

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## US House maintain **afterschool** funding levels

The US House Appropriations Committee voted to approve the Labor, Health and Human Services, Education (LHHS) Appropriations Act FY2019 spending bill by a party line vote after a number of passionate debates were held related to the status and treatment of migrant children and families, women's reproductive health and family planning options, and the distribution of federal funds related to faith-based organizations. The panel adopted 18 amendments, with 14 coming from Democrats and another four offered by Republicans.

The bill maintains the full current \$1.212 billion funding level for 21st Century Community Learning Center (21st CCLC) **afterschool** and summer learning programs. As
