Executive Director's Report

“Shout out” to all the amazing volunteers of our Association that are going above and beyond, to not only offer extra-curricular opportunities to student-athletes, but to do so as safely as possible. The road has not been easy, yet there have been many positive experiences provided with the return to high school sport. Because of your efforts, SHSAA was able to successfully offer full seasons, culminating in playoffs, in all five fall activities (golf, cross-country, soccer, football, and volleyball). Our championships are a showcase of the outstanding work that is done every day throughout the season by our coaches in helping student-athletes fulfil their potential:

- Provincial golf was the first SHSAA championship held in over 18 months. High school golfers were treated to warm weather and ideal conditions during the provincial golf championships hosted by Rosthern Community School at Valley Regional Park Golf Course. The many volunteer facilitators were impressed by the ability and sportsmanship of the competitors.
- Cross Country was held in the picturesque Carlton Ski Trails in Dixon Hills near Humboldt. Horizon Central District did an outstanding job of hosting the championship with their full complement of volunteers. Many of our student-athletes enjoyed genuine cross-country terrain while striving to achieve personal bests. The outstanding work of our volunteer coaches must be acknowledged.
- The end of October brought colder weather for the provincial soccer championships. The efforts of those individuals (referees and host volunteers) working outside in the elements ensured that the student-athletes and coaches were provided a celebration of school sport. SaskTel Max was on hand at the 5A Soccer championships to provide coverage of the medal games.
- The crowds at the football provincial championship games are a testament that Saskatchewan is certainly the heartbeat of football in Canada and so much of that can be attributed to the grassroots work done in our high schools. Community spirit shone through the snowfalls during the championships as field preparation was a major undertaking. Again, SaskTel Max was on-site providing coverage for the 5A and 6A 12-aside finals.
- The board of directors and office staff that attended the 10 provincial volleyball championships came back with stories of remarkable parity, tremendous competition, and outstanding work by the host sites. Many of the volleyball host sites arranged for quality live streaming of the championships allowing those at other championships an opportunity to share in the excitement across the classifications. Once again, SaskTel Max provided coverage of the 5A medal games. Hosting these championships are a major undertaking and we thank our host sites, secondary sites, and officials.

Needless-to-say, there is an over-whelming feeling of appreciation that high school sport is once again thriving!

SHSAA fall playoffs coincided with the start of the 100th National Poppy Campaign. The Royal Canadian Legion, Saskatchewan Command provided upwards of 6,000 poppy stickers to student-athletes participating at the SHSAA playoffs leading up to November 11. Legion members were given free admission to the SHSAA events. Thank you to Executive Director of the Saskatchewan Command, Chad Wagner, and the various branches around the province for their recognition of Saskatchewan student-athletes through this partnership.

“SHSAA stands in solidarity with truth and reconciliation and affirms the calls to action.” The Association declared this on The National Day of Truth and Reconciliation and behooves this to be recognized by schools on September 30th and every other day during the year through their participation in SHSAA sanctioned events. The Board of Directors continues to engage in leading the Association toward equity, diversity, and inclusion and is currently working with a consultant from the Multicultural Council of Saskatchewan (MCoS) to look inward to make positive adjustments for the future.

School Sport Week in October allowed members of SHSAA to acknowledge the impact of school sport in Saskatchewan. Over 30,000 student participations occur annually in school sport in Saskatchewan and it is good to have this week of celebration recognized and proclaimed by the Provincial Government.

There are many individuals that provide service to SHSAA as officials. Our officials allow our students a chance to participate within the rules and allow our coaches the opportunity to educate our students. It is imperative that we continue to teach about the importance of officials and discourage behaviours of those athletes, coaches, and supporters that are negative or abusive towards officials. We look forward to outstanding displays of athleticism and sportsmanship during the winter and spring activities and thank our officials for their dedication to high school sport.

As we look ahead to the winter and spring activities of SHSAA, we say thank you to our hosts-to-be (Wrestling – Saskatoon; Curling (**presented by Sask Milk**) – Swift Current (Boys and Open Mixed) and Fox Valley (Girls); HOOPLA 2022 – Regina; Badminton – Rosthern; Track & Field – Regina). Many of these hosts have been planning and patiently waiting to be able to host these events which have been previously postponed due to the pandemic. We are hopeful that they will come to fruition in 2022; as always, your office staff and Board of Directors will be following Government of Saskatchewan Public Health Orders and making decisions on behalf of the Association to ensure that the activities are organized safely. The concluding activity in the calendar will be the SHSAA AGM in Saskatoon from June 22-24, 2022. The host committee from SSSAD and the SHSAA Board of Directors are busily preparing for the meetings and activities associated with the event. More information will be made available to each district in April.

I would like to take this opportunity to commend your President, Al Wandler, and the SHSAA Board of Directors for their thoughtful and dedicated service to the Association. The Board held their first meeting in August and has met, either in-person or virtually, every month since to make numerous decisions this fall calling for additional volunteer time on their part. Many Board Members are coaches and officials and are highly involved in their District organization. This, in addition to navigating high school sport during a pandemic, has kept them very busy throughout the fall. Their efforts truly are a labour of love.

The SHSAA office staff wishes each of you a good start to the New Year! The next six months are bound to be filled with challenges; as educators, we will work together to offer exciting opportunities through educational athletics while being flexible and nimble as we continue to navigate high school sport during a pandemic. We will do this because of the many positive characteristics school sport develops in our youth and because of the strong relationships that are created when students and teachers engage in extra-curricular activities together.

Board of Directors and District Presidents' Meetings

The annual gathering of District Presidents and Athletic Commissioners occurred at the beginning of December. At this meeting, they discussed a number of topics regarding business arising from the Board of Directors Meetings. Included in the group discussions were topics such as:

At the December District Officials' Commissioners meeting it was determined that a shared virtual clinic option should be explored. Districts could work together to determine dates appropriate for virtual clinics and allow officials from various corners of the province to attend. Another major focus will be the development of a high school level soccer official's clinic. This would be a virtual option to assist with the training and retention of soccer officials wanting to officiate SHSAA level competition.

Sport Advisory Groups

Earlier in the fall, the Board of Directors finalized their committee members for the [2021-22 Sport Advisory Groups](#). Board members will report at each Board meeting on the work being done by the Sport Advisory Group that they chair. The Sport Advisory Groups are yet another lens for the Association activities to be studied. Discussion amongst the groups will provide insight for the Board of Directors to consider in their planning for SHSAA. Youth Officials Conference

The SHSAA will be hosting the 3rd Youth Officials Conference **virtually** in 2022. The date of the conference will be announced in the new year. The Conference will provide an opportunity to high school students (targeting grades 9-12) to explore their interests in officiating and to develop officiating skills. It will be a multi-sport conference that will offer philosophy and technical sessions relating to the SHSAA sanctioned sports. This year's YOC will focus on Volleyball, Basketball, and Soccer.

Coaches Symposium

The SHSAA **will not** be hosting a Coaches Symposium in 2022. The 14 districts across the province will be planning coaching development opportunities that will be shared in the New Year. Stay tuned for more information regarding dates, times, and locations!

502C: Athletic Administration in Canadian Schools

- January 27th, 2022
- 4:00 – 7:00pm Mountain

This crucial introductory course addresses many of the day-to-day operational responsibilities for Canadian Athletic Directors. The course addresses school athletic/academic philosophy, administrative organization, coach appointment, budgeting, scheduling, publicity and promotion, management of athletes, parents and others, transportation policies and issues, parent conflict, legal foundations, monthly checklists and more. One of the key resources available to course attendees is a resource package with over 700 pages of useful information, forms, detailed letter templates, sample policies, and more.

608C: Management Strategies & Organization Techniques

- 5:00 – 8:00pm Mountain

This course is designed to inform athletic administrators how to more effectively organize and manage their time, apply time management principles, be more productive and have balance to life. Instruction will focus on 12 key components and strategies, including proven techniques and tips to teach participants how to: Set Goals and Priorities, Plan for Results, Organize for Success, Process Paperwork, Delegate Effectively, Eliminate Time Wasters, Enhance Decision-Making, Make Meetings Productive, Conquer Procrastination, Utilize Technology, Communicate Effectively and Reduce Stress.

700C: Administration in Middle School Athletic Programs (Grades 6-9)

- January 28, 2022
- 12:30 – 3:30pm Mountain

This course provides insights and strategies for the leadership of developmentally sound, education-focused Junior High school athletic programs. The concept of educational athletics is defined and developed. Philosophy is discussed along with the relationship it has to the psychological and physical development of the student. This course also concentrates on the role of the school coach and coaching principles. Junior High school athletics is an essential part of the total educational process and an excellent opportunity for the home, school and community to work together in order to provide a positive educational experience for children.

714C: Preventing, Managing & Transforming Challenging Behaviour

- January 25th, 2022
- 4:30 – 7:30pm Mountain

This course examines the causes of challenging or difficult personalities in society, with specific reference to interscholastic athletic programs. Basic management strategies include the use of emotional intelligence and transactional analysis considerations and methods. Specific protocols will be defined for dealing with individuals who “must be right,” “must win,” “must be logical” and “must be accepted.” In addition, techniques will be covered for preventing or responding to anger, sarcasm, denigration, complainers and backbiters and rigid-obstinate personalities. A model will also be discussed for creative interaction with parents who demand involvement in athletic department decision-making or who seek to influence the decisions of senior administrators.

CARD EXPIRY

The Coaches' Card is valid for a period of TWO years. The 2019-2021 version (Yellow Card) expired, as of August 31, 2021 and will not be accepted by the card sponsors. 2022 REGIONAL & PROVINCIAL CURLING

PRESENTED BY: 

Each provincial championship will consist of eight teams scheduled as two pools of four teams in round-robin play format. The top two teams from each pool shall advance to the championship bracket. The eight teams participating at the provincial championships will include the host school and seven other teams that have qualified through the regional championships.

The tie-breaking criteria to determine placement in pool play and placement into tie-breaker games shall utilize the Skill Based Team Ranking System (SBTRS). For more information on the tiebreaker and the Saturday schedule of games please refer to the curling activity page of the [SHSAA website](#).

Regional championships will be held March 4 - 5, 2022. The Regional championships will consist of a six or eight team double knock-out format leading to an 'A' event and 'B' event qualifier to the provincial championship. The only region that may require an A-B playoff to complete the double knock-out competition is the provincial host region. The A-B playoff will only be contested if the provincial host has not won either the 'A' or 'B' event. In the regions without an A-B playoff the 'A' event winner will be considered the Regional champion.

Districts should declare their representatives to the Regional Championships by Saturday, February 26, 2022 and contact the regional commissioners and SHSAA office following the competition.

Regional commissioners are asked to contact both the SHSAA office and provincial commissioner by Saturday, March 5, 2022 with the names of the schools and team members which have advanced to the provincial championship.

DATE: Saturday, March 5, 2022

ENTRY:

1. All wrestlers from registered schools outside Regina and Saskatoon **MUST** attend this meet in order to qualify for the Provincial Tournament.
2. Registered schools may enter more than one wrestler per division.
3. Every participating school **MUST** contact the commissioner and SHSAA Office, with their intent to enter, and indicate the number of competitors by the Monday preceding the regional tournament. Competitors who have not been pre-registered by their coaches will not be allowed to participate in the tournament.
4. The Saskatchewan District team that advances to the Provincial Tournament will consist of up to four qualifiers from this meet per weight division.
5. The coaches present will select the "District" coaching staff (Head and Assistant Coach).
6. The District Coaches, in consultation with the commissioner, will select the final district team.

WEIGH-IN:

A weigh-in will not be held at the Regional tournament. **Each wrestler must weigh in at their home school. A school administrator or their designate must certify the weight. Certified weights must be submitted to the host commissioner and SHSAA office by 12:00 p.m. (noon) on the Thursday preceding the meet (March 3, 2022).** Note this procedure is used for the regional meet only.

SKIN INSPECTIONS:

Skin inspections will begin at 9:00 am. All participants must pass the on-site skin inspection before wrestling.

START TIME:

The tournament begins at 10:00 am. Three wrestling mats are available for matches.

RULES FOR HIGH SCHOOL WRESTLING:

SCHOOL TEAM COMPETITION:

There are six school awards: 3A, 4A, and 5A Girls; 3A, 4A, and 5A Boys

- The SHSAA office will seed each conference tournament.
- Draws for the conference tournaments will be available on the SHSAA website on March 7, 2022.
- Each coach is to fill out and submit a [seeding form](#) (E-16) including their opinion on the seeding of their conference and the province. Seeding forms are due on or before March 2, 2022. Any additional results following the March 2nd deadline can be submitted to the SHSAA Office.
- Districts are to notify the SHSAA office of host sites for the conference tournaments they have been assigned. Please check the website periodically to see updates to conferences, including host sites.

Conference Tournaments:

- All conference tournaments will be played the weekend of March 11 – 12, 2022 and will advance two teams to regional weekend except where indicated on the document listing the conference groupings.
- As per the resolution passed at the 2008 AGM there will not be a consolation side included in the tournaments. In conferences of four, five, six, seven, or eight teams that are designated to advance more than two teams there will be a qualifier bracket to advance the extra teams to regional play.

- **5A classification:** There will be an eight-team tournament composed of three teams from Saskatoon District, three teams from Regina District, and two teams from the Rural regional tournament in 2022. The tournament will have a championship and consolation side.
