BREAKING BARRIERS AWARD: CHRISTINA FIEBICH

Fiebich honored on National Girls & Women in Sports Day in Minnesota

Christina Fiebich has made a name for herself not only in North Country Region and across the United States as a USA Volleyball National Official and NCAA Division 1 Official, but also internationally as an International World ParaVolley (WPV) Official. This past summer, Christina became the first female referee from the United States to officiate Sitting Volleyball at the Paralympics in Tokyo. Then, this past weekend, Christina spent her days working with our junior officials at the NCR Region Road Trip to Coon Rapids and investing in the Region's new J.O.T. program. What a privilege to have an official of Christina's caliber right here in North Country Region, giving back to our members!

"While her officiating has taken her from coast-to-coast nationally and around the world internationally, Fiebich credits her success to the mentor referees and coaches in Minnesota who helped her get started as a new official. Every weekend in the fall and many weekends throughout the year, she is on the court officiating the best teams in the NCAA and around the world. She wants to make sure young officials have those same opportunities."

IMPORTANCE OF KEEPING THE EVENT MOVING

Officials are known as arbiters of the sport. In fact, our international referees were called FIVB Arbiters for many years. We are a key component in ensuring teams are able to contest the match fairly. But we are also a key component in ensuring an excellent experience for participants and spectators. Our guidelines talk about how important an official is in the enjoyment of the sport. That role extends to the tournament as well. One of the benefits to having professional officials at your tournament is having the matches run on time and scores reported timely. Teams don't have to wait for the working team to finish their post-game debrief before warming up for their next match. Parents aren't (always) plagued with the extremely late nights at the gym because none of the matches started on time. Players aren't standing around while non-certified coaches/players acting as officials try to make a determination on a confusing rule, only to have to call the site director to come over.

For those of you that work big tournaments, we all know officials who you hate to follow, because you know their court will be behind. They start warm-ups late, they are slow when finishing the match to thank the work team and sign the scoresheet. They want to chat with the oncoming coaches, or maybe take a break, starting the subsequent match late, too. And during the match, they speak to the Captains multiple times, they pull in their R2 or line judges for conferences multiple times, they are startled by balls that bounce toward, but NOT on the court, calling replays, and have a generally slow pace. And we know the officials who are known to be efficient. This doesn't mean they rush the match, or make the experience uncomfortable for the players because of their haste. It means the official completes the match, thanks the team and checks and signs the scoresheet immediately. They are calling the captains and starting the warm-up protocol before turning to their many other duties. During the match they keep a nice steady pace, and don't allow time-outs and time between matches to linger. They have a routine for speaking to the work team that is efficient, allowing them time to get a drink, a snack, or take care of themselves in the 10 minutes between matches.

Make sure you have a reputation for being efficient. Tournament directors should be excited to see you, because they know you will keep their tournament running, the players moving, and most importantly, create an environment where the focus is on playing volleyball, and not on administrative necessities or your own desire to be involved in the match.

DID YOU KNOW?


This scenario was submitted this month by an NCR Club Director.


