Ride will explore Weiser River Trail

The 4th Annual Weiser River Trail Bike Ride is June 5. There will be two distances on the northern section of the trail along the headwaters of the Weiser River.

The longer ride will be 28 miles from the north end of the trail, about 2 miles west of New Meadows to Council. The shorter ride, which is 20 miles, will be from Evergreen Campground along the Weiser River to Council.

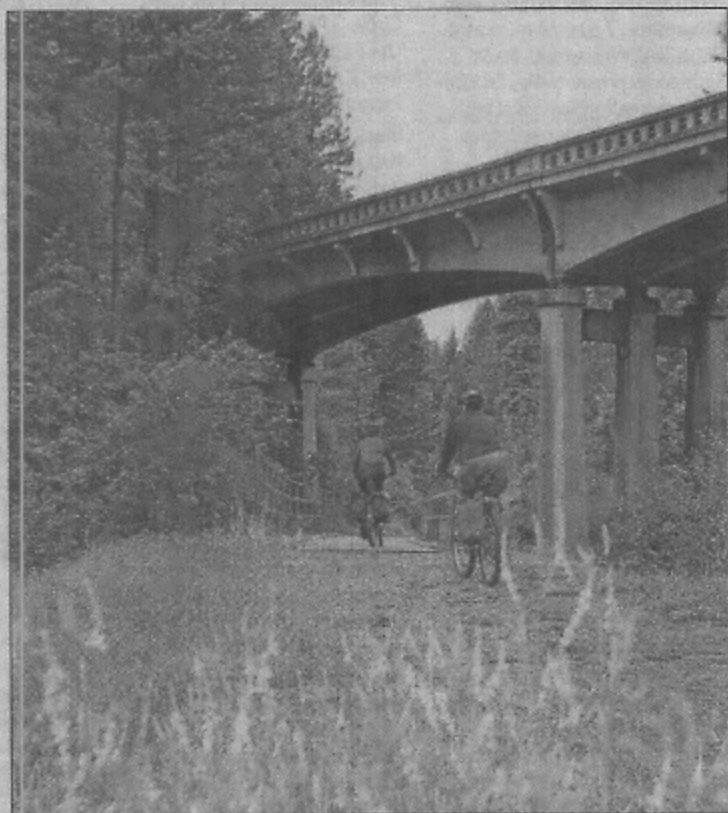
The trail is not paved, so mountain bikes or bikes with hybrid tires are recommended.

Riders will get a souvenir T-shirt and be shuttled to the respective starting points. All riders must wear a helmet.

Registration is being taken at www.bluecirclesports.com. Cost is \$30 for members of the Friends of the Weiser River Trail and \$35 for non-members through May 15. After May 15, the cost is \$40 for members and \$45 for non-members.

Lunch is provided in the registration fee and will be at the trailhead just upstream of Starkey Hot Springs.

Proceeds support work on the trail by the Friends of the Weiser River Trail.

Weather's bad? Try Sheep Creek.

Winter storm warnings. High-wind advisories. Rain. Snow. What the heck is going on?

Welcome to spring in Idaho. It hasn't been a very good week for fishing because of the weather. The nasty stuff has put down everything from salmon fishing on the lower Clearwater to crappie fishing on Brownlee and C.J. Strike reservoirs.

Not many anglers are fishing Cascade Reservoir, even though it's the season for big trout cruising the shoreline.

Brownlee, C.J. Strike and Cascade reservoirs are usually hot this time of the year and they might be good bets for the weekend if the weather cooperates.

One place where the weather hasn't affected fishing is Sheep Creek Reservoir on the Duck Valley Reservation on the Idaho-Nevada border.

Carol Perugini, director of the reservation's fish and wildlife department, is surprised because they have been getting a lot of good reports lately.

said Wednesday, "He was using green or black leeches (fly patterns).

"The weather hasn't been cooperating. It has been terribly windy," she said.

But for some reason, fly anglers are still doing well, she said.

Maybe it's because the reservoir was stocked with 8,000 catchable-size (8-10 inch) trout this spring and there have been a lot of carry-over fish.

"There are a lot of fish in there," said Perugini, who has had reports of some rainbows going 18 inches.
