or cannot produce the necessary documents, he or she will not be allowed a credential. There can be no exceptions to this policy.

If a foreign coach has only foreign athletes at your competition, a background check and SafeSport Training is not required. Instead, the coach must submit a letter from their Federation stating they are a member in good standing.

Showcase Interpretative Freeskate 1 - Senior, Teen, Young Adult, All Adult Levels

Music will be selected prior to event by LOC. Skaters will have opportunity to listen to music for 20 minutes in a locker room . The skaters will then be able to run through program on the ice twice before performing for the judges. Music lengths for the interpretive event are as follows:
Pre-Freeskate - Preliminary: 1 min, Beginner, High Beginner, Teen: 1 min, Young Adult, All Adult: 1 min, Pre-Juvenile - Senior: 1:30 min.

Team Skills Challenge- A fun club team event.

For Skaters from No Test through Senior. Teams consist of 4 skaters, male or female. The team will perform as a group and perform unifying steps prior to spotlighting each member performing an element. All teams for each level will be on the ice together. One member of each team will be

required to do one of the four elements (all elements must be completed). Choose one element for each skater. The Elements are: 2 jumps and 2 spins chosen from the highest allowed level in that group. Elements will be judged against the other teams' elements. Each skater will be awarded one mark for technique. The team performance shall not exceed 2 minutes. May be skated to music or performed with no music.

Events:

- **No Test Team** - For Basic Skills, PreFS, FS-1-6 and No Test Skaters. (elements only from these levels)
- **Preliminary Team**-Pre-Preliminary -Pre Juvenile level Skaters (elements only from these levels)
- **Intermediate Team** - Juvenile-Novice level Skaters (elements only from these levels)
- **Senior Team** -Junior-Senior level Skaters (elements only from these levels)

Therapeutic Skating (Therapeutic Level 1-4)

Therapeutic skating is open to skaters with a disability. Therapeutic Level is done off ice in skates. Levels 2-14 will take place on the ice. Programs can be done with or without music. If music is used it cannot exceed 1:10.
